EDITORIAL

The final number for the 1963/64 season. If results alone counted, some counties may feel dis-appointed and others elated, but so long as the matches are all played in the friendliest of spirits between us all, we need not really worry about the scores. The final of the Championship produced a very close struggle between Surrey and Middlesex, who were not only fighting for the Championship of the Southern Counties over twenty boards, but for the Amboyna Shield over fifty boards and the Ebony Shield over eighty. There were no agreed draws under thirty moves! Most games were fought out to the full length of time. As will be seen from the full results given later, Surrey won the Championship by the closest of margins - $10\frac{1}{2}$ to $9\frac{1}{2}$, and also the Amboyna Shield by the odd point - $25\frac{1}{2}$ to $24\frac{1}{2}$. The Ebony Shield went to Middlesex by $41\frac{1}{2}$ to $38\frac{1}{2}$. A really close match !

The Montague Jones Cup goes to Sussex who beat Hertfordshire by $13\frac{1}{2}$ to $6\frac{1}{2}$, whilst the Stevenson Trophy went to Hampshire, whose opponents, Cambridgeshire, were unable to raise a side. A pity! Congratulations to all winners, their match captains and players!

Congratulations too, to J Pascoe, the SCCU match captain for producing a team of fifty against the MCCU at Oxford on 9th May, and winning by 28 to 22. This means we play the West of England CCU at the end of May 1965 for the right to meet the Northern CCU for the Union Championship. And the best of luck to Jack Pascoe - a very worthy skipper!

Finally I would like to thank those who have sent me news to publish. Not all Counties do, but maybe there will be improvement next season. I hope so!

The matches will take place in St. Joseph's

Joseph's College, Beulah Hill, S B 19 from Monday to Thursday, 27th to 30th July, with FIVE four hour rounds, starting at 9 a.m. on Monday, Wednesday and Thursday, and at 6.15 p.m. on Monday and Tuesday. Visitors will be very welcome. France and the Netherlands are sending teams for the first time against the Juniors of the four Home Countries. Some intense struggles are in prospect for the lads who already have many scalps among the Seniors:

The Irish team, at least, will arrive early on Sunday morning, and we should be pleased to have offers to entertain two or more of them, until 4.00 p.m. or so, when we begin to assemble at St. Joseph's. Four or more offers of cars to transport players from London termini to Beulah Hill, between 4 p.m. and 7 p.m. on Sunday, and back on Thursday evening, would ease the load on the Organisers considerably. The offer of a dormobile or minicoach, and/or driver, for any part of Sunday, Monday afternoon, Wednesday afternoon and Thursday afternoon and evening would be of inestimable value. If you cannot help with the transport, donations would be very welcome at the same address, and will be acknowledged individually and with gratitude. P H Clarke and N Littlewood finished equal second. A Feature of the Congress was the B C F Selection Tournament to fill two vacancies in the Olympiad team for Tel-Aviv later in the year. This was the first half of an all play all twice competition between M J Franklin, H Golombek, O M Hindle, M J Haygarth and L W Barden.
