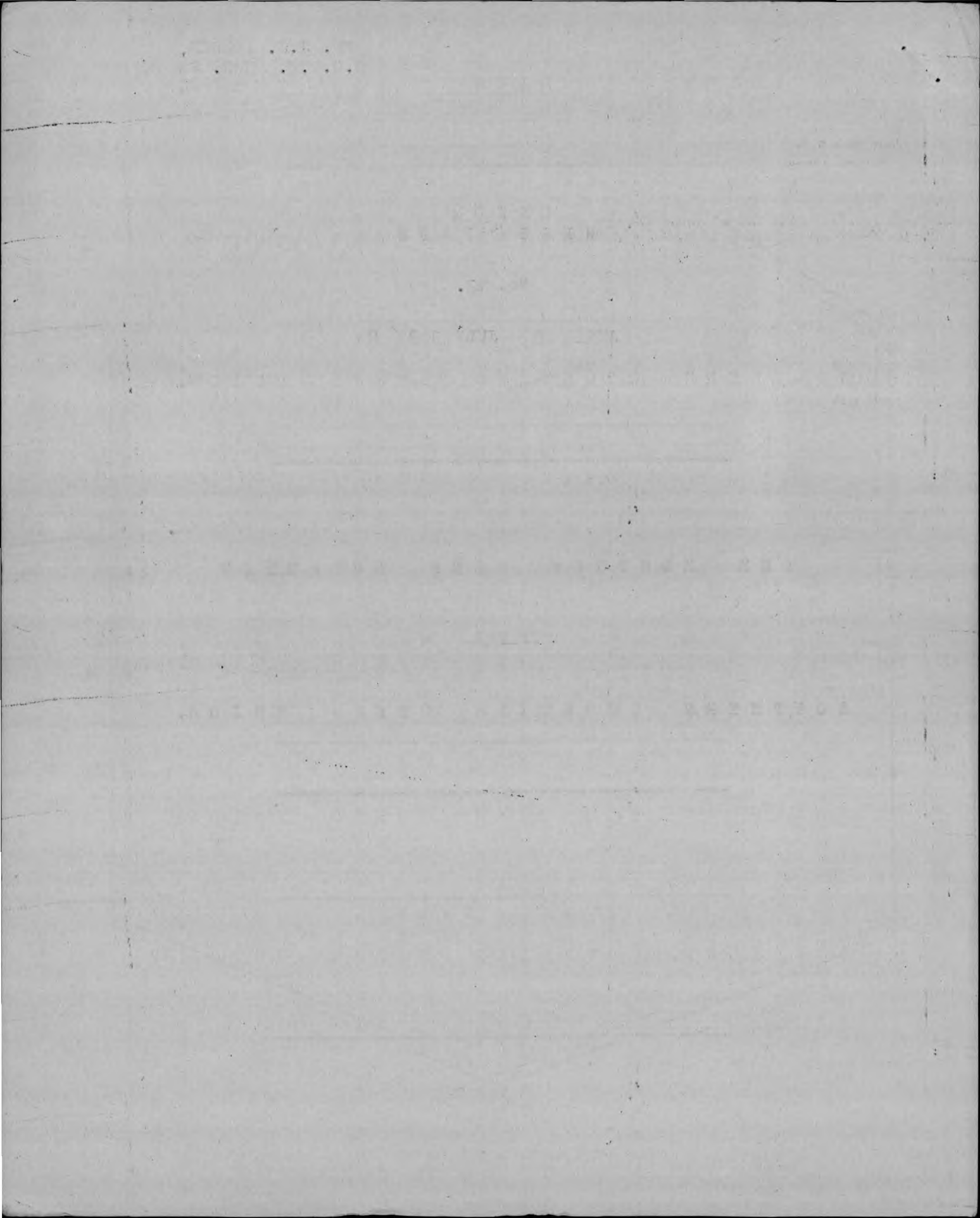

COUNTY NEWS.

KENT: Mr. H. Keeble reports that the new President of the Kent Chess Association is C.N. Yates, Esq. He also sends the results of the various Kent competitions that have been taking place:

The Kent County Cup: Metropolitan Section, Lewisham emerged as winners.

Mid-Kent Section Tunbridge Wells winners. East Kent: Canterbury won.

In the play off between Mid-Kent and East Kent Canterbury won.

Thus the final is between Lewisham and Canterbury and this I am informed will be played next September.

