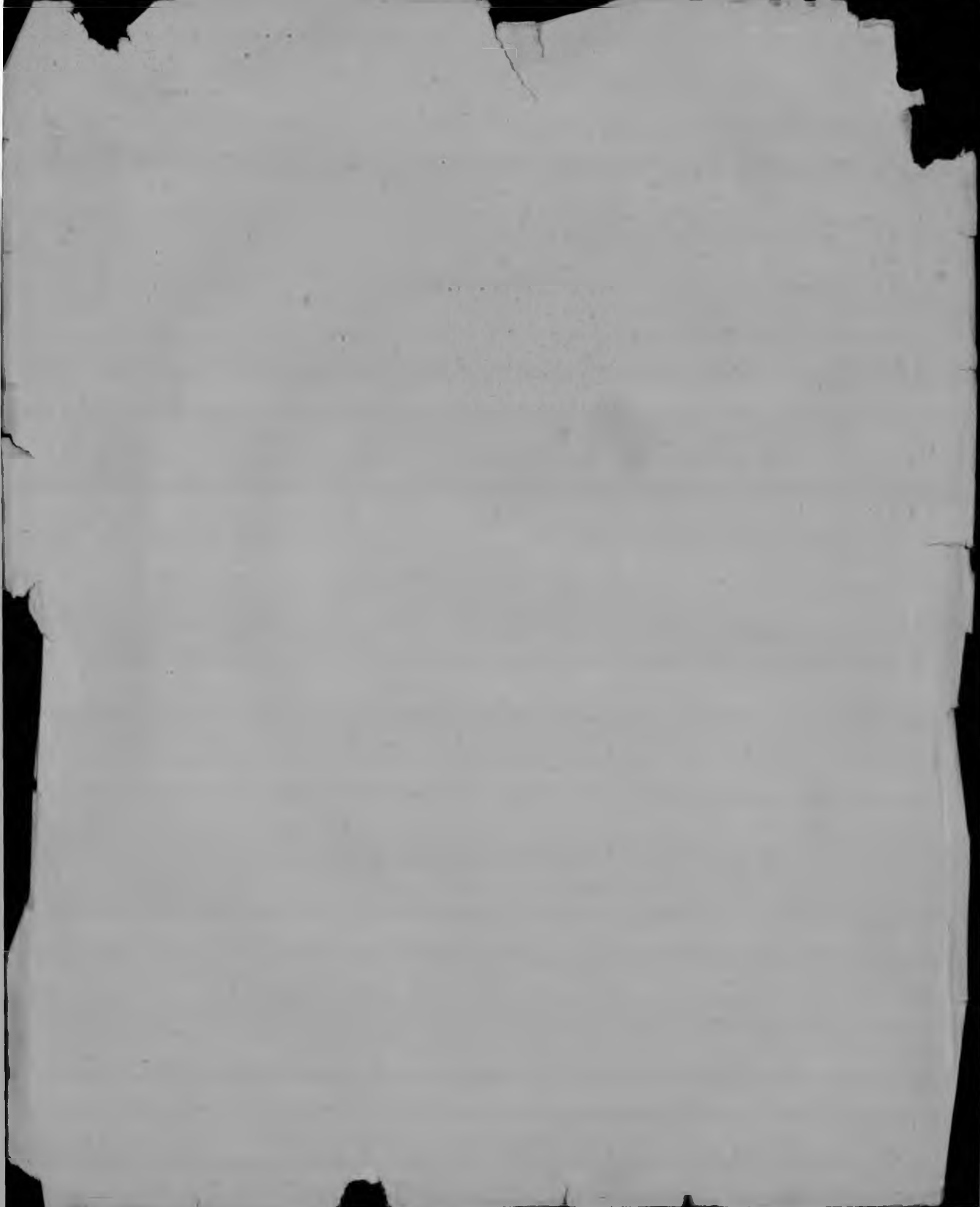

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B.C.F. REGISTRATION FORMS.

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COUNTY MATCH CAPTAINS.

Some County Match Captains are still failing to comply with the rule requiring BOTH CAPTAINS of every County Match to forward the result in full, with players' initials clearly indicated, to the Hon. Tournament Secretary, Mr. Champ, IMMEDIATELY a match has been played, irrespective of any games being sent in for adjudication. If any games are forwarded for adjudication, Mr. Champ should be informed again of such results IMMEDIATELY they become known. In some quarters this rule is not being adhered to, and is consequently causing Mr. Champ considerable extra work. Please rectify.

