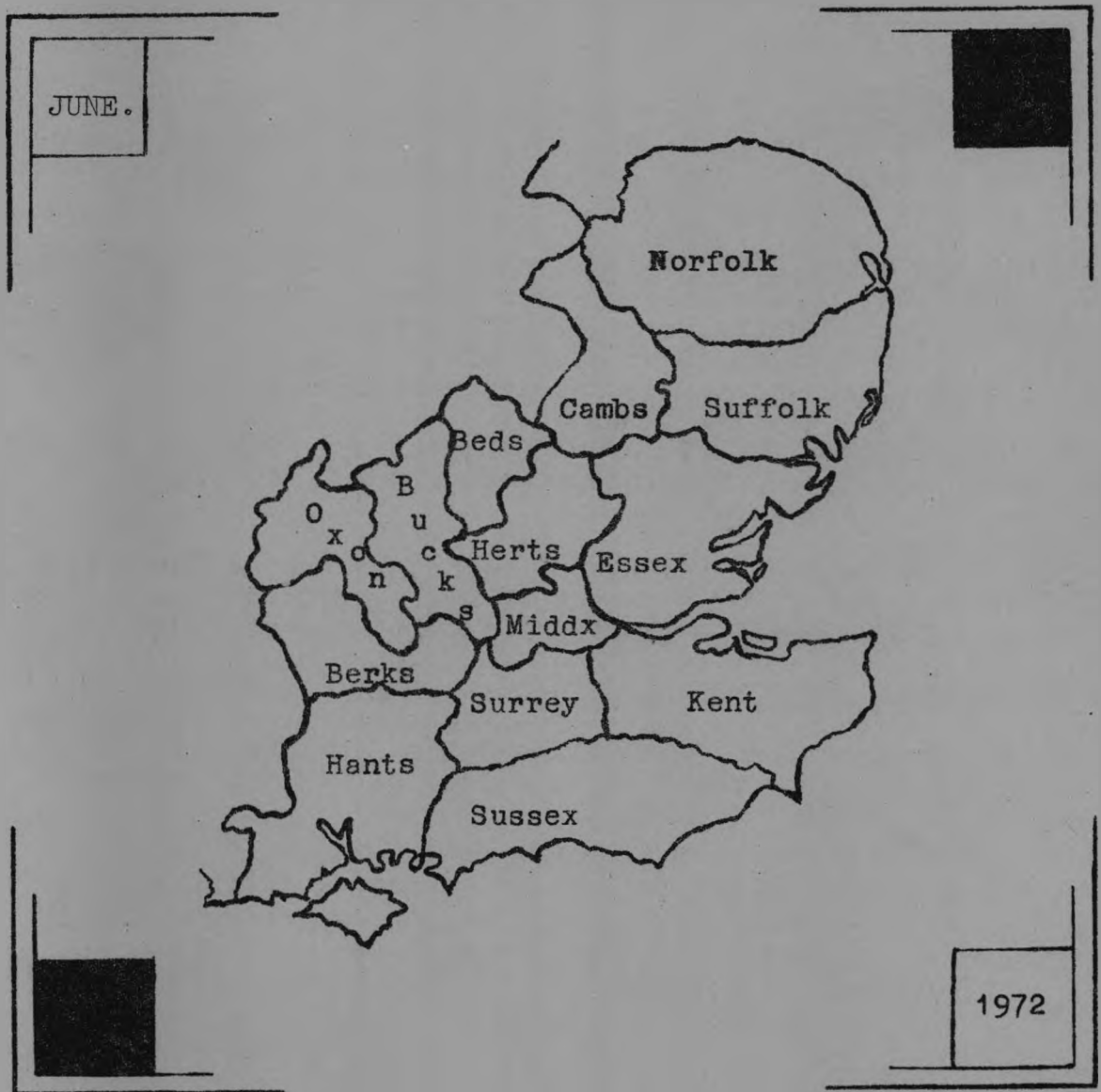

APPEALS

In the Sussex v. Essex Match the results of two adjudicated games were reported in the Stop Press of our April issue.

An appeal was lodged against the result on board 15 and this has been upheld and the game scored as a win for P.C. Doye of Essex, who thus win the match by 12-8 instead of 11-9 as originally reported.

In the Kent v. Essex match an appeal against the result on board 1 has been upheld and the game scored as a win for M.W. Wills of Essex, thus making the final score 12-8 in favour of Essex.

The Jamboree took place at St Bride's on Saturday, 15th April when 16 teams competed for the Henlen Trophy under the control of Mr R.L. Owen. Two teams, Cambridge University and Essex, scored 8 points and tied for top place, closely followed by Kent with $7\frac{1}{2}$. Surrey Juniors scored 7 to finish 4th.

As usual Messrs E.E. Croker and R.M. Sinclair organised the scoreboards and records. Mr S.D. Jacobs assisted with the equipment and controlling whilst Mr Owen was playing for his County Team. Arrangements for accommodation were made by Mr H.T. Ennis and Mrs Ennis provided refreshments for thirsty and hungry players.

Ten games were sent for adjudication and the thanks of all players are expressed to Mr Owen and all the above-named helpers.

SOUTHEND-ON-SEA CONGRESS

Once again a large number of Chess Players - 184 of them this year - competed in the 16th Annual Southend-On-Sea Congress this Easter and were grateful to Mr J.A. Spiegel for all his work in organising yet another successful weekend. 77 players entered for the Southend Open Championship and after seven rounds D. Wright of Harrow took first place with 6 points and K.B. and R.F. Harman shared second place with $5\frac{1}{2}$ points each. Six players, including W. Schmidt of Western Germany, shared 4th place with 5 points. The Major (American) events ran to six sections and were won by J.B. Adams of London (A); B.A. Foreman of Leicester (B); D.L. Tremayne, Guildford (C); G. Ladds, Grantham (D); S.J. Moore, Northampton (E) and R.J. Everson, Erith (F).

The Individual Championship of the Union, a six-round Swiss, attracted 24 players and was again won by D. Sherman of Essex with 5 points. Second came M.W.J. Thompson of Hampshire with $4\frac{1}{2}$ and third place was shared by J.I. Century of Middlesex, J.P. Sommerville of Kent and S. Weeramantry of Hampshire. The Union Under-18 Championship was won by A. Hanreck of Kent with M.J. Dear of Oxford in second place and S. Ruthen of Suffolk. The Girls Prize went to Miss Caldwell.

GOODBYE HAMPSHIRE

Hampshire were officially accepted into the West of England Chess Union somewhat naturally with twinges of regret in some quarters, whilst all will wish the County all the best in its new Union.
