It is with deep regret that I have to note the passing of Mr. E.G. Sergeant who passed on a few weeks before his 80th anniversary. He has been a stalwart to British Chess since the turn of the century and as these old veterans leave us it seems that we are a completely new chess generation. Luckily the new-comers are eager to fill the gaps and junior chess was never more flourishing than it is at the present though there is a need for volunteers to assist in the ever increasing organising work - the old hands are very much overburdened - what about it, some of you?

B.C.F. NEWS: The B.C.F. AUGUST CONGRESS FROM AUG. 13th to AUG. 25th 1962 HAS BEEN TRANSFERRED FROM BATH TO WHITBY, YORKSHIRE. There was some delay in the completion of the Assembly Rooms at Bath and it is understood that these will not be ready before October. Thus the 1962 Congress will be held at Whitby for which the Federation is deeply appreciative and the 1963 one at Bath. OXFORDSHIRE COUNTY NEWS: At the Morris Motors' Social Club, Cowley, on Saturday 11th November, 9 teams played a six board Jamboree in honour of Prof. Simpson's 85th birthday. Prof. Simpson is the secretary of the Oxford City Chess Club and still extremely active and energetic. He still cycles and referees Hockey matches. Indeed the City Chess Club's progress is in no small part due to his unabated enthusiasm. In the Jamboree Cowley came out first with 5½ points closely followed by Oxford City's 1st team who were second with 5 points.

CEDAR'S CHESS CLUB MIDDLESEX: News of the final result of the 1960/61 Championship is now to hand and of the 14 players who took part the championship went to B.H. Hare with 8 points (no loss). Equal 2nd were D.G. Levens & D.E. Rumens with 6½ points. In the new grading list no less than 16 of this club's members are included. D.E. Rumens was one of the seven players who drew with the World Champion, when he played 20 selected Southern County players at London University on Sunday Jan. 7th in his first simul. exhibition after his success at Hastings.

GRADING LIST 1961/62 The new grading list is now available and it is with pleasure we note the names of A.S. Hollis, Oxford University, N.A. Perkins, Finchley, & D.G. Springgay, Brighton who appear for the first time. We note the inclusion of the British Champion, J. Penrose among the International Masters Graded 1A for the third year running he has fully earned this recognition by F.I.D.E. C. Kottbauer is now a naturalised citizen and qualifies for the title of British Master. He too is bracketed with J. Penrose in the 1A Class.

NEWS FROM HAMPSHIRE: Since the last bulletin I have had two Hampshire news sheets and weekly cuttings from the local Portsmouth & Southampton chess columns from which I have culled the following brief items: On the 4th November at Taunton School, Southampton, Portsmouth Juniors met Southampton Juniors in a 30 board match and a week later Portsmouth Seniors met Southampton Seniors in a 30 board match at the Guildhall, Portsmouth. Portsmouth brought off a double by winning the former 17½-12½, and the latter 20-10. The Hampshire Chess Association now boasts 188 members of which 159 are registered seniors and juniors number 20 among these. The other 219 of which one is a junior are private members. Southampton Chess League semi-finalists due to meet in February are Southampton -v- Taunton School & Southampton University -v- either Bramtoco or B.R. Institute, Eastleigh. A friendly match against Dorset to give Hampshire juniors a chance to prove themselves and gain experience was played in November and the result over 32 boards was a narrow win for Dorset by 17½ to 14½. The Southampton Schools Chess League recently organised a Lightning Tournament at Taunton School in which 225 juniors took part. It was run in three sections, one for under-15, another for under-13 and another for children of primary school age. Boys rang bells 729 times during this match at 10 second intervals. In the monthly Bulletin Hampshire are giving pen-pictures of county celebrities in the chess world, the first concerned S.H.C. Lucas of Bournemouth, who will be 72 in November. He has been connected with chess in Hampshire for over 50 years the last 40 of which have seen him busy on the administrative side. The second was of H.L. Parsons who began teaching chess to his schoolmates when he was a boy. He now enjoys giving odds of Rook and move in simultaneous exhibitions to girls' schools in his neighbourhood and not without success either. These are the people who enjoy chess and chess players and do more for the game than all money-sponsored exhibition matches. May they long live to foster the social side of the 'Royal Game'. Thank you for your news, Hampshire!

The closing date for entries is FEBRUARY 5th, 1962 and entry forms are now obtainable from the Hon. Secretary, Mr. J. KENNEDY, 70 MEADWAY, BROMLEY, KENT. Through the increase in the postal printed paper rate and other administrative costs the entrance fee has been increased after 10 years from 5/- to 7/6 (none for juniors under-18) but this should not deter those who think what would have happened had there been no R.A.F. to win the "Battle of Britain". B.C.F. NEWS: THE BRITISH CHESS FEDERATION CONGRESS SCHEDULED FOR NEXT AUGUST AT BATH HAS BEEN TRANSFERRED TO WHITBY OWING TO THE NON-AVAILABILITY OF ACCOMMODATION BEING AVAILABLE FOR THE CONGRESS IN TIME. IT IS HOPED TO STAGE THE 1963 CONGRESS AT BATH - THE 1962 & 1963 VENUES BEING INTERCHANGED. WILL WOULD BE COMPETITORS PLEASE MAKE A SPECIAL NOTE OF THIS IMMEDIATELY!!

INDIVIDUAL TOURNAMENTS:- The experiment of playing all the county tournaments on an all-play-all basis in sections, with the Championship open by invitation proved to be highly successful last season, although play commenced much later than had been anticipated. The result is that all four tournaments have only recently been concluded. Next year all these tournaments are due to commence immediately after the Easter Congresses and will continue until the end of July. Entry forms for the 1962 Tournaments will be available in January and the Committee has fixed the 28th February as the closing date for the receipt for entries. All players who participated this year will receive entry forms individually in due course, whilst others will be circulated, together with a poster, to all affiliated Clubs early in the New Year to publicise these events. Entry forms will also be available to all those participating in the Essex and Surrey Adult & Junior Matches to be played during February. Invitations for the County Championship will be circulated in January.

As Mr. Redon has found it impracticable to continue in office as Tournament Secretary the Committee has appointed Mr. John F. Coleman to take over his duties. Our new official is well-known in Midland circles, having at one time been that Union's Treasurer and before that the Leicestershire Tournament Secretary where he organised their tournaments on similar lines. We can, therefore, look forward to a very successful season and an increased entry. Those who assisted Mr. Redon as conductors of the subsiderary tournaments will once again be helping in their control and Mr. Redon, himself, has also offered to help the new Tournament Secretary in a similar way, which will leave Mr. Coleman free to control the Championship.
