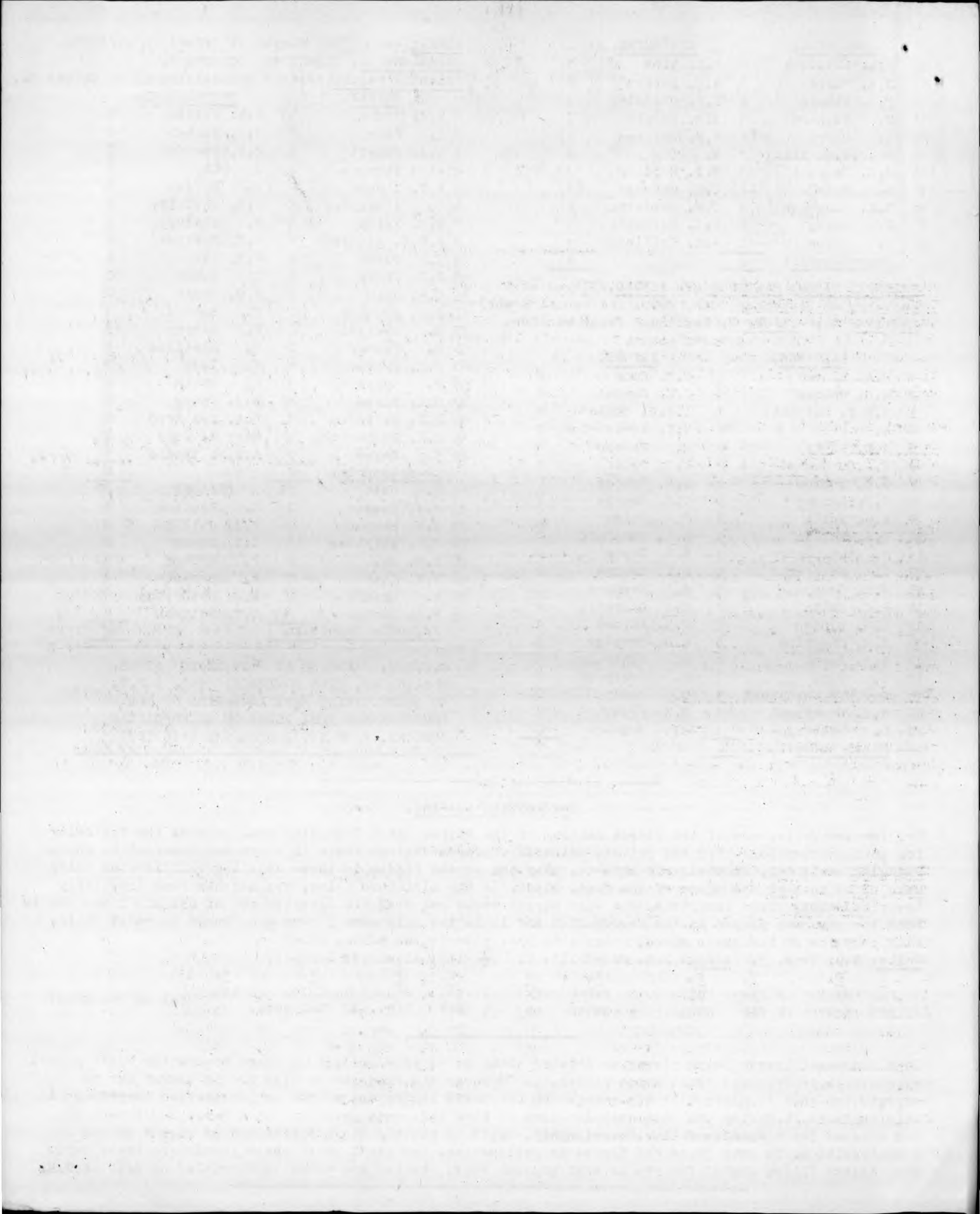
INTERESTING BY-PLAY.
