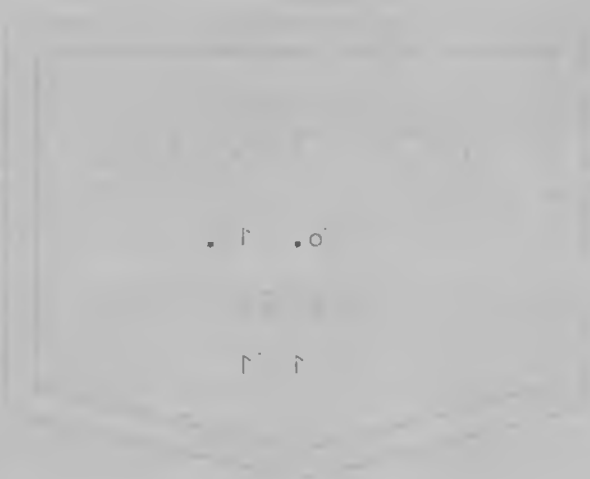

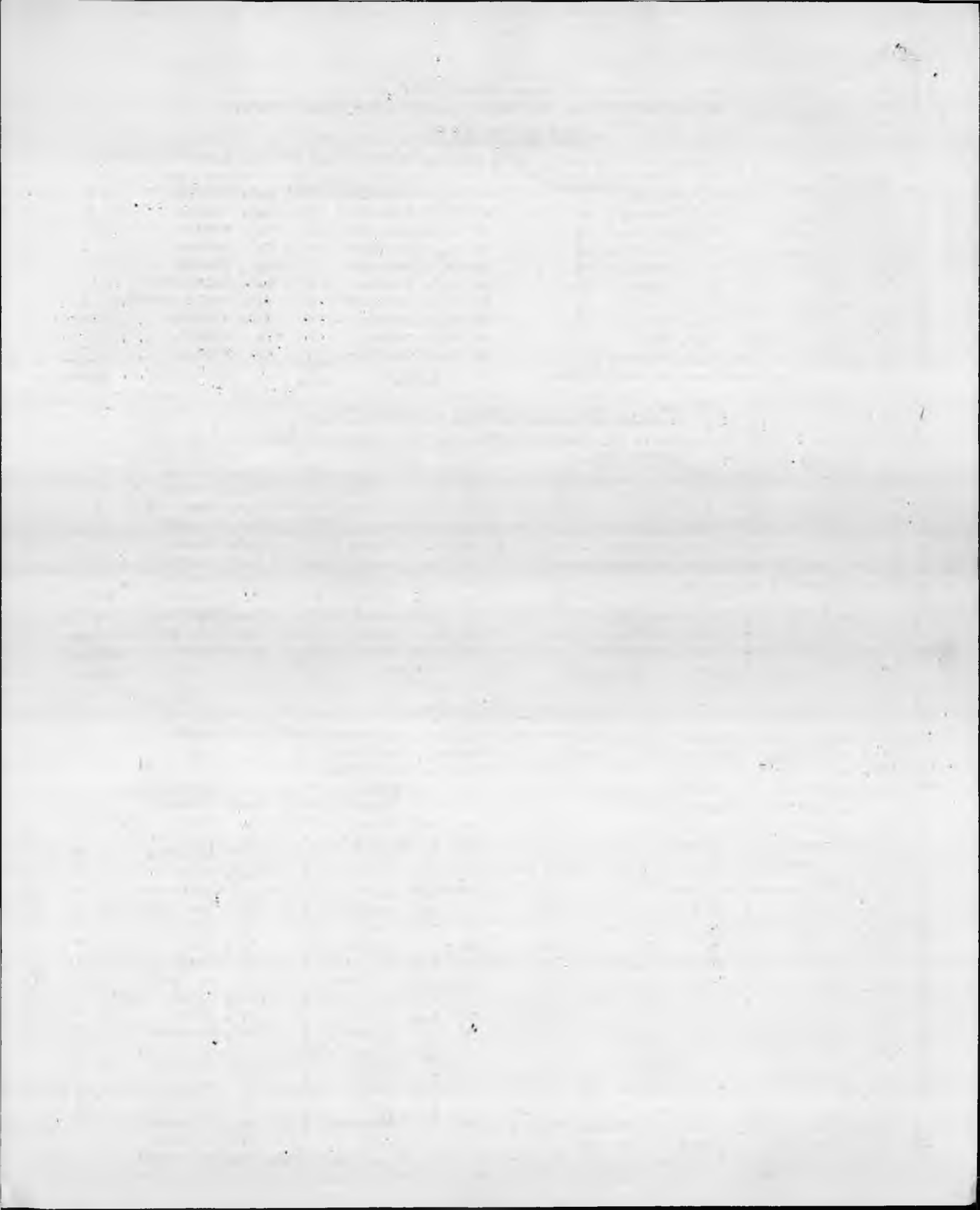

NEW COUNTY CHESS ASSOCIATION FORMED:-

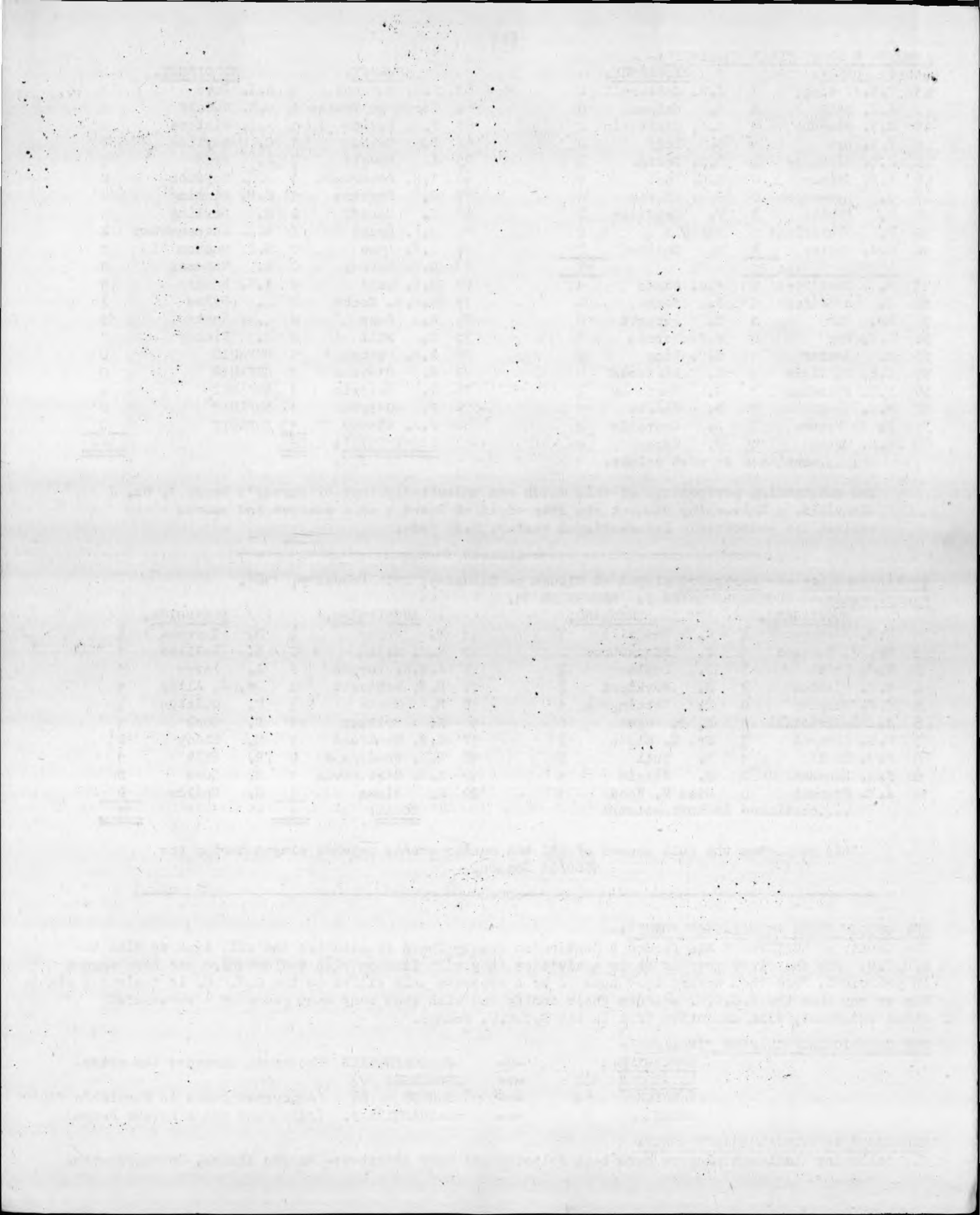

MIDDLESEX CHESS LEAGUE:

In the Eastern Zone where 10 Clubs took part METROPOLITAN were first with $8\frac{1}{2}$ points and 54 games to their credit, the runners up being ATHENAEUM 'A' TEAM with $7\frac{1}{2}$ points and $43\frac{1}{2}$ games to their credit. In the Western Zone the 7 Clubs concerned played each other twice the final result being:-
1st: CEDARS with $10\frac{1}{2}$ points to their credit and $71\frac{1}{2}$ games. The runners up in this zone were HARROW with $9\frac{1}{2}$ points and $63\frac{1}{2}$ games to their credit. These four teams now play off in a final pool and the result should be available for the May-June Bulletin, the last of the present season.

