GENERAL NEWS.

S.C.C.U. EQUIPMENT FUND: You will remember that I reported in the January number that permission had been given Messrs. Keeble and Weaver to start a fund for the purchase of equipment. I now am informed that £46:16:0 has been raised through collections made at John Lewis when matches have been in progress £10:3:0; Through County subscriptions £4:1:0; through individual donations £11:2:0; through the Easter Richmond Congress & the Whitsun Ilford Congress £1:10:0; and through the John Lewis Reserve Fund £10. Mr. Koeble informs me that £38:19:0 of this has been spent in obtaining 10 new Chess Clocks leaving a balance to date of £7:17:0. The S.C.C.U. wishes through this column to say how much they appreciate what has been done through this fund and thank sincerely all those who have contributed towards it enabling new equipment to be purchased that will ease the job considerably of those who have the easy running of county matches so much at heart. It will of course be open for further contributions during the 1963/64 season enabling those who have not been able so far to help it along to do so as they feel moved. KENT NEWS: The A.G.M. of the Kent County Association took place at Canterbury towards the end of May. It was reported that 67 year old Mr. Edward Mason had after many years again emerged as winner of the Kent Championship beating Mr. J.F.S Rumble at Sevenoaks in the Final. This is a knock-out competition and it must have given the winner great satisfaction when so many young players are after the scalps of the old-stagers.

The Intermediate Championship was won by Mr. R.A. Holmes, the Minor Championship by Mr. M.B. Flannery, the Ladies Championship by Miss S. Armitage, and the Under-18 Championship by Michael Lambshire. Miss Anness reports that 67 schools making up 98 teams have entered for the forthcoming season's Junior Championship. Chess for all ages is very flourishing indeed in Kent.
