



JUNIOR NEWS.


HERTFORDSHIRE: Too late for the May Bulletin was the comprehensive report sent by Mr, K. Woodland of Hertford's Easter Junior Congress, the tenth that has been won. 148 Competitors from 23 Hertfordshire schools took part the 1962 Under-18 Boy Champion being D.L. Levy of East Barnet Grammar School who gained 100% score in the Championship event for the R. Lee-Johnson Cup.

The winrer of the Under-15 H. Guy Arnold Cup Competition was A.A. Nix of Cheshunt Gr. Sch. with 6% points out of 8.

For the J.P. Flitcroft Cup competition there was triple tie between M. Bramer, Cheshunt Gr. Sch., and C.D. Stanley & J.W. Whiting both of Queen Elizabeth's School, Barnet. This is an Under-14 competition and these three boys gained 7 points out of 9.

The Novices Tournament was won by B.S. Weston of Queen Elizabeth's School, Barner with 11 points out of 12.

The Inter-School Trophy fought for annually by Hertfordshire Schools was won by Queen Elizabeth's School, Barnet with a 30.7 score. A very close second with 29.8 was Cheshunt Grammar School. Many thanks, Mr. Woodland, for your efforts to put Hertfordshire Juniors very much on the 'Chess Map'!

Each country sends six competitors and one reserve and in England the four Unions send either two or one representative to make up this quota. P.N. Lee of Chelsea and A. Whiteley of Oxford represented the S.C.C.U. on the team playing at boards 1 & 2 respectively. Both scored 100% wins in the tournament and further on will be found the two games they played against Scotland, games worthy of any company.

The following is a bald result of the contest but does not do the least justice to the welcome afforded by our Welsh hosts to one and all. The mayor of Brecon, Councillor E.R. Morgan and Councillor D. NOTES BY THE WINNER OF ABOVE GAME.

(a) 9 00 is possibly superior to the originally played 000 as White's King is safer on the King side whilst his attacking chances in the centre remain.


(b) If 9....PN4 then 10 BQ5!, PxB; 11 NB6, QN3; 12 PxP with a fierce attack.

(c) Alternatively 10...PKN4; 11 BKN3, NR4; 12 BxKP!, PxB; 13 NxP as in Tal-Petrosian in the 1959 Candidates' Tournament, which game was drawn.

(d) 11...NK4 begins the plan evolved by Larsen in the game Tal-Larsen, Portorozh 1958 to gain control of K4 and prevent PK5.

- (e) 12 BK2 as in Olafsson-Evans, Buenos Aires 1960 scems superior to 12 BQN3 as in Tal-Larsen since room is left for the advance of the Queen side pawns against Black's eventual Queen side castling.
- (f) 14....QB2 is played in order to castle Queen side. If 14....Q00 then 15 NQ5 with advantage to White.
- (g) At this stage with, unusually for a Sicilian, White attacking on the Queen side and Black on the King side, White had less than 20 minutes to go to move 48 the time control. Black had only 5 minutes in which to make the next 24 moves. Both also knew that the whole match hinged on this game.
- (h) At this point Black picked up his Rook intending to play it to Knight One and then saw that White could play QQ8eh mating in two, so he hastily defended by RB1 thus losing a further pawn.
- (i) With 10 seconds to go Black leaves a mate in one on although the two extra pawns on the King's side should deride eventually.
 - . (Later on in this Bulletin you will find another game between those two opponents played at Whitby in the Under-18 British Boys Championship but with colours reversed.

 Lee was destined to win this title but he didn't know it when the above game was played in Wales three weeks earlier)



While Peter Lee was having his Board 1 battle with MCALPINE, the Oxford Champion was engaged with the Scottish Boy Champion, A.M. Davie of Dundee, on Board 2. This also was a Sicilian Defence with the Oxford boy playing the defence.