CEDARS CHESS CLUB SECRETARY informs us that the 9 Round Swiss Tournament run to decide the Cedars Club Championship has attracted 14 players and is now in its 5th Round with B. Hare leading $4\frac{1}{2}$ points D. Levens being second half a point behind. Their first board player, Mr. D.E. Rumens lost his 3rd Round game to B. Tysse. This club is one of the youngest chess clubs in the country and already making a mark for itself in British Chess Circles.

JUNIOR NEWS.

THE R.M. FLEMING TROPHY in the form of a magnificent chess board and set of chessmen will be used next season on the top board of county matches at Durning Hall pending the result of the 1961/62 junior county matches when it be used subsequently by the champion county only in the following year. Words cannot express the appreciation we have for Mr. R.M. Fleming for this fine gesture on his part for the work his father did for the S.C.C.U.

HERTFORDSHIRE JUNIOR NEWS:

The 9th Annual Boys' Chess Congress of the Hertfordshire Chess Association was held at Hatfield Technical College from April 4th to April 7th, 1961, under the guidance of the county junior organiser, Mr. K.L. Woodland assisted by Messrs. J.P. Flitcroft and M.S. Gould.

The Senior Tournament for the R. Lee-Johnson Cup and Junior Championship was headed by A.P. Logsdon with S.W. Dagger, G.E. Guy, D.N.L. Levy, R.J. Lighton & I.C. Parkinson as runners up, $1\frac{1}{2}$ points behind. As both Messrs A.P. Logsdon and S.W. Gagger are both ineligible on account of age to rank as holders the other four competitors will take part in a play-off for this honour and if the result is known by the time the last Bulletin is published in June it will be included in the last Junior News items of the season. 16 competitors in all took part in this senior competition.

THE JUNIOR UNDER-15 CHAMPIONSHIP was won by P. Dean of Rugby School, formerly an Alleyne's Boy at Stevenage. He thus becomes holder of the H. Guy Arnold Cup for 1961. 29 competitors took part in this competition P. Ridgway of Hertford Grammar School being runner up, one point behind the winner. THE UNDER-14 TOURNAMENT attracted 41 competitors and the result of a 9 Round Swiss was a tie with $7\frac{1}{2}$ points between J.W. O'Loughlen of Bushey Grammar School and A.H. Pittman of Apsley Grammar School, Hemel Hempstead. In the play-off Master J.W. O'Loughlen emerged the winner and Hertfordshire's Under 14 1961 Boy Champion. Following on his fine showing at the 1961 London Boys' Championship this result is not surprising.

THE NOVICES SECTION of 18 competitors was won by M.A. Bramer of Cheshunt Grammar School with $9\frac{1}{2}$ points.

THE HERTFORDSHIRE INTER-SCHOOLS TROPHY awarded to the affiliated school with the best aggregate score for any 6 players other than Novices was gained by Queen Elizabeth's School, Barnet, with $39\frac{1}{2}$ points. St. Alban's School and Welwyn G.C. Grammar School tied for second place with 32 points each. Altogether 24 Schools took part.

When it is noted that on top of these tournaments 10 sectional Lightning Tournaments were also squeezed into those four days it would appear that the controllers had turned a holiday period into a very hectic working one. Congratulations to all concerned and our appreciation for what Hertfordshire is doing for its Juniors. We would like to see them taking part in the Junior County Matches next season and in the S.C.C.U. Jamboree, and County Final. They would certainly give a splendid account of themselves.

In the March Bulletin I gave the result of the 1961 Under-18 INTER COUNTIES CHAMPIONSHIP FINAL and the detailed scores after adjudication. - (a) It is usual in this and similar positions to prepare for BK3 by this move or PKR3.
 (b) As a direct result of White's 8th move he must now retake so as to leave a pawn on Q5. In most commonly met positions like this, i.e. with the K and QB Pawns on the fourth rank it is to White's advantage to leave Q5 to be occupied by a piece. The correct placing of the KB is White's chief dilemma in this line of play. If it is not developed at once then the development of the King's Knight which usually comes to K2 is delayed as well as that of the Bishop. On the other hand, if the Bishop is developed at KN2 then it must play a minor role for a considerable time on account of the three pawns on the White squares ahead of it. Perhaps a better line is to play 6 BK2 instead of PB3 which also gives White attacking chances with his pawns on the King's side, e.g. PR3, PN4 and PB4 etc.
 (c) It is essential to parry the Queen side advance.
