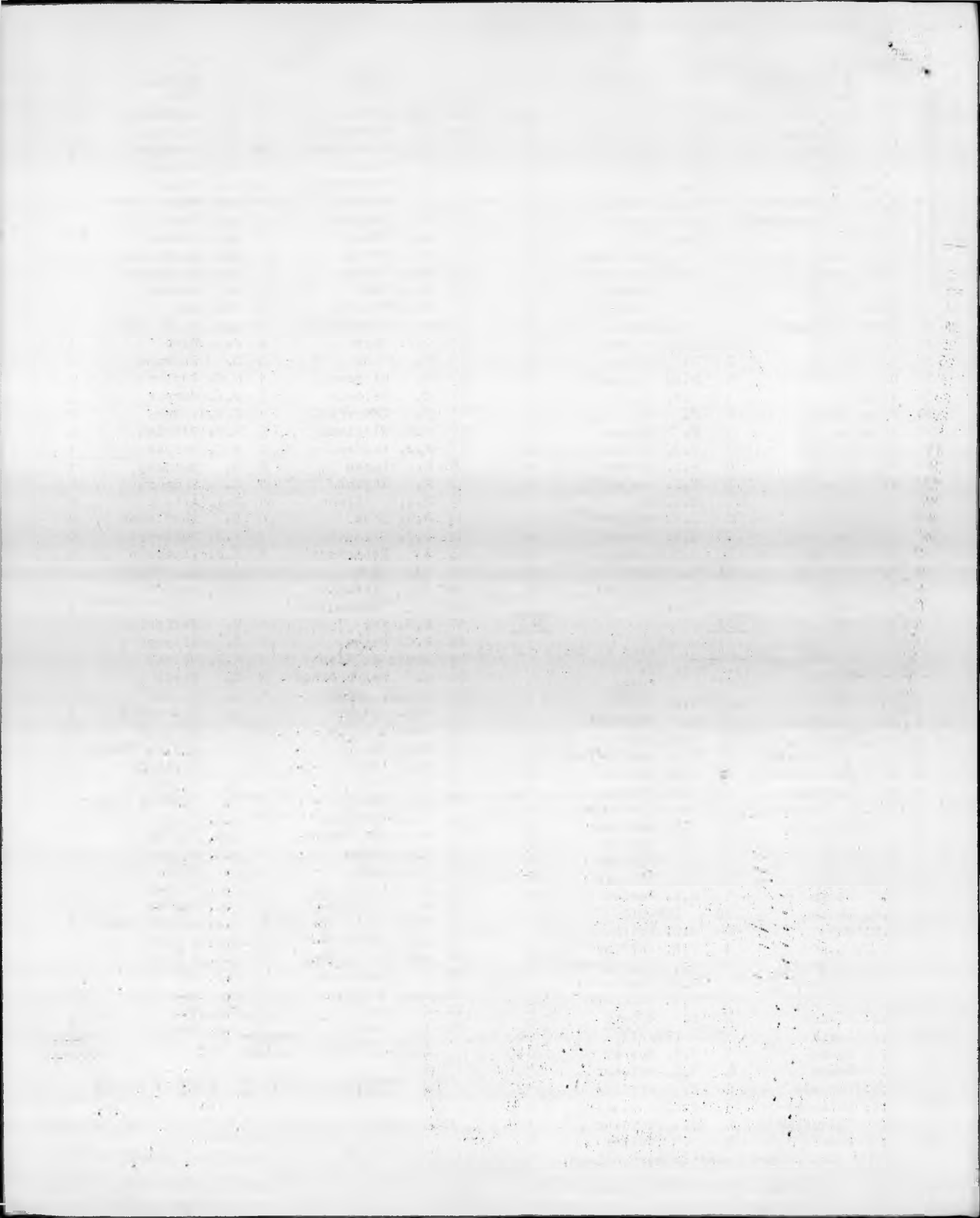

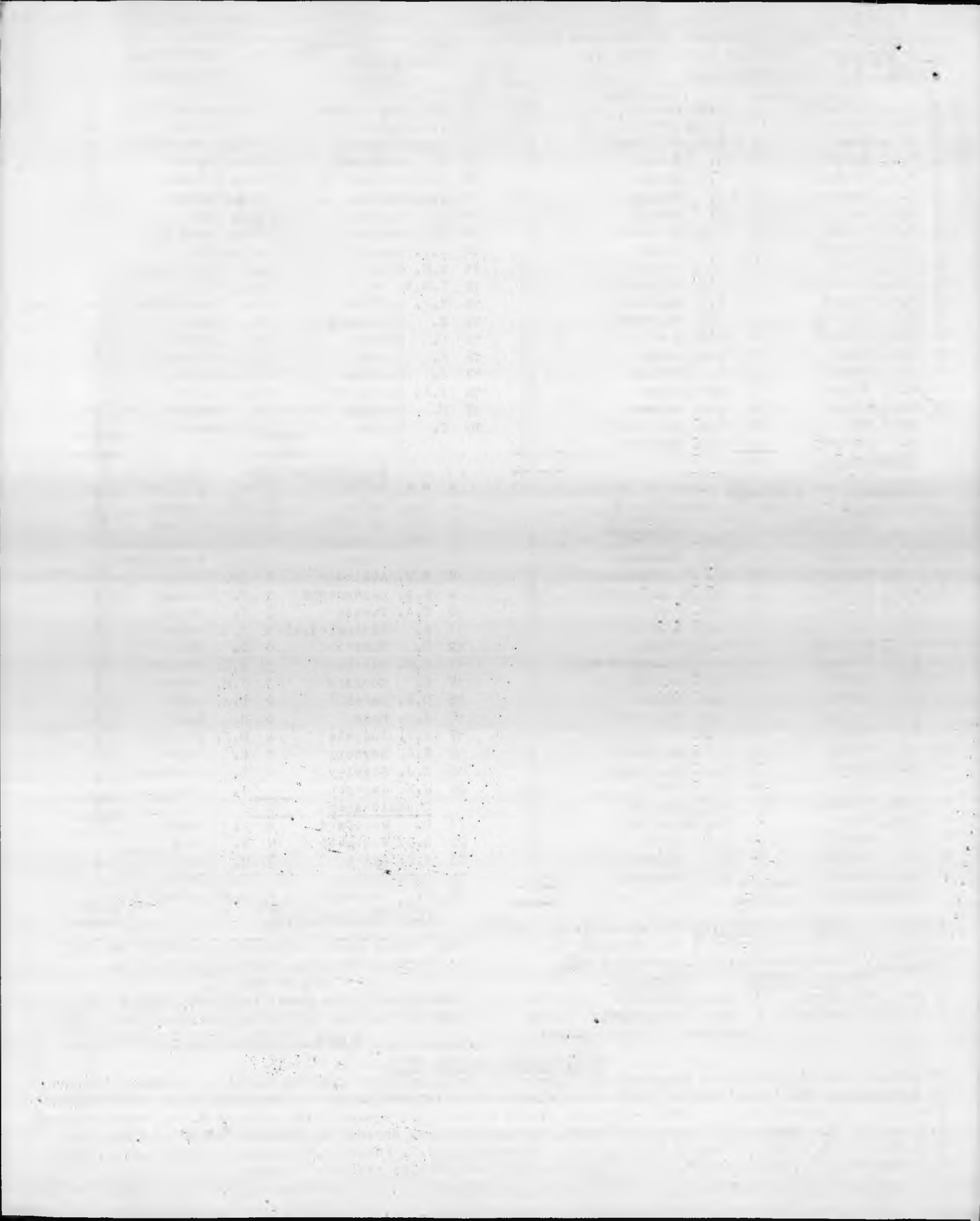

Under-14 Section: T.C. Fox of Kingston Surrey with 9 points out of 11 without loss holds the 'Chess Education Society' Challenge Cup as London's Under-14 Junior Champion for 1963. The following 7 competitors tied for second place with 7½ points: A. Abukuks Thornton Heath, T. Balwin, Streatham, J. Enticknap of Highbury, N.1., T. Hart of Streatham, A. Hayward of Clapham, L.A.G. Jones of Lee, & P. Rosman of Pinner, Middlesex. The latter won the special prize for the highest score made by an Under-12 competitor. The 'Best Game Award' was given to J.G. Enticknap for his Round 11 game against T. Baldwin.

Under-16 Section: W.R. Hartston of Enfield Middlesex with 9 points out of 11 without loss holds the 'Sir G.A. Thomas' Challenge Cup as London's Under-16 Junior Champion for 1963. He was closely followed by R.D. Keene of Clapham Common & J.N. Sugden of Beckenham, Kent both with 8½ points the latter having no loss. Sitting 4th was Daniel Wright of Stamford Hill with 8 points and 5th were R.B.E. Bryant of Woking & N.J. Patterson of Wimbledon, each with 7½ points.

The 'Best Game Award' in this section went to R.L. Keene for his Round 11 win against C.B. Edwards. **Under-18 Section:** Michael V. Lambshire of Forest Hill, S.E.23 became the 1963 London Junior Champion with 9 points out of 11 and no loss. He holds the 'R.C. Basman of Claygate, Surrey with 8 points and no loss close followed by the following 4th places jointly held by D.N.L. Levy, Finchley, J.R. Mitchell, Finchley, D. Parr of Sutton, & D.C. Rowe of Hackney, E9, and C. Waites of Harold Wood, Essex.

The 'Du Mont' special prize was awarded to P.J. Adams of Hayes for his 6th Round win against D.E. Brown, and the second 'Best Game' award went to M.J. Lambshire for his Round 10 game against J.R. Mitchell.

Following the prize giving Mr. M.J. Franklin gave a simultaneous exhibition against 6 prize winners and 6 other players winning 6, drawing 4 and losing 2 to J. Enticknap and R.W. O'Brien. The proceeding was completed by candle light owing to an electrical cut at 5 p.m.

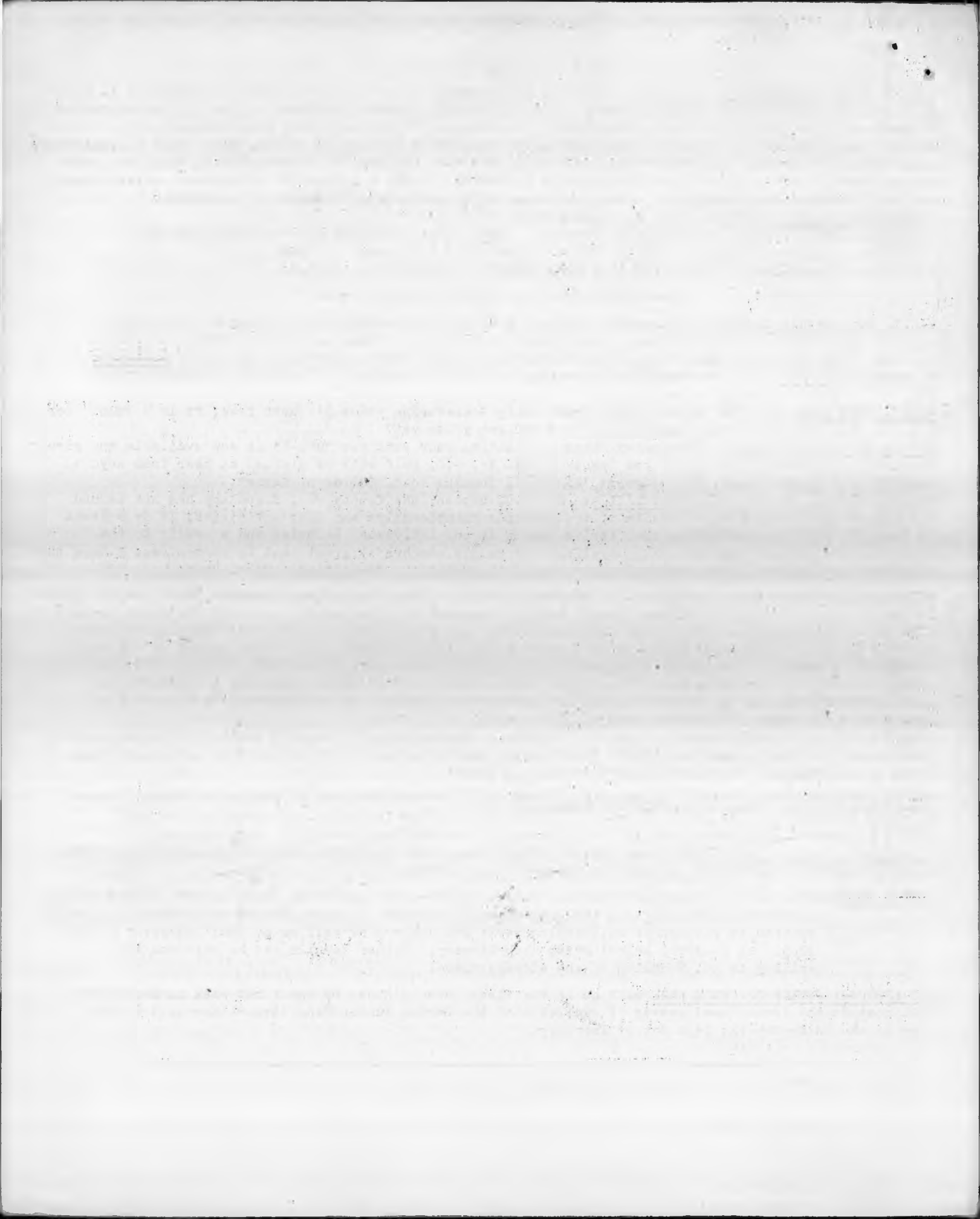