CHESS ON THE AIR.

Are you listening to the B.B.C.'s Network Three half-hour programme on Chess at 7 p.m. on Tuesday evenings? London, represented by the Ilford Club are playing Manchester, represented by the Manchester City Club, in a consultation match a few moves of which are played each week. Two competition games are included (1) Master versus Listeners (2) Find the Continuation. Also is given the latest news from Munich on the progress of the current International Team Tournament. It is a chess player's MUST if at all possible. The B.C.F. are very anxious it should be brought to your notice.

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F.I.D.E. DECIDES.

The result of the London Boys' Open Championship which depended on a F.I.D.E. decision as to what should be the ruling when on the time control move mate has been administered but a player has not stopped his clock and his flag falls has been given as "Won for the player who has mated the opponent's King. Whether one or the other clock is going after mate has been given is of no importance." Thus D.E. Rumens shares the title with D.E. Sherman.

JUNIOR NEWS.

Blaine the positional side and A.J. Roycroft the way to win an ending. Needless to say these young players are in demand when vacancies occur for County places.

Mr. Coad-Pryor was responsible for arranging Lewis's in Oxford Street for the venue of this interesting venture. It is now in its third year.

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ESSEX JUNIOR NEWS: Mr. Read, the Essex Junior Organiser reports that efforts are being made to start an Essex training scheme for Juniors under-18 on 1st September on the same lines as the Lewis's Training Scheme. It is proposed to make this a Sunday afternoon activity and Clubs are asked to make it known and contact Mr. J. Read, 32 Gillman Drive, Stratford, E.5. for details.

Efforts are also being made to start an Essex area Under-11 Primary School Chess group. Again for particulars contact Mr. Read.

To him, indeed, our thanks are due for the continued use of Stratford Church Institute which incidentally has been delightfully renovated. Visitors are always welcome at the Junior County matches held there, needless to say.

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KENT JUNIOR NEWS: Miss Anness, one of our Vice-Presidents, tells me she has now 48 schools playing in the Kent Schools' Chess League this season and they are busy playing Area matches. 71 teams are taking part, 47 in Junior section and 24 in a Senior section.

Next spring the 15 Area winners will decide in a Knock-out Tournament which is the County's best Junior and Senior Team.

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SURREY JUNIOR NEWS:

The Surrey Junior Organiser writes to say that he has received entry forms from many more schools this year wishing to enter for the Sunday Times School competition; many schools, indeed, have entered two and some three teams.

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SURREY JUNIOR NEWS CONT.:

The "Michell Memorial" & "SURREY BOYS" competition entries, he says, are now complete, and the competitions themselves will soon be under way. As usual they are being run in three areas, Croydon, Kingston and Guildford. Mr. V.G. May of Godalming County Grammar School has taken over the organisation of the Guildford area from Col. Bewey this year.

At the A.G.M. of the Brent Poulter League Committee held at Glyn Grammar School, Epsom, the shield was presented to Whitgift School's 1st team, the League's winners last season. Glyn Grammar School's 1st team were runners-up.

He reports a growing and widespread interest in Chess in Girls' Schools in Surrey.

HERTFORDSHIRE JUNIOR NEWS

Mr. K. Woodland, the enthusiastic Hertfordshire Junior organiser, reports an entry of 12 teams in the "Open Schools' Coronation Trophy" Team event. This is open to 14½ year olds from Grammar Schools, and to any age from Secondary Modern Schools.

14 Teams have entered the Hertfordshire Schools' Association "Clock Tournament for under 14 year olds.

12 Teams have entered the new "Intermediate Team Tourney" for pupils Under 16.

He goes on to say that the new Chess Education Society's teaching pamphlets are proving a great teaching asset in all the schools that have purchased them. He is looking forward to the publication of Nos. 5 & 6.

MIDDLESEX JUNIOR NEWS:

A week's chess tournament was held from September 1st to September 5th at University College, Gower Street, to decide the Middlesex Boy Senior Champion for Under 18 competitors, and the Junior Boy Champion for under 15's. A 6 Round Swiss attracted an entry of 26 in the Junior Tournament, and 20 in the Senior event. In both sections there was a tie for first play, necessitating a play off. In the two game play off in the Junior section both of the competitors won a game and so share the trophy. Their names: A.K. Abel of Harrow County School, and H.P. Brown of St. Paul's School, W.14.

