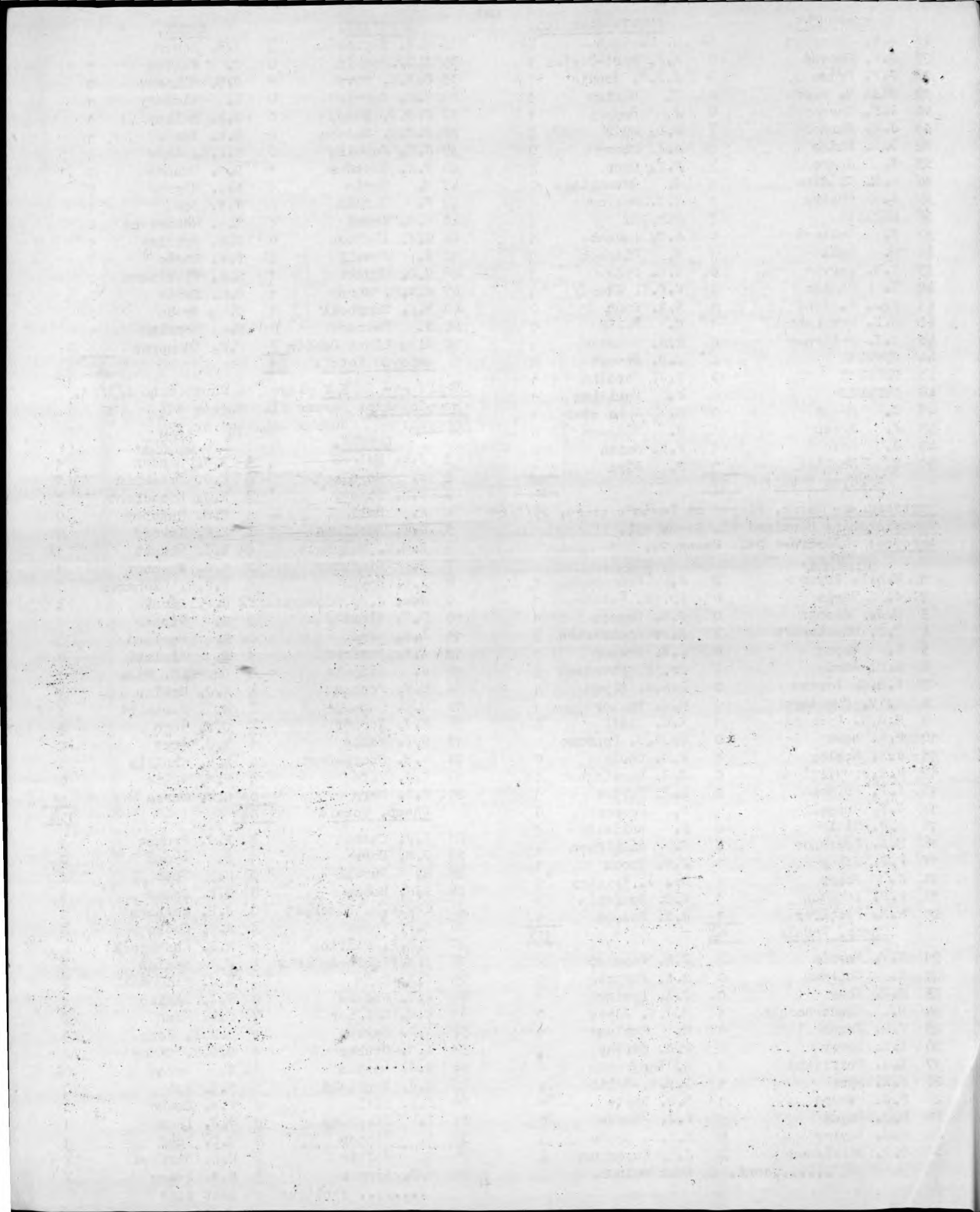

NATIONAL CHESS WEEK.

On Saturday, March 18th, 13 teams of four met at Bourneville Hall, Birmingham in the National Lightning Team Championship. One of these teams 'Cedars' was from Middlesex, and another from Romford, Essex. Romford with their composite team secured first place with 39 games out of 48. Cedars came 3rd with 36½ games out of 48, Sutton Coldfield being 2nd with 38 games out of 48. Romford's composite team consisted of M.J. Franklin, J.B. Howson, D. Sherman & M. Willis. and it is not surprising that this powerful combination proved more than enough for all opponents. Cedars fielded D.E. Rumens, D.J. Mabbs, D.G. Levens and J. Collins.

