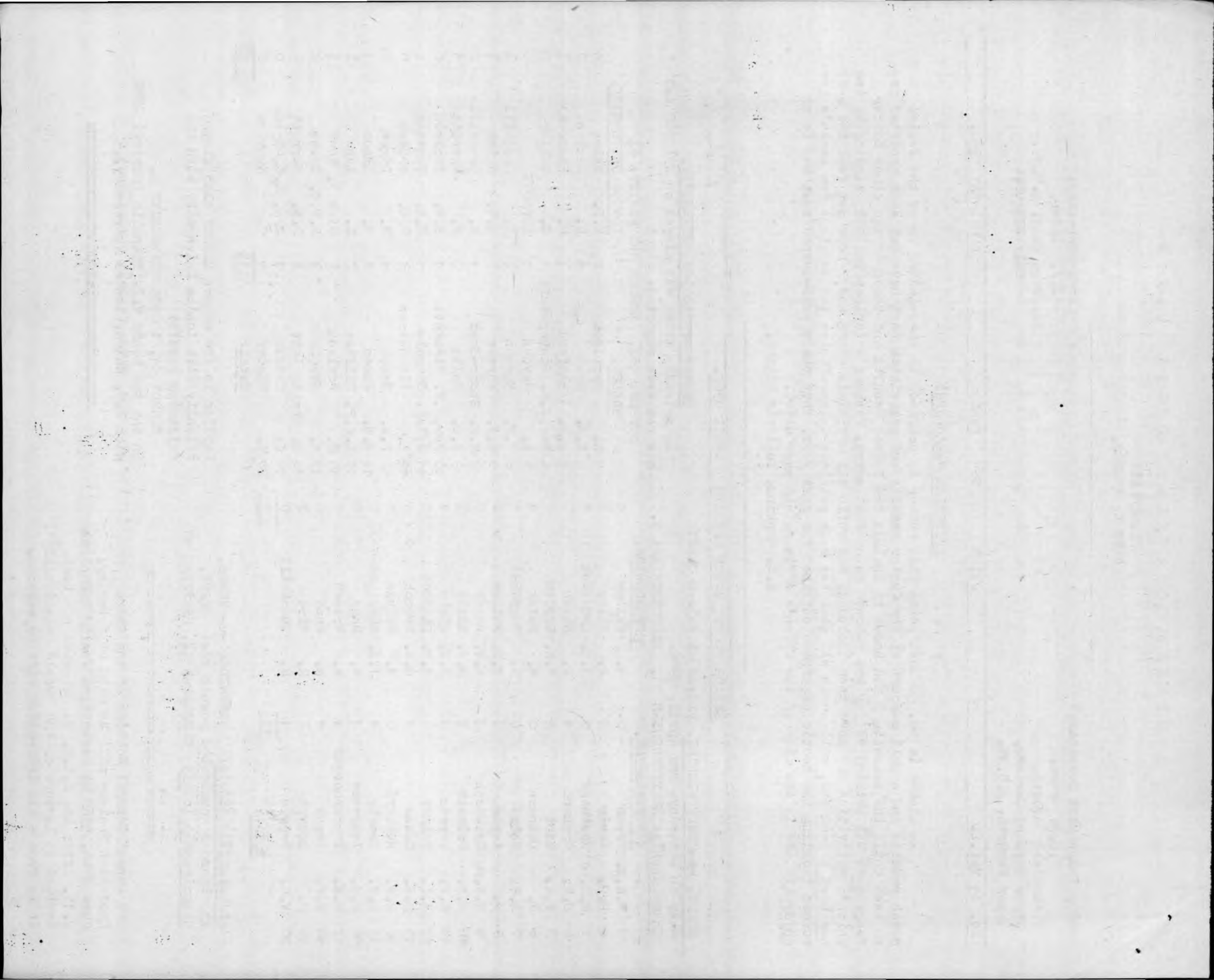

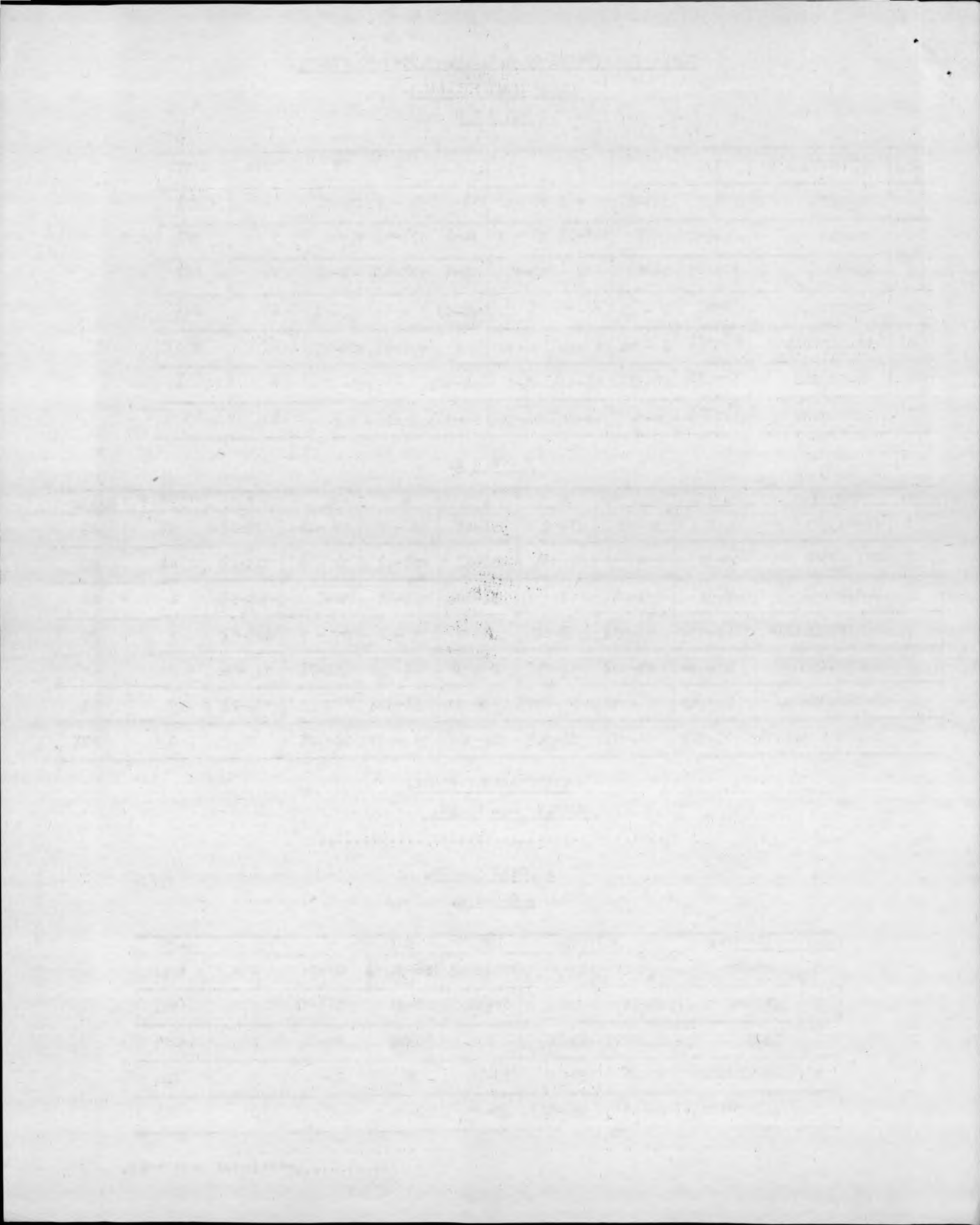

THE "BEST GAME" AWARDS IN THE LONDON JUNIOR CHAMPIONSHIPS:

UNDER-18 SECTION - SENIOR BOYS: A.R. FERSHT of ESSEX was awarded the "Special Du Mont Prize" donated by a well wisher for his 5th Round win with the Black pieces against S.P. Broido.

UNDER-16 SECTION - INTERMEDIATE BOYS: P.J. COLLINS of MIDDLESEX was awarded the "Special Book Prize" donated by A.F. Stammwitz for his 2nd Round win against H.L.J. Newburgher.

UNDER-14 SECTION - JUNIOR BOYS: J.N. EYRES of MIDDLESEX for his Round 5 win against I. Mackean.

UNDER-12 SECTION - PRELIMINARY BOYS: J.T. BARTLETT of MIDDLESEX for his 1st Round win against T. Balwin.

UNDER-18 SECTION - SENIOR GIRLS: Miss WENDY BRADLEY of SURREY for her win against Miss W. Harrison.

UNDER-14 SECTION - JUNIOR GIRLS: Miss LYNDIA C. BIGGS for her Round 8 win against Miss Linda Bott.

THE LONDON SCHOOLS CHESS LEAGUE has had a very successful season and the following details are worth being recorded: The Senior League was won by St. Paul's School with a decisive win over William Ellis. The Junior League for boys under 14 was won by Tiffin School, Kingston, Surrey who won by a narrow margin in the Final from The City of London School.

William Ellis won both the Senior & Junior Lightning Team Championships held at the rally in February at Wandsworth Comprehensive School.

