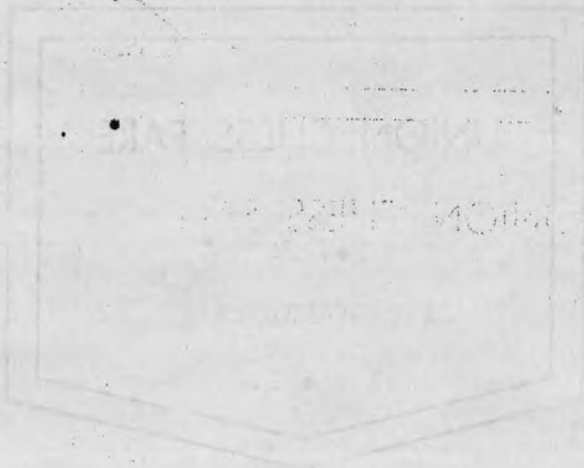

JUNIOR NEWS.

SURREY: Mr. T.S. Dunne will not be available at his usual address for the next month and he asks me to state that his telephone number during that period will be EWELL 5041. All communications should be addressed to him C/O Glynn Grammar School, Epsom, Surrey.

NORFOLK: Schools in this county should contact Mr. A.G. Barker of 87 Nelson Road, Central, Gt. Yarmouth. Chess Leagues within the county are run according to information received since the last bulletin by Messrs Allsop & Barber in Yarmouth district & Mr. Webb in the Dereham area. If these gentlemen will send me more details of these Leagues I shall be pleased to publish same in a future issue of Chess Fare. It is always a pleasure to read of what is being done for our junior players in the isolation areas where the work is hard and apparently unrewarding. Can I assume that to see they are noticed at high levels is one of the great joys to young folk & may be the best recruiting agent the organisers can have.

BERKSHIRE: Mr. E. Whipp, the Berkshire Junior Organiser has sent me a very interesting report of Berkshire Junior activities a brief summary of which is that since 1959 when only one junior competition was organised for the county's youngsters, there are now some 24 schools interested in the game including a team of girls from Kendrick School. The county has been divided into two zones for League purposes. Next season Mr. Whipp is hopeful of being able to raise a Berkshire Under-18 County Team. No-one will be more delighted than myself if this achievement comes true. And for a man who has his livelihood to get, who organises the Berkshire Senior Individual Championship, and who does the secretarial work for the county's premier chess club in Reading on top of his work as junior organiser may I assure him he has the sincerest wishes of the S.C.C.U. Executive for a well-deserved success. With 19 Teams in a Knock-out County competition, 17 entrants in a Junior Individual Championship, 8 teams in an Under-19 League, and this season 5 teams in an under-15 League he has far more than he can do full justice to; again the cry of a plentiful harvest and few labourers to gather it comes to the fore. Can I plead on Mr. Whipp's behalf to ALL COUNTY SENIOR ENTHUSIASTS? Spare an hour or so each week to do something in the shape of real work for your junior players and their organisers. And to Mr. Whipp on behalf of us all: a sincere thanks for an illuminating report on what is happening in another of our isolation areas. It is very gratifying to know that, unheard & unsung, work for our junior contingent is being conscientiously done by a few, alas far too few, who have their welfare at the centre of their hearts.

KENT: On Saturday January 20th N.W. Kent played the Rest during the afternoon and evening, in the Mill House, Acacia Hall, Dartford. This house, the remnant of the Hall built in 1740 and since replaced by a more modern structure was used by the Kent Juniors in the Dartford district for staging events too big to be accommodated in existing club premises. Unfortunately two days after this event took place it was found abalaze and was burnt out. Thus it is a pleasure to record that the last session it was in use saw the debut of Michael Lambshire, the Kent present top-board under-18 player, in Simultaneous play. He took on 14 Kent Teeners, won 9, drew 1, and lost 4. D. Hamilton also played 13 juniors simultaneously winning 9, drawing 2 and losing 2. With Weigspiel going on at the same time as a side line this last-time Old Mill function will be remembered in Dartford Junior circles for a long time to come. Miss Anness, the Kent Junior Organiser sends me the names of the 8 Area winners in the Senior Kent Schools' Chess League Tournament and the 15 area winners in the Junior Tournament. The competition is a knock-out affair and the area winners are now competing for the cup in each section that is awarded annually to the successful finalist. Since the area stretches from Folkestone to the Thames one can see the vast amount of work put in by the organisers repaid by the infectious enthusiasm of the young Kent players. The names of the cupwinners will certainly be announced in Junior News later in the season.

ESSEX JUNIOR NEWS: On February 10th at Durning Hall four schools - Bancrofts, Brentwood, Sir Geo. Monoux & Brentwood each entered 10 boards in an Inter-School Jamboree. The result was:

1. Sir Geo. Monoux 8½; 2. Brentwood 5; 3. Bancrofts 4; 4th Stratford 2½. Mr. S. Golding controlled the event and everyone was quite sure that on the day the best school had emerged winner.

