Congratulations to Middlesex who have this season won the Southern Counties Championship (over twenty boards), the Amboyna Shield (over fifty boards) and the Ebony Shield (over eighty boards), thus becoming worthy Champions of the fourteen counties competing. In addition, their junior team won the Under 18 SCCU Jamboree and the Inter-Counties Under 18 title as well. They still have a good chance of winning the Counties Championship. If they do, it will be in no small measure due to the efforts of their Match Captain, Miss Eileen It is a great pity that she is resigning at the end of the John Coleman, the Honorary Secretary of this county is also season. resigning, and in his place steps N A Perkins of 167 Nether Street, London, N 12 (Tel: HILlside 1760). Other changes in County Secretaries, include the appointment of A M B Gilder of 34 Hillcrest Road, Hornchurch, Essex as Honorary Secretary for that County. Mr. B A Fewell, Honorary Secretary of Hertfordshire has recently moved to 22 Monks Rise, Welwyn Saddest of all is the resignation of George Self from Garden City. the Sussex County Chess Association. A serious illness over the past few months has led to this great loss to Sussex Chess. For many years, George Self has been Honorary Secretary and Match Captain and general factorum for his county, and has served them very well indeed. We all wish him a speedy return to good health, and hope to see him at the Sussex matches. Maybe he will now be able to play! We hope so.

Changes are being made in the arrangements for the SCCU Championship and the Under 18 Championship. The former will no longer be included in the Bognor Regis International Congress as a subsidiary of the Stevenson Memorial Tournament. It has been felt for some time by the Council of the Union, that our method of selecting our Champion should be more in keeping with other Union's activities. For 1966, the experiment is being made of each of the fourteen counties nominating their county champion (and in a few cases another candidate) for a competition which will begin with three sections of six players meeting in an all play all competition, and the top two will go forward to the final of six players to meet each other at the Southend on Sea Easter Congress. R L Owen of Buckinghamshire will control the competition, and all county secretaries will shortly receive full details of how the competition will be organised, and asking for nominations of players to take part. The break from the past arrangements is regretted, and the Council has expressed to Mr. J N Fishlock-Lomax its great appreciation of the enormous amount of work he has done in the past for the SCCU and the Chess world in general. It is certain that the changes being made will in no way upset the enthusiastic entries from many SCCU players to the Congress next Easter. G W Henlen.

WINNERS

Middlesex won the SCCU Championship, beating Surrey in the final by 13 to 6 (with one game for adjudication), and also beat Surrey in the final of the Amboyna Shield by 29 to 20 (with the same game for adjudication), and, as shown above, the Ebony Shield.

The final of the Montague Jones Trophy has not yet been decided, the present score is: Sussex 9 v Hertfordshire 8. I have not heard the result of the Stevenson Trophy between

Oxfordshire and Cambridgeshire.

Middlesex Juniors also won the SCCU Championship and the County Championship. Thus Middlesex are very worthy Champions of the Union. In the County Championship, the Senior team is meeting Cheshire on the 12th July, having beaten Leicester in the quarter-final. Surrey also won their quarter-final match against Yorkshire, and meet Gloucestershire in the semi-final on the 12th July. Our two representatives may well meet in the final.

County Championship Quarter finals

EASTER CONGRESSES

Folkestone. There were sixty six entries, divided into eleven sections of six each, in this new event, which took place in the Guildhall. The Secretary of the Congress, Mr. L Spain, the Controller, Mr. W R Briscall and the Kent County Chess Association are to be congratulated on the success of this event, which, it is hoped, will become an annual The Major competition ended in a tie between P B Cook, R G W event. Elwell and Gerard Gorse (from France) with three points each. The Thames Valley Chess League held their eleventh annual Congress in the Richmond Community Centre. In the Premier event, J G Brogden and R D Keene tied for first place with four points.

Southend on Sea. A record entry of 105 took part in seventeen events. The Premier event attracted a strong entry, and a triple tie between P H Clarke, J B Howson and R G Wade, with three points each. W R Hartston was fourth with  $2\frac{1}{2}$ , followed by M J Basman (2) and N Littlewood( $1\frac{1}{2}$ ). The Major events also included a galaxy of talent. In the "A" Section, R Cosulich, the Middlesex County player, and A W Whitbread, a Surrey Junior scored four points each to tie at the top, above P L Roe, who plays top board for Bedford, and W A Winser of Sussex, who tied equal third with three points each. In the Major "B" section, D Hustler, K H Oliff and D Wright had a triple tie with three points éach, with Miss Eileen Tranmer, four times British Lady Champion, and Match Captain of Middlesex fourth with 22 points, followed by P R Hindley (2) and E B Bowyer, a local player sixth with 12 points. Only A C Finney of Stoke on Trent, playing in the Major "H" section scored 100%. A Swiss Lightning tournament was won by W R Hartston. The local club, and the Tournament Controller, J A Speigel are to be congratulated on the success of the Congress.

The Bognor Regis International Congress

The Bognor Regis International Congress

One of the major events in the Chess calendar, this, the thirteenth, attracted just over 350 entries, with sixty taking part in the Stevenson Memorial Tournament. This was won by A O'Kelly de Galway, the Belgian International Grand Master with a score of nine points from eleven rounds. His sixth victory at Bognor Regis. R G Wade finished second, with eight points and so became the Southern Counties Champion He had a great struggle with Norman Littlewood in the last for 1965. round, needing a win to take second prize, and in winning reversed the result of the last round in the Southend on Sea Easter Congress. Of the many players from Southern County clubs, mention should be made of O M Hindle (Norfolk) and C Kottnauer (Middlesex) who finished equal 72 points; W R Hartston (Middlesex) and R D Keene and third with D Parr (both of Surrey) equal sixth with 7 points; and amongst the eleven players who finished with 62 points were J G Brogden (Surrey), R A Doney (Norfolk), M J Dymond (Hampshire), A Hall and W A Winser (both Sussex) J B Howson and P S Milner Barry (both Kent) and D E Lloyd (Middlesex).

Included in the other prize winners was our Honorary Secretary J J Lauder, who won the Major six day competition (afternoon) with 62 out of 7.
