S C C U JAMBOREE 1969

This popular get together of chess players, which began in 1961 to celebrate the 80th birthday of Sir George Thomas, was played at the Royal Scottish Corporation Fetter Lane on Saturday the 25th October. Not so many entries as last year, but eleven of the fourteen counties in the Union sent in one team and six also had a junior side. Twenty three teams in all took part, and with one game for adjudication, the winners are the London University team, who scored 8 points out of a possible ten. They were closely followed by Cambridge University, Insurance and Kent with 7½ points. The adjudication which has not yet been notified to me, might add either Hampshire or Middlesex to these three, since the game concerned is between these two counties who, at present, have 6½ points each from nine games. Thus a win for either would make that county equal second, a draw and they are equal fifth, and those shown in the table below as being equal fifth would become equal seventh. If Hampshire or Middlesex lose then they become equal sixth with the others who have scores of 6½ points. (I hope this is understandable!)

Anyway, congratulations to the London University team on winning the Shield.

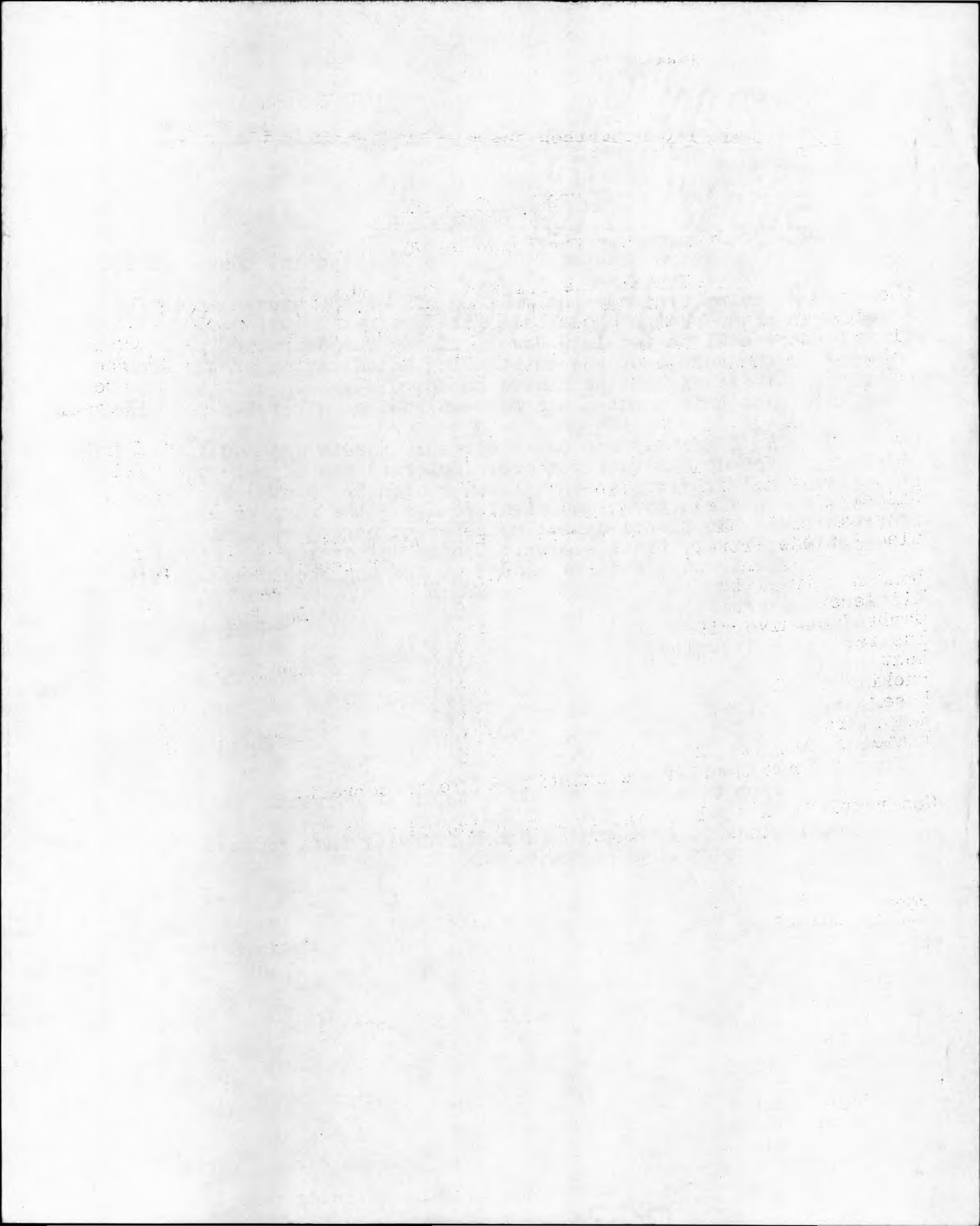
