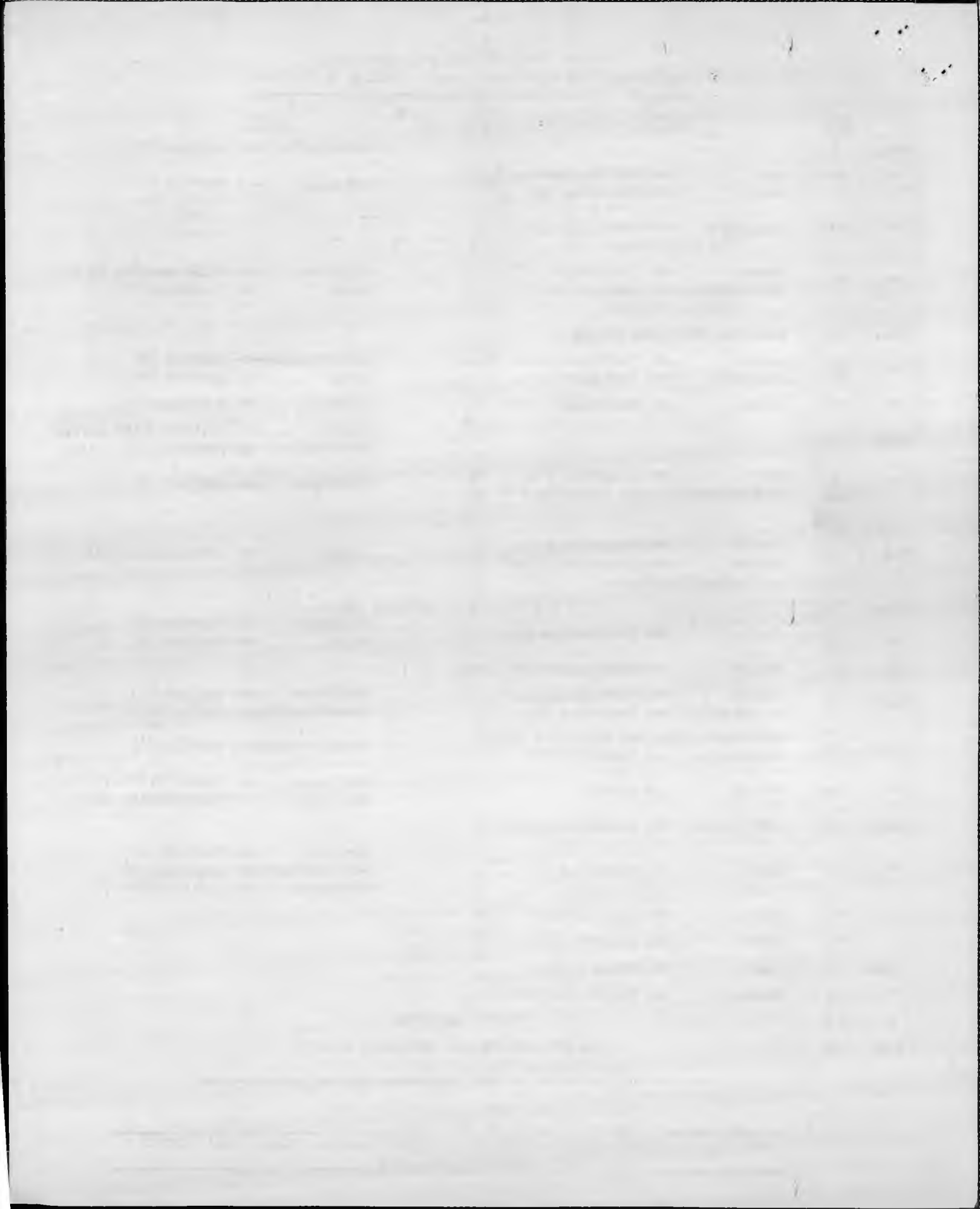

HERTFORDSHIRE JUNIOR COUNTY NEWS: Mr. K.L. Woodland, the Hertfordshire Junior Organiser, reports that the Hertfordshire Chess Association has 21 secondary schools affiliated, and inter-school tournaments at 3 levels are now running in the county - under-14½, under-16 & open. As the transport facilities are not always good, and distances between schools often considerable, the tournaments consist of 5 preliminary matches against selected other schools within reasonable travelling range, followed by a jamboree cross-pairing final between the 4 schools with the best scores from the preliminary matches.

The 9th Annual Boys' Congress, for the Boys' Championship of Herts. (Under-18) and the Junior Boys' Championship (under-15) will be held at Hatfield Technical College from 4th April to 7th April, 1961.

A congress for primary schools in South Herts. was held in Barnet from December 28th - December 31st, 1960, and attracted 58 competitors. In addition to the 9 Round Swisstournament there was practically non-stop instruction coaching and demonstrations going on for competitors whose games had finished. This part of the congress was run by Mr. K.F. Baker. The congress ended with a handicap chess 'quizz' organised by K.L. Woodland, the handicap or start which each competitor received being the number of points which he or she had conceded to opponents in the Swiss Tournament. This enabled non-prizewinners in the latter to redeem their fortunes in the 'quiz. This was the 5th Primary Schools held by Mr. Woodland at Barnet and the results were:

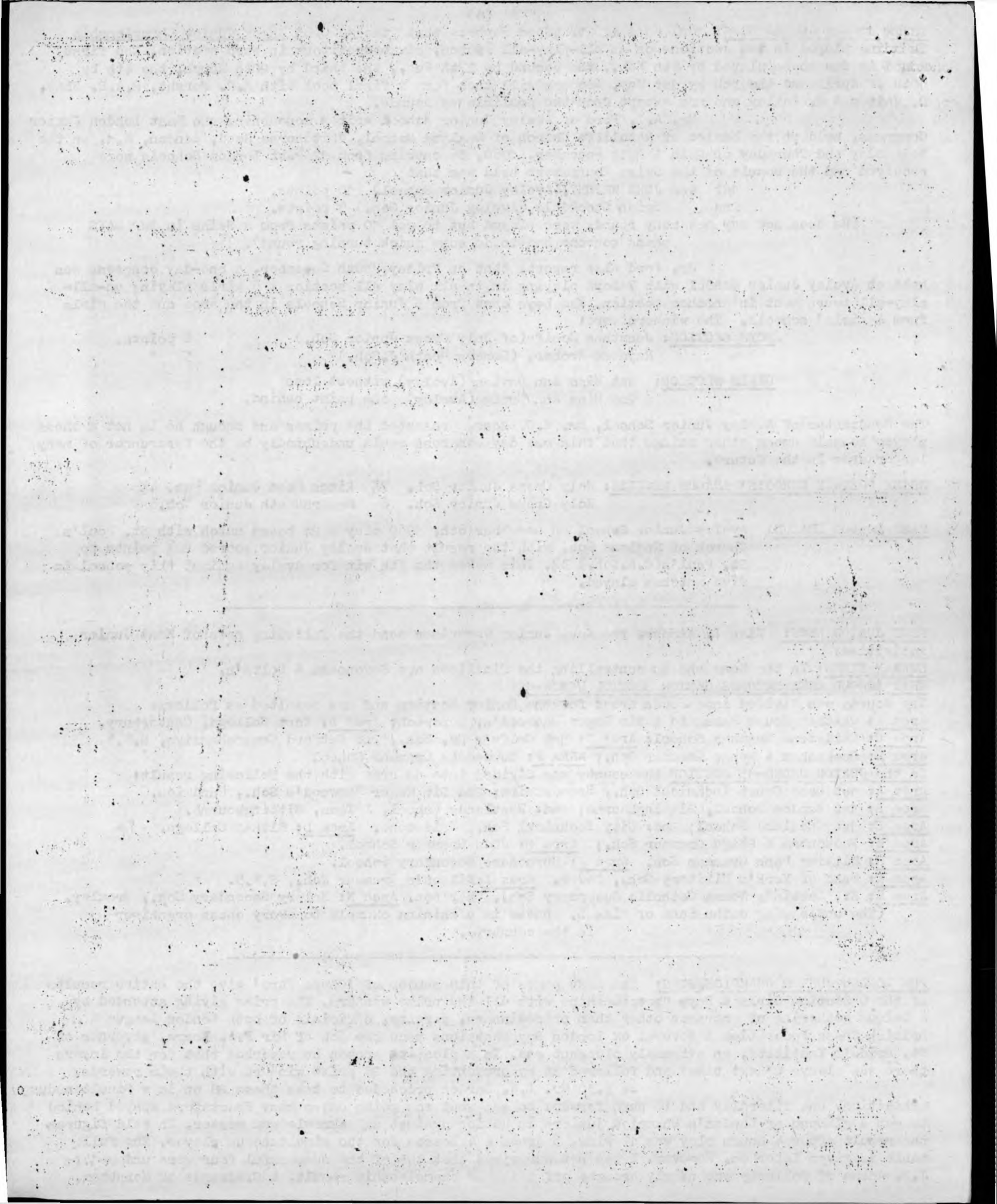

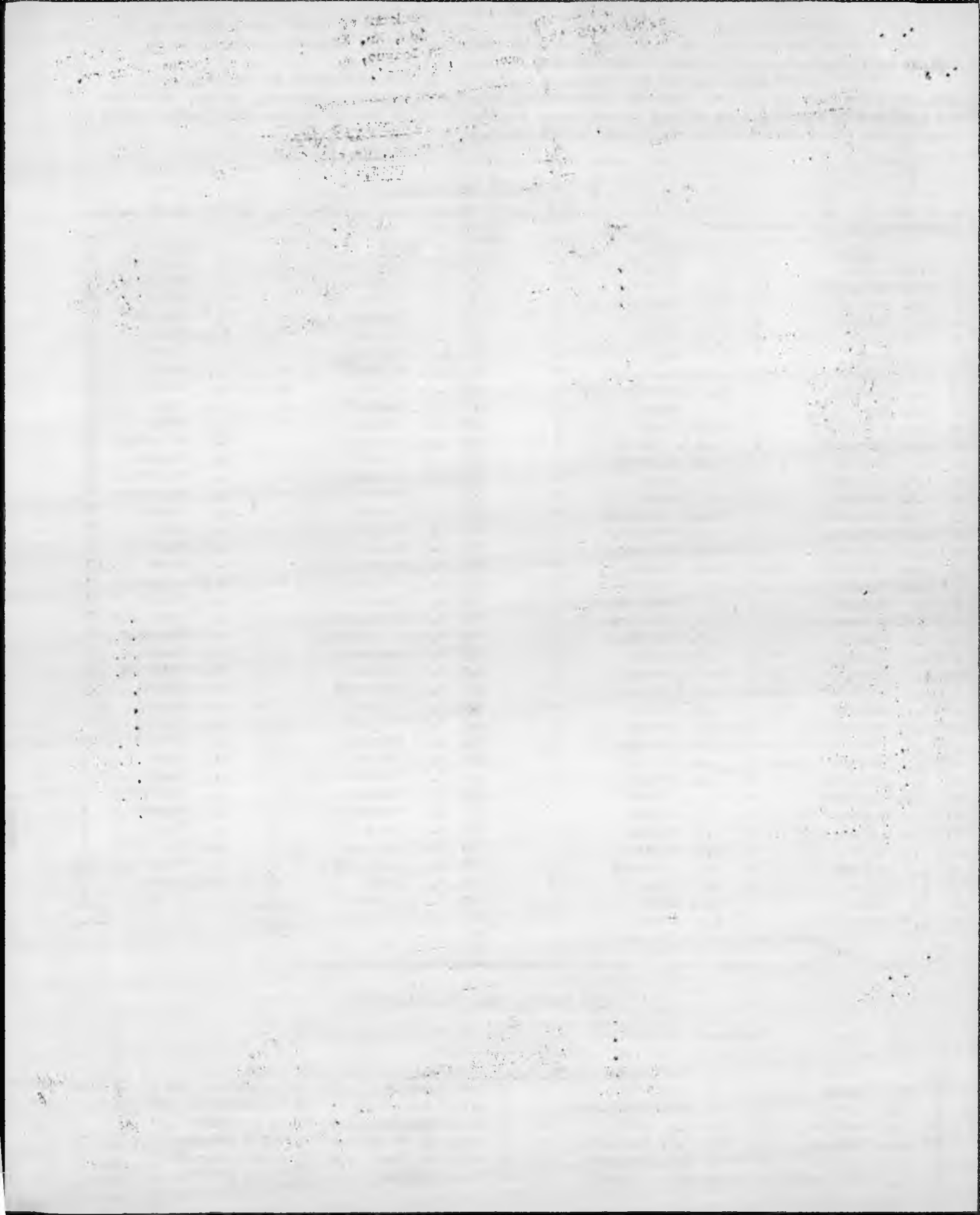

THE LONDON JUNIOR CHAMPIONSHIPS: The last pages of this number of 'Chess Fare' give the entire results of the 6 Section Girls & Boys Championships with all the prize winners. The prize giving attended by a unique gathering of entrants other than prizewinners, parents, officials of both London League & British Chess Federation & several ex London Boy Champions made the job of Sir F.A. Moore, governor of St. Bride's Institute, an extremely pleasant one. In a pleasing speech he remarked that for the losers there was always a 'next time' and followed it by presenting the 28 prize winners with their rewards.

At 3.30 Mr. L.W. Barden proceeded to take these 28 on in a Simultaneous exhibition. One literally had to push forward to see what was going on; so many spectators stayed behind to get a glimpse of London's champion juniors in action against an acknowledged master. In bald figures the result after 4 hours play was 17 wins, 5 draws & 4 losses for the simultaneous player. The full table is given later on.