COPY FOR APRIL CHESS FARE BY FRIDAY, 21st
APRIL, 1961 PLEASE.

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If the weather has prevented a spate of Senior news reaching the Bulletin, there is no dearth as usual in Junior activities. With the London Schools Individual Lightning, the Wandsworth Rally, the S.C.C.U. Under-18 Finals, the All England County Finals to say nothing of School League end of term activities things have been moving at a hectic pace. And wedged in was Chess Week.

Mr. Moppett reports upon the Hayes Harlington Chess Week Finale - their 6th Annual display of Teenagers and Old-Stagers held at Townfield School on March 18th.

First the Hayes Chess Club accepted a challenge from their Junior members to a 12 Board match. The result the Juniors won 6½ to 5½, not losing a game on the first five boards. The Seniors were not discouraged by this unexpected defeat for it meant the club's future success was being catered for in the best way possible. This junior success was followed by 145 local juniors taking part in a Teen-agers Old-stagers match that had an International flavour about it as American Air Force Officers were commandeered to strengthen the Old-stagers as well as several Indian players from a nearby Club. But again the local Junior talent proved too much for the adults and the event closed with a prize giving celebration at which the local J.P. presided.

SURREY: Mr. Dunne, the County Junior Organiser gives the following account of the following:

(a) The Surrey Junior Competition held in three sections has been very successful.

The Croydon Section was won by W.P. Coombes of Whitgift, the Guilford Section by 11 year old Louis de Veauce and the Kingston Section by M.J. Basman of Surbiton Gr. School. In the play off between the finalists M.J. Basman secured first place and so qualifies for Bognor as Surrey's representative.

(b) The Mitchell Memorial Shield

Winner of Guildford Section: Again 11 yearold Louis de Veauce.

Winner of Kingston Section M.J. Taylor of Glyn Grammar School.

Winner of Croydon Section R.A. Harris of Whitgift who telephoned me the result of his last game as soon as it was finished.

These three juniors will now play off to decide the Shield's destination in 1964.

(c) Briant Poulter Shield:

At the moment it looks as if the Briant Poulter Shield will be won by Sutton County Grammar School for the first time for 12 years. It is still possible on the result of outstanding adjudications that a triple tie will materialise between Sutton, Purley County Gr. School and Whitgift. The position will be clarified in the next Bulletin.

On Monday, 27th March, four schools from the Briant Poulter League met in a friendly jamboree at Glyn Grammar School. The Secretary of that school planned all the Hutton-Pairing details with meticulous accuracy and thus the result was obtained immediately the match was finished without any bother at all. On Saturday, 11th March was staged the London Schools Chess League Individual Lightning Championship. 30 Boys from 19 Schools travelled across London to Haberdashers' Aske's School, Hampstead to take part with the following result in the Junior Under-14 Section, and 35 boys representing 20 schools took part in the Senior Section:- (A 7 Round Swiss 10 secs. a move was staged for the Juniors & a 6 Round Swiss Senior)

JUNIOR SECTION: 1. C.B. Edwards (Whitgift) 6pts = K. Harman (Owen's) with W. Hartston (City of London) 5½.

SENIOR SECTION: 1. N.J. Argyris (St. Paul's) 6 points without loss. 2. R.A. Harris (Whitgift) 5 points.

On Saturday, 18th March, 250 pupils of London Schools affiliated to the League journeyed to Wandsworth for their Annual Rally, an all day get together that had its climax in the Team Lightning Championships for both Juniors Under-14 and for the Seniors.

In the morning 20 selected entrants played against the British Champion, Mr. J. Penrose. In just under 2 hours Jonathan had won 16 games, drawn 2 to J.S. Auld of Christ's College, & to C.R. Beddell of St. Olave's & St Saviour's School, Tower Bridge, and lost 2 to R.A. Harris of Whitgift School, and to G.G. Silver of William Ellis School, Highgate.

While Mr. Penrose was struggling with his aspirants to chess fame, A.Y. Green, the Middlesex County player was entertaining 34 other opponents with the result that out of 34 he took on he won 33 and lost 1 to M. Stein of Christ's College, Finchley.

D. Mackay, the Kent County player on the other side of the large hall faced another 28 winning 20, drawing 4 and losing 4. These younger opponents in their excitement at not being beaten completely overlooked giving in their names so they must remain incognito.