In the Senior section two game play off between D.J. Mabbs, the present British Boy Champion, and A.T. Macdonald William Ellis School's Chess Captain, both games were drawn. Mabbs like Abel was a pupil of Harrow County, played for Harrow and Cedars Chess Clubs but has gained a place in Sheffield University and is now playing for Yorkshire.

The best-game prize was awarded to M.M. Broido of Mill Hill School for his game against M.S. Paterson of Enfield in Round 6.

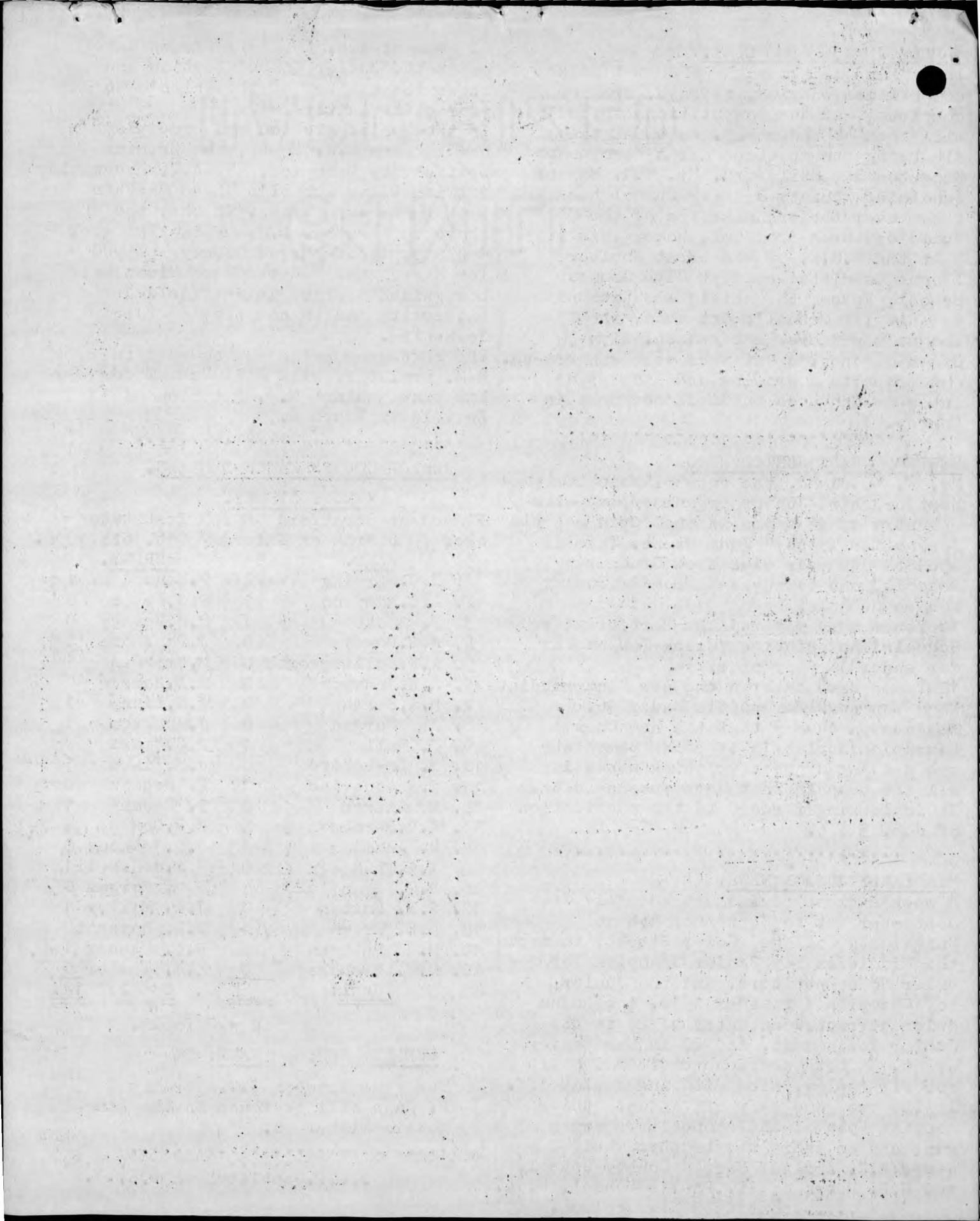

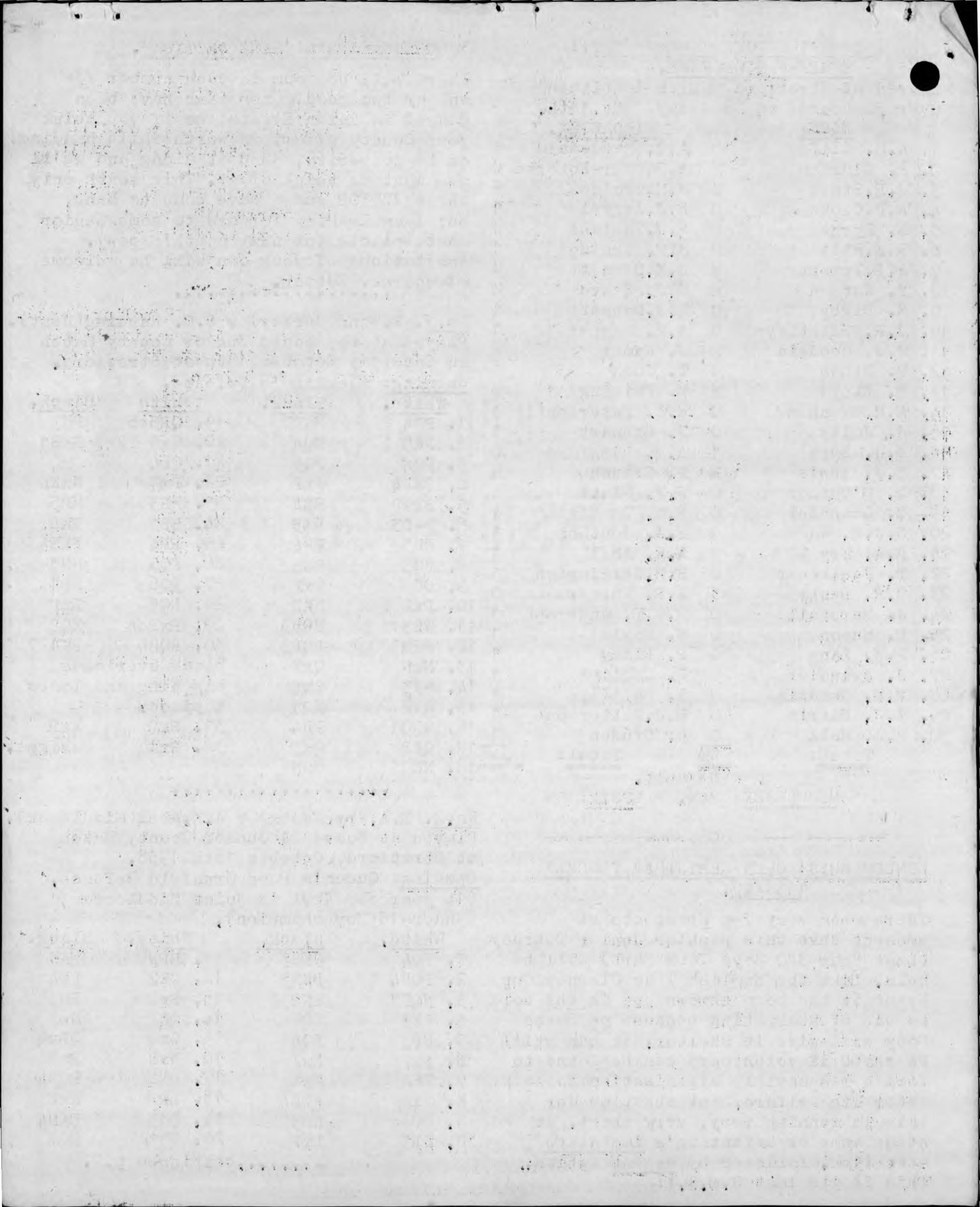

I would like to bring to the notice of all Chess Clubs that at last there are two chess books on the market that really teach.

CHESS FOR CHILDREN (Collins) by R.Bott & S.Morrison  
 INSTRUCTIONS TO YOUNG CHESS PLAYERS (Museum Press) by H. Golombek.

The first mentioned is suitable as an introduction to the game for anyone between eight and eighty and is self explanatory. It turns a novice into a player. The second is a must for all aspirants to Championship class. Mr. Golombek's development of the End-Game step by step from elementary positions to the complex intricacies of master games is a triumph of lucidity and logic. Both are priced at 12/6 but the two form a complete chess course that make the purchase of supplementary books unnecessary.

Teaching Pamphlets based on Chess For Children are being distributed by the Chess Education Society.
