



HERTFORDSHIRE JUNIOR COUNTY NEWS: Mr. K. L. Woodland, the Hertfordshire Junior Organiser, reports that the Hertfordshire Chess Association has 21 secondary schools affiliated, and inter-school tournaments at 3 levels are now running in the county - under-14%, under-16 % open. As the transport facilities are not always good, and distances between schools often considerable, the tournaments consist of 5 premiminary matches against selected other schools within reasonable travelling range, followed by a jamboree cross-pairing final between the 4 schools with the best scores from the preliminary matches. The 9th Annual Boys' Congress, for the Boys' Championship of Herts. (Under-18) and the Junior Boys' Championship (under-15) will be held at Hatfield Technical College from 4th April to 7th April, 1961.

A congress for primary schools in South Herts, was held in Barnet from December 28th - December 31st, 1960, and attracted 58 competitors. In addition to the 9 Round Swisstournament there was practically non-stop instruction coaching and demonstrations going on for competitors whose games had finished. This part of the congress was run by Mr. K.F. Baker. The congress ended with a handicap chess 'quizz' organised by K. L. Woodland, the handicap or start which each competitor received being the number of points which he or she had conceded to opponents in the Swiss Tournament, This enabled non-prizewinners in the latter to redeem their fortunes in the 'quiz, This was the 5th Primary Schools held by Mr. Woodland at Barnet and the results were:



ESSEX COUNTY JUNIOR NEWS: Mr. Read of Stratford reports that the 1960/61 Essex Junior Championship is being played in two sections on an all-play-all spatem, six competitors in each section. The first Round is due to be played by 6th Feb., the second by 27th Feb., the third by 20th March, the 4th by 10th of April and the 5th by 1st May. Leaders will then form a final pool with A.R. Fersht, R.A.E. Shaw. C. Waites & Q. Bailey who are exempt from the preliminary rounds.

Mr. A.L. Ford of Aveley Junior School writes concerning the East London Junior Congress, held at the Hamlet of Rateliffe Church of England School, Whitehorse Road, London, E.1. on the Wednesday and Thursday of 28th 2 29th 1 December, 1960. 56 entries from 12 1 East London Schools were received and the result of the Swiss Tournament held was that

1st was JOHN WRIGHT, (Aveley Junior School) 10 points. Brian Stockdale (Aveley Junior Soh.) 9 points.

(He does not say how many rounds were played but to get 10 points from a Swiss in TWO DAYS means someone had to do some quick turning round).

Mr. Ford also reports that on Friday, 30th December, a one-day congress was held at Aveley Junior School with 7 boys playing in an all play all section & 6 girls playing an-allplay-all tournament in another section. The boys came from 5 Junior Schools in the area and the girls from 4 girls schools. The winners were:
