Congratulations to R.C. Pentecost on becoming Individual Intermediate Champion and to his wife, Mrs. R.C. Pentecost on becoming the Kent Lady Champion.

SURREY: Inter-Club Competitions during the 1960/61 Season resulted as follows reports Mr. Henlen, the Surrey Hon. Secretary:

Alexander Cup: Guildford beat Streatham & Brixton in the final played at Ashted.