OXFORDSHIRE: Mr. F. Wood, the Oxfordshire Junior Organiser send me the following interesting news of his county's junior activities. He reports:-

62 entrants played in the Christmas Congress for the Oxfordshire Junior Chess Championship that lasted three days & included representatives of schools at Abingdon, Chipping Norton, Banbury, Bicester, Thame, Wallingford, Witney & Oxford. It took place in the Oriel College lecture rooms and was run on a six round Swiss. The winner was L. Harrison who becomes county junior champion with 5½ points out of 6. He is a pupil of Southfield School, Oxford. No less than 6 boys tied for 2nd place but not one could overtake the small lead held by 14 year old Harrison.

The winner of the Under-15 Tournament was a Berkshire boy from Wallingford Grammar School, R. Lee who obtained 5½ points from his 6 games; with 4½ points were T. Walker of Cheney School, & M. Crombie of Magdalen School who tied for 2nd place. It was disappointing to Mr. Wood and his capable assistant, Mr. R.E. Jones to have to report that there were no girl entrants this year, but the keenness of the boys who braved the winter storms over such distances to be there on time shows the appreciation for the hard work put in by Mr. Wood and his fellow helpers. Congratulations, Oxfordshire!

HAMPSHIRE: The Southampton Christmas Congress drew 149 Junior boys and girls as entrants to their three day chess event divided into five sections, an open section, an under-16 section, an under-14 section, an under-12 section and a primary section. At the end of the three days only three sections were decided - the Primary section won by J. Thew of Charlton School, the leading school of 8 in the Primary Division of the Southampton Schools Chess League; M. Patience of Regent's Park (B) School headed the Under-12 Section with a clean score of 6 points, and L. Allen, also of Regent's Park (B) headed the Under-14 section with 5½ points from his 6 games. When the adjourned games in the Under-16 and Open Sections were eventually finished J. Patience emerged the winner with 5 points with seven other competitors only ½ point behind him. The open section was eventually won by M. Ford of King Edward VI School who won his adjourned game with the runner up D. Kahn of St. Mary's College. In the Hampshire-Sussex Zone of the Sunday Times Tournament the finalists are King Edward VI & Hove Grammar School who last year lost in the National Final in London. The result of this match will be awaited with great interest. (Again, Hampshire, many thanks for your news items and I hope there will be plenty more next month - Editor)

HERTFORDSHIRE: Mr. K. Woodland reports that the 6th Annual Primary Schools Congress held last month drew 56 entrants and after the completion of a ten round tournament four boys - Masters P. Hughes, of Brookman's Park, G. King of Osidge, M. Cooke of St. Andrews & R. Jenkins of Church Hill school - all tied with 8 points. An extra round was played by these boys and the result was a win for P. Hughes. Special prizes were awarded to the youngest competitor, R. Kingston, aged 8, and to the girl competitor, Miss S. White. A game recording prize was won by M. Cooke of St. Andrews and five competitors were successful in receiving prizes for correctly solving the 'Chess Quiz'. Mr. Woodland also reports that three inter-school tournaments are under way this season in Hertfordshire - 12 schools competing in the Under-14½ including 5 secondary moderns, 8 in the Under-16 & 7 in the Open. He feels keen disappointment that senior support from the grammar schools has fallen off, a great pity indeed, but much here depends on an interested master being available - alas, too few school masters by far show real enthusiasm for Chess in our schools and we are very thankful indeed when one of these is spotted. The Sunday Times has played no little part in unearthing these hitherto unknowns, so the outlook is still bright for the future of the game in our higher centres of education. Naturally, too, Mr. Woodland is delighted that after appeals had been made in the 1960/61 Correspondence Under-18 Championship & rejected and then further analysis sent that meant a revision of the appeal Hertfordshire found themselves tied at the top of the table with Nottinghamshire & Yorkshire, all having gained 8 points. Middlesex with 7½ points were 4th. Essex & Buckinghamshire were 7th with 6 points, Oxfordshire 10th with 4½ & Sussex 12th with 3 points.

What a pity this full table of Junior Correspondence Chess activities is omitted from the Year Book! Congratulations Mr. Woodland on putting up so courageous a fight on behalf of your county's junior players and so successfully too! Well done Hertfordshire Juniors!

MIDDLESEX: On Saturday 3rd February the International master went to Hayes and at Minet School, Coldharbour Lane he gave a lecture in the afternoon that soon captured the attention of his young audience as well as the parents who had turned up to give a hand with the tea arrangements. After tea Mr. Wade took on 24 of the strongest boys and girls in the Hayes Harlington area and after three hours gruelling battle Mr. Wade chalked up 18 wins, 3 draws and three losses. The drawn games went to well over 80 moves and the win of Richard Collins brought forth the remark from the master: "He attacked me from the word go and just left me absolutely no chances for counter-play". Local Chess Clubs supported the event including Nestle's Club which gave each competitor a pencil with which to record his game. Hayes & Harlington are indeed a very live chess-minded community where the juniors are concerned. The other two winners were F. Smith & N. Kirkpatrick of Bishopshalt School.

BUCKINGHAM JUNIOR NEWS: Mr. E.T.
