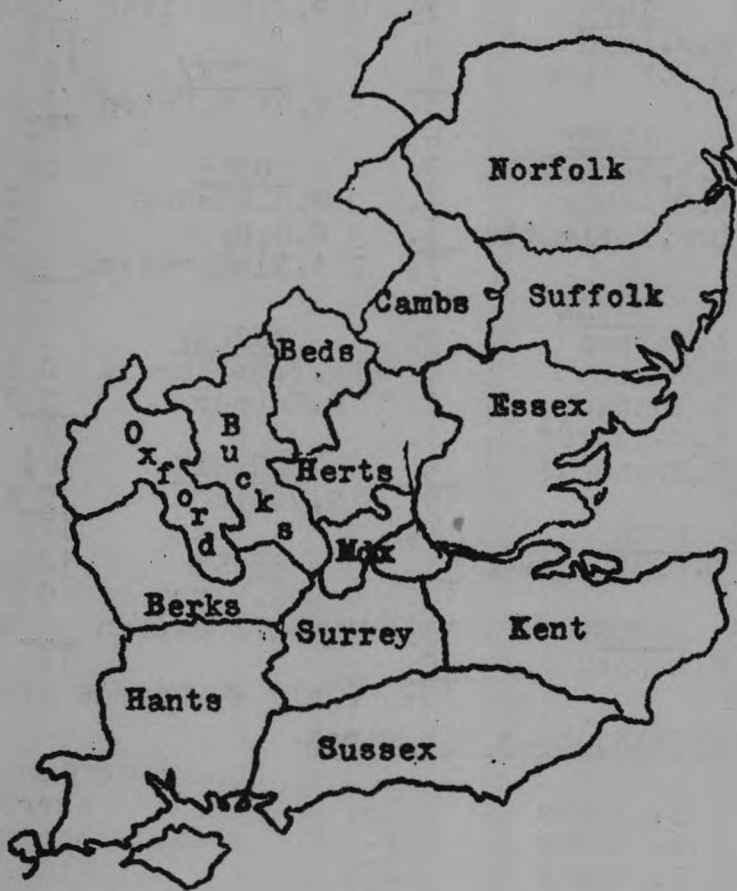

BRITISH CHESS FEDERATION - APPOINTMENT OF GENERAL SECRETARY.

Mr. G. H. Simmons, the General Secretary of the B.C.F. is due to retire in September 1972 and the B.C.F. requires a successor who will be able to act as a part time deputy as from September 1971 with a view to taking over on Mr. Simmons' retirement.

In addition to the tasks applicable to the General Secretaryship, Mr. Simmons carries out certain other functions which his successor will be expected to take over; these include editing the News Flash and Year Book, acting as Records and Registrations Secretary, Conductor of the Counties Championship, Publicity Officer and as Secretary of most of the standing Committees. This will be a full time appointment, much of the work can be done at home, but attendance at meetings in London and elsewhere, (Usually at week-ends) is necessary. The candidate will not be required to take over the post of Controller of the Congress.

The successful applicant will be familiar with the structure of chess administration in England, will preferably have had experience as an administrator (not necessarily in chess). Ability to type etc. is not essential but would be a considerable advantage.

The salary and other conditions will be negotiable, but the salary will not be less than £1,000 per annum as from September 1972. For a candidate with secretarial qualifications a higher salary would be appropriate.

NORMAN FISHLOCK-LOMAX

It is with deep regret that we report the death of Norman Fishlock-Lomax at his home in Hove on the 24th March at the age of 63 after a long illness.

Norman was well-known as a Chess enthusiast and organiser in the North of England before he came south from Lancashire in the early 1950s. He was the founder and inspiration of the series of Bognor Regis International Congresses, which he commenced in a small way at Southdean, Middleton-on-Sea, in 1953 with an entry of 64 competitors. This was considerably enlarged in the following year when, with agreement of the S.C.C.U., it included the Stevenson Memorial Tournament run as a Swiss Competition including several Continental Masters, whilst the leading Southern Counties competitor was recognised as the S.C.C.U. Champion.

The Congress rapidly outgrew the accommodation at Southdean and was transferred first to the Rex Ballroom at Bognor and some years later to the new Butlin's Holiday Camp at Felpham, where the number of competitors rose to over 400. The Congress thus became the largest event of its kind in Europe.

A year or two after the move to Butlins, the S.C.C.U. decided to make arrangements to run their Championship elsewhere as a separate competition on different lines. Mr Lomax, however, continued his Congress as before and the main Swiss International Tournament was, with the approval of Lady Churchill, re-named the Churchill Memorial Tournament in honour of the late Sir Winston Churchill.

Unfortunately, after the 17th Congress in 1969, Mr Lomax, whose health had been failing for some time, realised that he would no longer be able to undertake the immense amount of work involved and most reluctantly decided that he would be unable to organise any further Congresses of a similar nature.

Many of the regular competitors, who had enjoyed playing in the Congresses year after year, wrote to him expressing their regrets and, despite further deterioration in his health necessitating spells in hospital, Norman decided to run a smaller and less ambitious event at Hove in 1970 to be known as the Chessfriends Annual Reunion. This was greatly enjoyed by about 70 competitors and from his hospital bed Norman made similar arrangements for a second Reunion to take place this year. Most regrettably he did not survive to see the fulfilment of his efforts.

For his work in organising the Bognor Regis International Congresses, Mr Lomax was awarded the title of International Judge by the Federation International des Echecs (F.I.D.E.). He was a born organiser, and he and his family gave generously of their time and talent to the promotion of the annual congresses.

Norman's death is a great loss to Chess, and his many friends will sadly miss his genial conviviality and his advice and assistance which was always available when required.

Our sincere sympathy is extended to his widow, Betty Fishlock-Lomax, who did so much each year to assist her husband in organising and running the Congresses, and to their sons and daughters.

In the Main Event, the Churchill Memorial Tournament, which was run as an eight rounds Swiss Competition, 18 entries were received. Unfortunately one competitor was unable to attend owing to an injury, which necessitated a bye in each round.