The Individual Lightning Championship held in March at Battersea Grammar School was won by N.J. Argyris of St. Paul's School in the Senior Section, & G. Silver of William Ellis emerged as the Under-14 Champion in this event.

The Individual Championship was retained by S.J. Wallace of Blackheath. He is a pupil of St. Joseph's Academy and shapes well to becoming one of our prominent junior most promising players. He was awarded the "Best Game prize also in this section. The Junior Individual Champion was A. Bracher of Tiffin School, Kingston and the Junior Individual "Best Game" award went to J.N. Eyres. These were decided by Mr. R.G. Wade for which our thanks are most certainly due.

KENT: Miss L. Anness, the Kent Junior Organiser, reports that out of the 13 Junior Area finalists Beckenham & Penge Grammar School eventually emerged as winners, the runners up being St. Austin's School, Charlton. In the Senior Kent Schools' League, out of 8 area finalists Bromley Grammar School eventually came out top with Sir Roger Manwood's School, Sandwich, as runner up.

OXFORD: Mr. F. Wood, the Oxford Junior Organiser, reports that the Oxford Junior Championships were held at Oriel College, Oxford, in the first month of the year. Out of a total of 65 entries 29 were Senior competitors and 36 in an Under-15 section. One girl took part in the Senior event and four in the Junior one. The winner of the Senior event was J.N. Walker of Cheney School, Oxford with 5 points out of 6, who thus becomes the Oxford Junior Champion. The Junior event was won by S.J.L. Walker of Magdalen College School with 7 points out of 9. He does not say whether these two section winners are related so possibly they are not. He does point out that the prizes were presented by Professor H. Simpson, who, at the age of 83, continues to act as Secretary of the Oxford City Chess Club with the energy which a man half his age would envy and takes a special interest in the performance of the Oxford junior players.

SUSSEX: Mr. H.G. Hobbell, the Sussex Junior Organiser writes to say that a local Brighton benefactor has allocated a sum of money for a yearly tournament for Juniors in the Brighton district. This year some 259 players - girls and boys between 11 & 19 years old - took part in a jamboree in March. In Section A the winners were Hove Grammar School for Boys. In Section B the winners were Hove, Brighton & Sussex Grammar School. Section C produced Downs Junior Mixed School.

In the Senior Girls' Individual, Jeanette Campin was the winner and in the Junior Section Jean King.

Both of these come from Varndean Grammar School for Girls.

I feel sure that all of us wish Mr. Hobbell continued success in his efforts to produce future players for the Sussex Senior Team and congratulate him on such a successful start.

HERTFORDSHIRE: Mr. K. Woodland, Hertfordshire's enthusiastic junior organiser reports that at Christmas last the Barnet Division of the Primary Schools held a very successful 9 Round Swiss Congress. 49 competitors from 9 Schools took part and was won by D. Allen, a ten year old from Church Hill Junior Mixed School with a 100% record. A novel part of the event was a Chess Quiz won by P. O'Loughlin.

HERTFORDSHIRE JUNIOR NEWS CONT.

During the Easter Schools' Vacation the 8th Annual Boys' Congress was run at Hatfield Technical College. 135 competitors entered from the county representing 23 schools. Six novices sections were entered for, a Junior section for Under-15 competitors and a Senior Section for Under-18's. An Inter-Schools' Trophy competition was run as well as Lightning Tournaments and Solving Competitions. The INTER-SCHOOLS TEAM TROPHY was won by Queen Elizabeth's School, Barnet. In this event 5 Schools took part. The Senior Section individual was won by A.P. Logsdon of Queen Elizabeth's, and the Junior Under-15 Championship was won by D.N.L. Levy from the same school. Competitors topping the novices sections came from Rickmansworth Grammar School; Welwyn Grammar School; Onslow School, Hatfield; Cheshunt Grammar School; Alleyne's School, Stevenage; St. Alban's Grammar School; & East Barnet Gr. School. A.P. Logsdon won the Senior Section Lightning Tournament with an 100% score.

With such a widespread activity it seems the other home counties will soon have a worthy rival for championship honours and it augurs well for Hertfordshire's Senior Team prospects in the not so far distant future. Congratulations Herts. on so fine a 1959/60 effort.

THE BUREAU OF LAND MANAGEMENT (BLM) was established in 1946 as a result of the reorganization of the Department of the Interior. It is the largest and most diverse of the four major bureaus of the Department. Its primary responsibility is to manage the public lands of the United States in a manner that will provide for the long-term health and productivity of the land resources. This includes the protection, development, and utilization of the land resources for the benefit of the present and future generations.

The BLM's jurisdiction extends over approximately 265 million acres of public lands, which are scattered throughout the United States. These lands are managed in a variety of ways, including grazing, timber production, recreation, and conservation.