The Lewis Cup open to all Kent was won by Lewisham; the Stevenson Cup Metropolitan Section again went to Lewisham; Canterbury in the Mid-Kent East-Kent contest took the honours by beating Maidstone 3-2.

The Individual County Championship was secured by D. Hamilton who also won the Metropolitan Section.

Mrs. Pentecost who also won the Owen Dixon Cup for the year.

The Club Correspondence Championship was won by Canterbury.

BUCKINGHAMSHIRE: Mr. Ruddle, the Junior Chess Organiser for Bucks, says:

In order to stimulate an interest in Chess in schools in the county, the Bucks, County Chess Association has offered a trophy to be competed for annually. He would like to hear of any school in the county wishing to take part in such a competition next winter. Teams of six on a knock-out basis are contemplated with earlier stages run on a regional basis if entries merit such a procedure.

The Middlesex Junior Championship congress is being staged at Hayes from Monday August 29th to September 2nd, both days inclusive, in Sangate Hall, Station Road. Any offers of help, equipment, especially clocks and suggestions generally will be welcomed by Mr. Sinclair, 21 Heatherdene, West Horsley, Surrey.

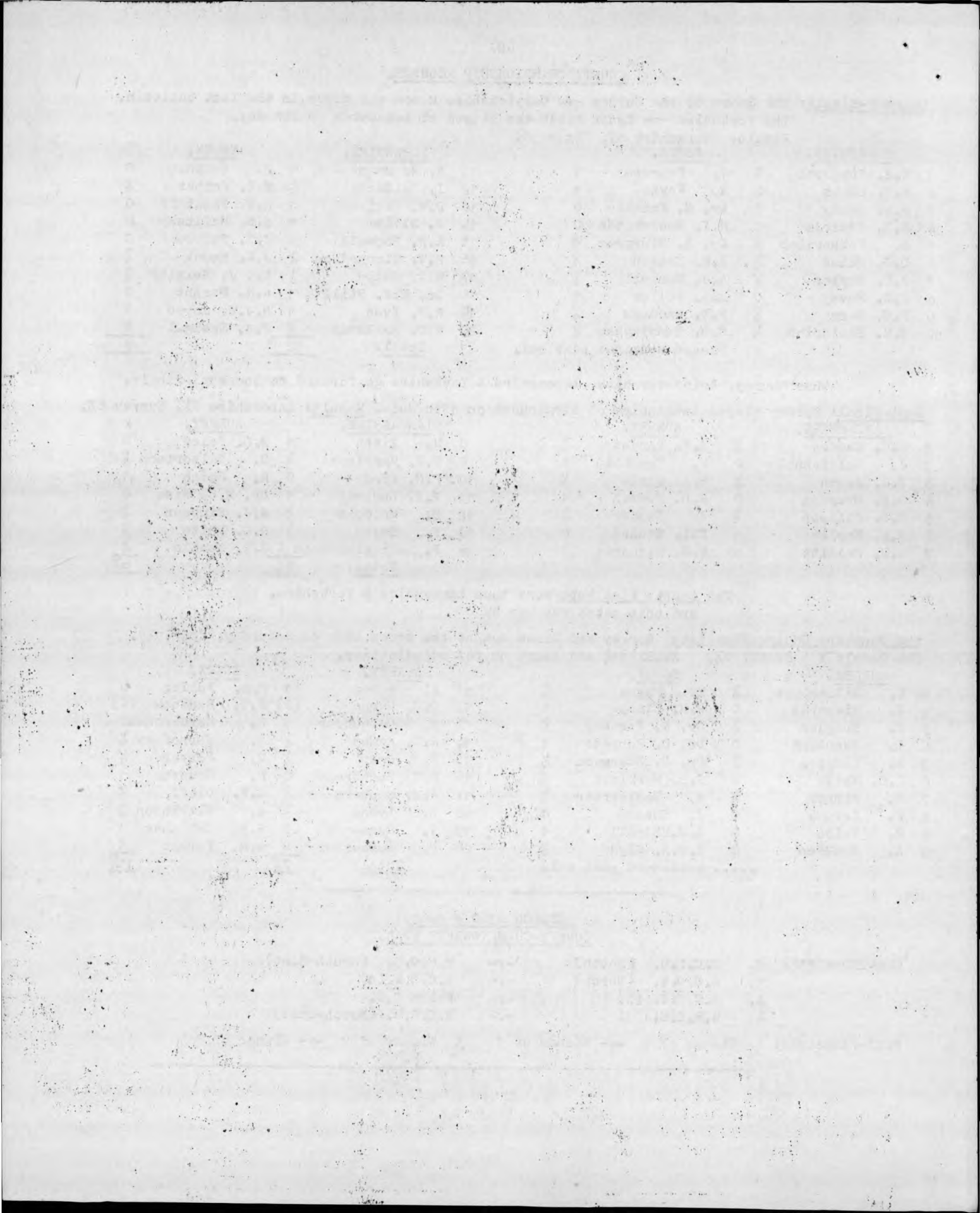

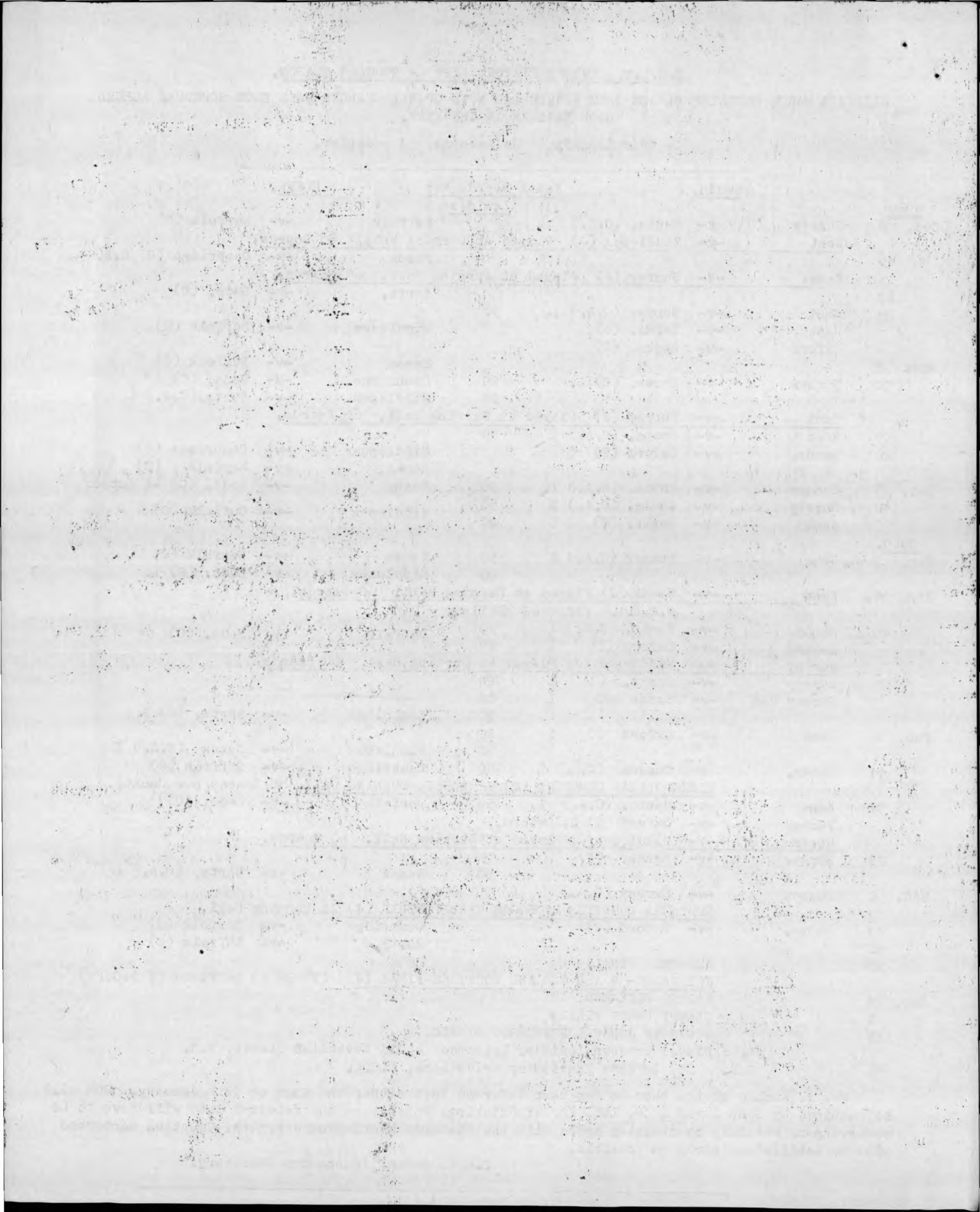

In the account of this event in the last Bulletin I gave the result SUBJECT TO ANY APPEAL. Surrey appealed against the adjudication result on Board 1 against Glamorgan - which had been given as a win for Glamorgan. Surrey's appeal was successful and the finalised result on that board is a DRAW.