After a snack lunch the main business of the day, the Team Championships took place. 22 Teams of Juniors and 32 Senior Teams fought out a 7 Round Swiss 10 seconds a move affair with the result that in the Juniors WHITGIFT 'A' Team with 7 points got a 100% win and with 24½ games out of 28 were easily the Junior Champions. Runners up in this section were Owen's 'A' Team with 5½ points and 19 games to their credit. Only just behind in game but not Swiss points were Whitgift 'B' Team 17½ games and also 5½ Swiss points.

In the Senior Section St. Paul's 'A' Team and William Ellis 'A' Team both had 6 points out of 7 but the former nosed out the latter by winning 22 games against William Ellis' 21 games to gain the Senior Championship title. Whitgift 'A' Team followed close behind with City of London each having 5 Swiss points but Whitgift having 19½ games to their credit against City of London's 18½.

After the tea interval more simulms to conclude a strenuous day's chess R. Payne of Essex, & P. Haddock and G. Wheeler of London University each taking on 18 opponents each. Need I say the organiser's would not like this event to be held more than once a year.

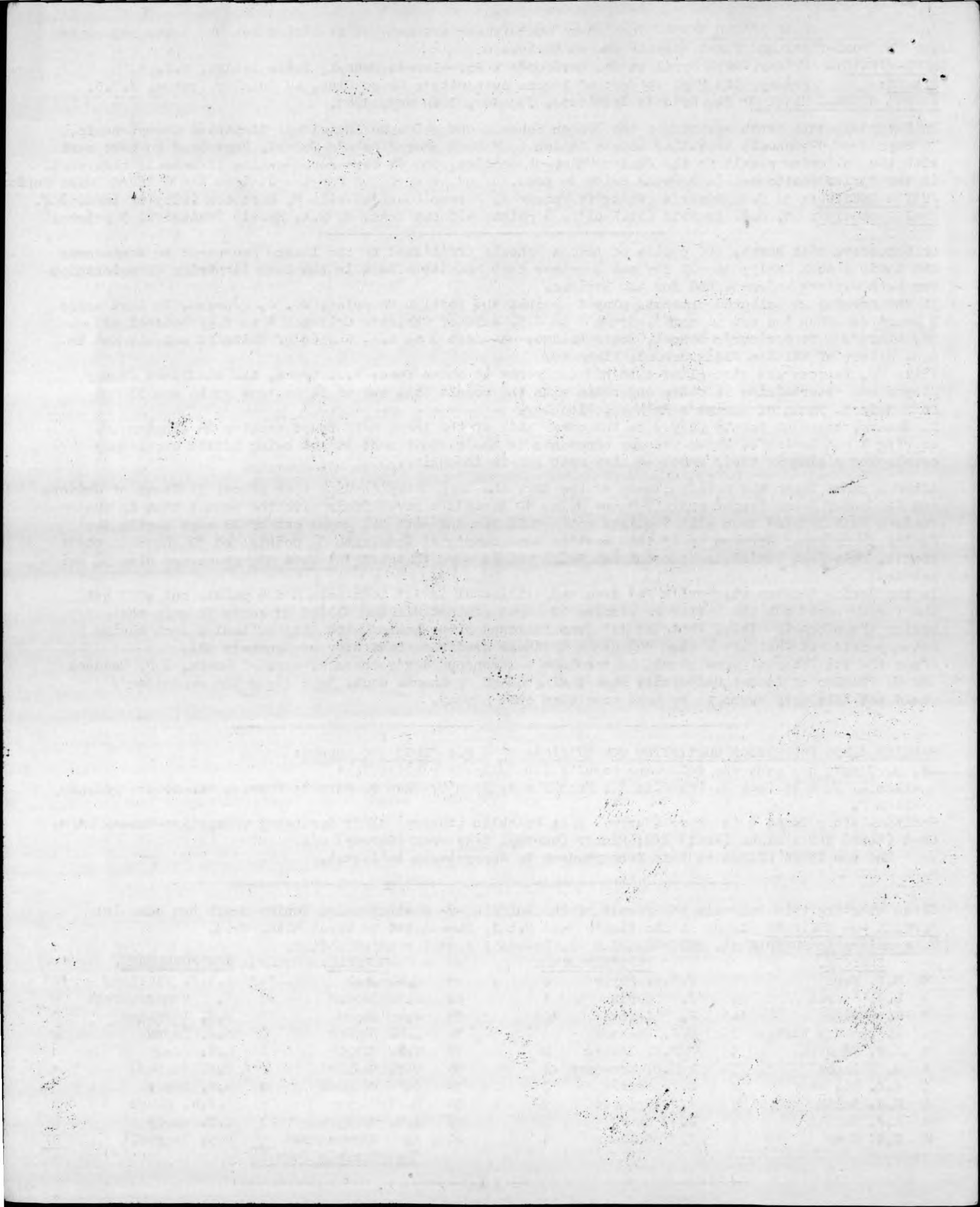

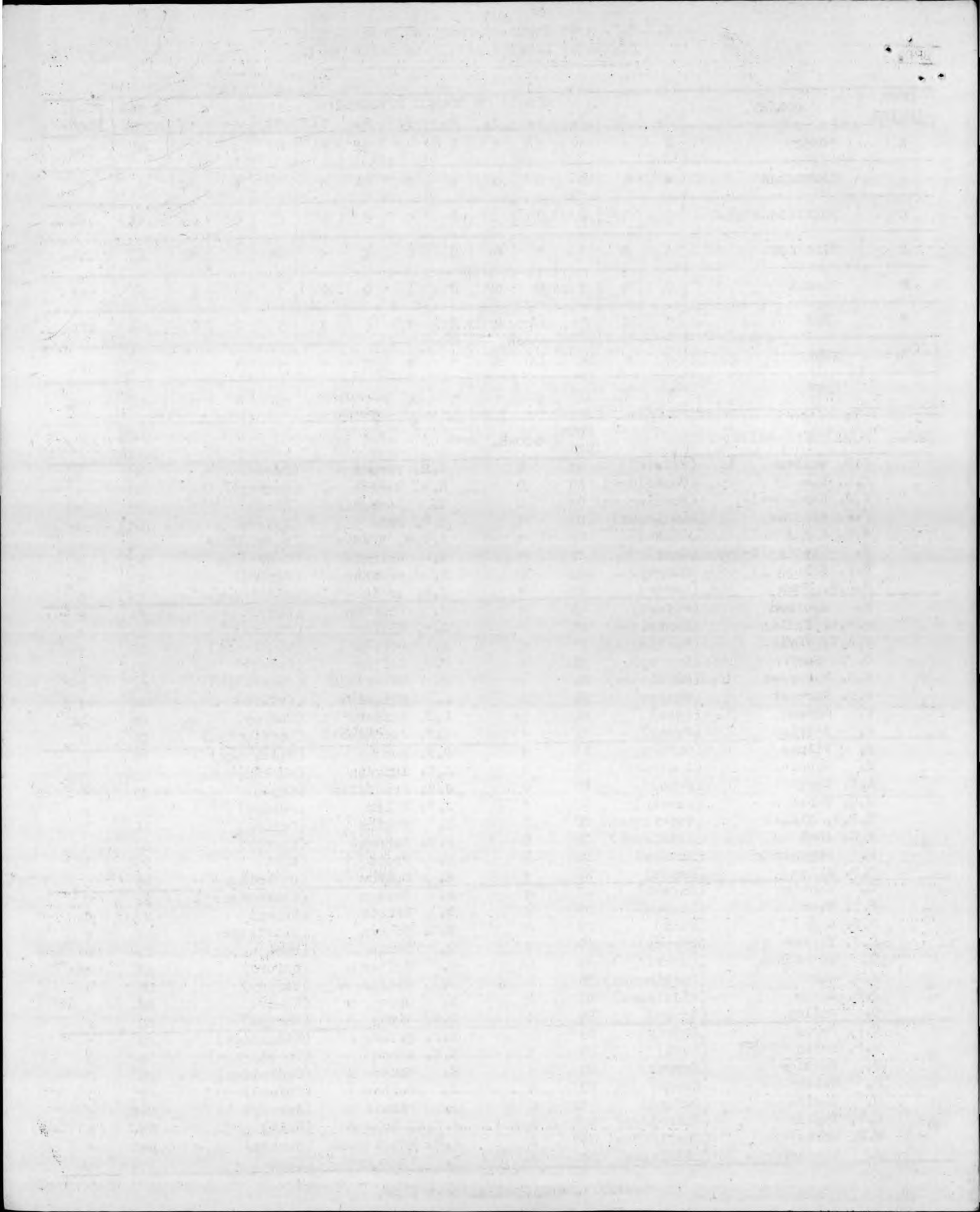

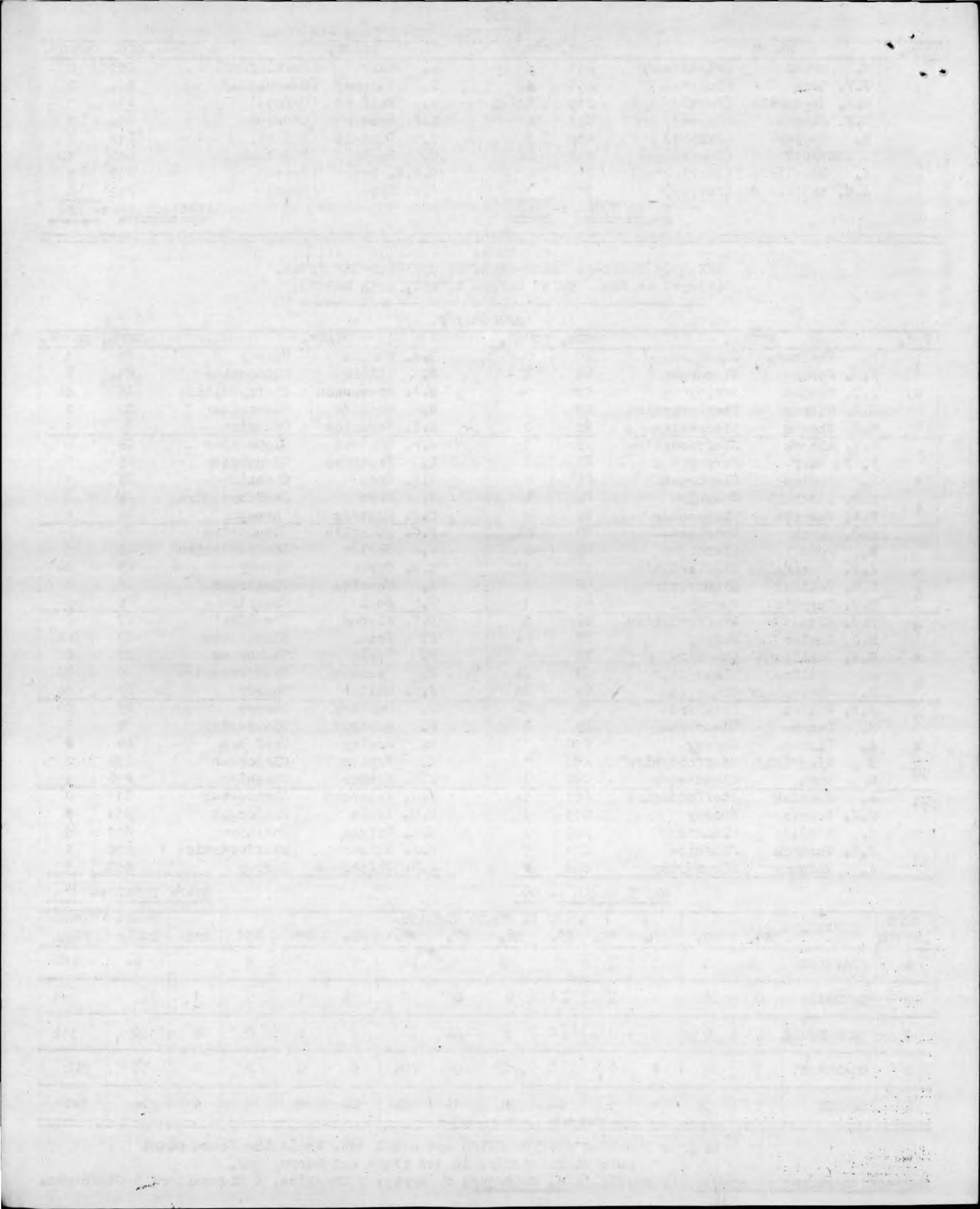

NOTES BY THE WINNER.

- (a) BKN5 or PB4 is currently a more popular way of meeting the Najdorf variation.
- (b) White up to now has adopted a solid formation but this move tends to leave the Knight hanging in the air though it does prevent 16...NB5.
- (c) White's position does not warrant this sort of aggression as will soon become apparent.
- (d) 16...PxP; 17 BxP, KNQ2 followed by 18...NK4 is also quite adequate. Black, however, follows the policy of countering a wing attack with a break in the centre.
- (e) 17 PxQP, NxQP; 18 NxN, NxN; 19 BxN, QRQ1; 20 BxPoh, RxB; 21 QK1, QxP; 22 RB2, QK5 is hopeless for White.
