EDITORIAL.

As promised in the Summer issue which was in your hands last month - August - this number contains all the details of the Senior County Matches not yet reported, with news and results of events that have come to hand since July. As it is better to have news, stencils out and duplication done in one area I have decided in consultation with the S.C.C.U. Secretary to hand over the Editorship to a successor who is more closely at hand with Senior Officials. This will give me the extra time that I need to concentrate on Junior events for the present and last season. I feel that this part of S.C.C.U. policy can now be done much more efficiently by a man younger in years and leave me to deal with the chess side of the Junior problem rather than the administrative one. I have thoroughly enjoyed the experience as S.C.C.U. Junior Organiser & the co-operation between myself and the Junior Organisers has been all that one could desire, and I feel sure that the same co-operation will be extended to my successor in the 1964-65 season. A change after a number of years in personnel is always justified and brings new ideas into what otherwise would become a mere routine. I think the time has come for such a change to be made.

Please notice the name of Mr. Henlen as President still appearing above. This is the last time it will appear in that office but I did not change it as the results and general news of the present bulletin belong essentially to February & March when he was very much the S.C.C.U. President and did much valuable work in that office. His successor, elected at the Annual General Council Meeting in July to preside over the Union's affairs is MR. L.A.J. Glyde, President of the London League and an indefatigable worker for Chess in Essex and the Southern County Congresses. We welcome him to his new office and have no fear that the S.C.C.U. will be in good hands under his leadership.

I would like to close by thanking you all for your good wishes that I have received from many Bulletin subscribers and trust that you will have many years of enjoyment with 'Chess Fare' in the future.

NEWS ITEMS.

INTER-UNION MATCHES:- Mr. J.T. Pascoe, Essex Match Captain (Tel. Val 7394) has undertaken the job of Match Captain for the S.C.C.U. in the 1963-64 Inter-Union matches. He says that anyone wishing to be considered for the S.C.C.U. team should contact him either by phone or in writing to 98, Wanstead Park Rd., Ilford Essex.

BATTLE OF BRITAIN: The four finalists in this year's competition are W.G.L. Adaway of Eltham Park, who as winner of Zone A beat the winner of Zone E, D. Parr of Sutton who was winner of Zone F, H.M. Evans of Farnborough, Hants, who beat the winner of Zone G & R.A. Fertoszegi of Chiswick who beat the winner of Zone D. Mr. P.M. Shaw informs me that the finals have not yet taken place so the placing of these four players is not yet to hand.

SUNDAY TIMES 1963-64 ENTRY: Mr. A.F. Stammwitz, the Chief Controller informs me that 600 School Teams divided into 20 Zones have entered for the next Sunday Times School Knock Out Championship. Included among them are 28 or so Girls' schools compared with but a dozen last year. With more than the usual number of zones required to deal with this entry Mr. Stammwitz is anxious to have the services of more Zonal Controllers and anyone willing to serve in this capacity is asked to contact him at 5 Clifford Rd. Hounslow West, Middlesex (HOU 3000).

MIDDLESEX:- In the Middlesex League this year there are 9 teams in the Eastern Zone: Cass, Centymca, Edgware, Hendon, Islington, Maurice, Metropolitan, St. Pancras & Willesden. In the Western Zone there are nine: Eastcote, E.M.I., G.E.C. Research, Greenford, Harrow 'A', Harrow 'B' Hayes & Harlington, Hillingdon & South Ruislip. Up to the time of going to press there is no sign of Cedars wishing to enter but I understand that the entry is open up to the end of September.

Hayes & Harlington Chess Club had a very successful evening on Friday, September 6th when the International Master, Mr. L. Barden met 25 of the Club Members in a simultaneous exhibition. He told the assembly that it was one of the hardest contests he had played and with 6 wins & 6 draws to the Hayes Club members they had every right to be pleased with themselves. Needless to say three of the wins by the Club were registered by Juniors, and one by a lady, Mrs. F. MacAusland. The other two were gained by Mr. F.N. Stephenson on Board 1 & Mr. R. Vaughan on Board 6.

The Hayes Club has decided to invite E.M.I., Ealing & Harrow Clubs to take part in a 12 Board Jamboree on the Tuesday of Chess Week, October 29th.

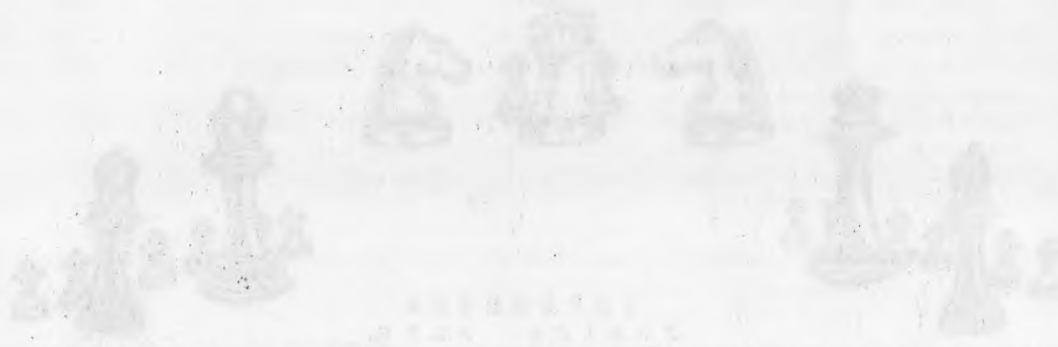