Staffordshire also made two appeals against their adjudicated result on Board 2 against Glamorgan, and on their Board 12 against Surrey. Both these appeals failed and the drawn result on these boards as given last time stands as final.

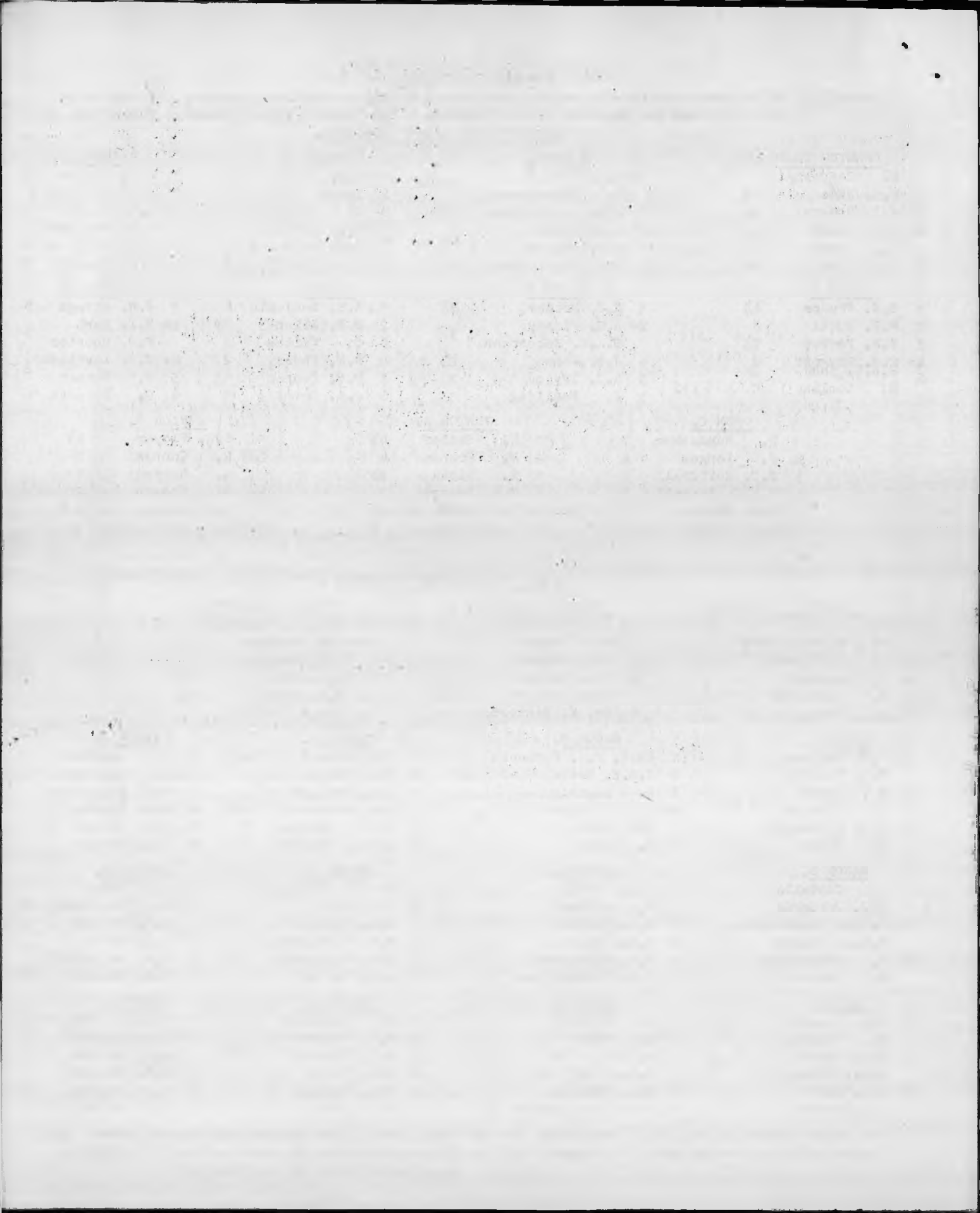
