EDITORIAL.

Editorial material for the 1966/67 volume is likely to be less than that contributed to previous volumes by Mr Henlen, as, I have at the moment, other chess responsibilities which cannot be immediately put aside. (The 'putting aside' does not include grading, which, unfortunately, has become a more absorbing occupation than actually playing; on the other hand, it does provide a ready made excuse for lack of prowess as a player.)

I would like to provide space for news items other than county match results, such as the progress of the S.C.C.U. Individual Championship, and, if I can track down the controllers, the results of the County and Zonal stages of the B.C.F. Championship; also progress in the National Club Championship and items of general news from the counties. If this news tends to have a Sussex bias it will be the fault of other counties not sending in material.

Obituary: H. W. R. KEEBLE.

Harry Keeble died on Thursday, 23rd June, 1966. Although he had played in the London Commercial and Kent Chess Leagues for many years beforehand, it was not until 1953 that he became widely known to chess players, especially in the South-East. In that year he became not only Hon. Secretary of the Kent County Chess Association but also Assistant Manager of the National Chess Centre when it re-started at Fleming's Restaurant in Oxford Street. Soon after he became Manager of the Centre, saw it through its move to Bishopsgate, and continued to run it in his own individual and efficient manner until it had to close down when the lease ran out. Thereafter he was instrumental in getting the use of the Staff Restaurant at John Lewis's for the playing of county matches and continued to officiate there and curate the equipment until only a year or so ago. With the death of his wife and his own advancing years and failing health, he then retired from all chess administration, though he continued playing until only a short time before he died. Harry will be widely remembered as an efficient and normally even-tempered administrator, and by all those who knew him more than slightly - and there are many - as a warm-hearted, pleasant friend and companion.
