In some quarters this rule is not being adhered to, and is consequently causing Mr. Champ considerable extra work. Please rectify.

F.I.D.E. DECIDES.

The result of the London Boys' Open Championship which depended on a F.I.D.E. decision as to what should be the ruling when on the time control move mate has been administered but a player has not stopped his clock and his flag falls has been given as "Won for the player who has mated the opponent's King. Whether one or the other clock is going after mate has been given is of no importance." Thus D.E. Rumens shares the title with D.E. Sherman.

No.6 of Chess Fare the Under-18 Inter Counties Chess Championship Final was reported when the final result depended on the five unfinished games that were sent up for adjudication. They were all given as drawn. The result of this decision was that Warwickshire & Middlesex decided to appeal against the adjudicator's decision and three boards, two between Warwickshire and Middlesex, and one between Middlesex and Devon were sent up for appeal. The result of these boards is now to hand and the final appeal result is that the original adjudicator's decision is upheld - all the five games are drawn. This gives the following final result:

1- Middlesex & Warwickshire 8½. 3. Yorkshire 6. 4- Devon & Glamorgan 5½.

Middlesex thus become the Junior Under-18 County Champions for the 1958/59 Season as the board count operates in their favour over Warwickshire.

HERTFORDSHIRE: On April 13-15 at Gascoyne Cecil School, Hatfield, The Hertford Junior Organiser arranged a PRIMARY SCHOOLS CONGRESS. Some 57 boys and girls under 12 took part from the following schools: Howlands, Welwyn Garden City; Little Heath School; Gascoyne Cecil School; Newtown School, Hatfield; St. John's, Lemsford; Spencer School, St. Albans; and Templewood, Welwyn Garden City. An 8 Round Swiss resulted in a tie for first place between P. Blenkinsop & T. Everett of Gascoyne Cecil School, Hatfield with R. Chalkley & D. Smith both in 3rd place, one point behind the leaders. The 'best girl' prize was won by L. Smith of Gascoyne Cecil with a score of 5½ points. A feature of this Tournament was a 'Chess Quiz' in which 5 pupils of Gascoyne Cecil School took part. This was won by M. Blenkinsop - one of the two competitors who tied for first place in the Swiss.

The 7th Annual Hertfordshire Chess Association Boys' Easter congress was held as usual. This year the venue was Hatfield Technical College. 122 competitors representing 16 schools took part. A triple tie ensued between D.E. Guy, A.P. Logsdon, & N.J.E. Reynolds (all of Queen Elizabeth's School, Barnet) with 5½ points out of 7 in the R. Lee-Johnson Cup Championship Contest. This will be resolved later on in the season. Securing 5 points out of 7 in this competition were L. Davidoff (Gresham Gr. Sch.) and R.J. Taylor of Rickmansworth Gr. School. 29 Competitors took part. In the H. Guy Arnold Cup competition for the Under-15 Boys' Championship D.J. Radley emerged the winner with 8½ points out of 9. He is a pupil of Beaumont School, St. Albans. No less than 46 boys competed for the Junior Title.

For the Under-14 competitors a Novices Tournament was held. The games in this tournament were interspersed with chess lessons, coaching and demonstrations. 47 competitors of this age group took part and the winner was E.A. Williams, of Alleyne's School, Stevenage with 8½ points out of 10. The Inter-Schools Challenge Trophy (awarded to the best aggregate for 6 players) was obtained by Queen Elizabeth's School, Barnet with 31 points. This school's team was composed of D.E. Guy, A.P. Logsdon, N.J.E. Reynolds, R. Pie, I.C.A. Green & D.N.L. Levy. The Runners up were East Barnet Gr. Sch. with 27 points and St. Albans Gr. Sch. with 25. During this Congress a five section Lightning Tournament was held - a Senior Section won by A.P. Logsdon; an Under-15 section won by G.M. Franks (St. Albans Gr. Sch.); an under-14 section won by G.W. Phillips, (E. Barnet Gr. Sch.); a novices section A won by J.D. Hiscott, Beaumont Sch., St. Albans; & a novices section B won by A.D. Price of Onslow Sch., Hatfield.
