EDITORIAL

Apologies for the lateness of this number! I decided to leave it in order to insert the results of the Southern Counties Championships, played at the Bognor Regis International Congress just after Easter, but I have not yet received the full details. However, I am able to give some. After Easter, I had the opportunity of touring the Lake District and seeing a bit more of Scotland and Northumberland and Durham, before spending a few more days in Cheshire. Whilst the holiday did my wife and I a power of good, I arrived home to face some fifty letters concerning Surrey's activities, and all these things have caused a delay in the preparation of this bulletin. Even now, full details of the final positions of the Counties in the two Sections are not available, and a further edition will be issued before the July Council Meeting.

Congratulations to Surrey for winning the Southern Section of the Championship. A near thing, since Oxford were level on points from matches, but had a slightly inferior games score. Middlesex won the Northern Section, and meet Surrey in the final for the Championship over 20 boards, the final of the Amboyna Shield over 50 boards and the final of the Ebony Shield over at least 80 boards at John Lewis Partnership, Oxford Street, on 2nd May. I gather that soccer enthusiasts will be able to "look in" at the F A Cup Final between moves!

In the Quarter final match between Surrey and Lancashire played on the 18th April at Birmingham, the northerns were victorious by 11 points to eight, with one game undecided. I have not heard how Middlesex fared in their quarter final.
