

GRADING As readers are probably aware the Union is in process of computerizing part of our Grading operations and in March Brian Locke appealled for additional help. About thirty volunteers came forward and in May the first stage of the task was completed with the transfer of existing records on to a computer. Mr. Locke has expressed the thanks of the Union to all who took part in this operation and also to H.M. Cath and B.T. Williams who did the checking work and P.L. Eastwood and J.J. Lauder who assisted where revisions were required. Also Eric Croker and Brian Threadgall accomplished a full check on the details of every junior on our list: this was a major effort and our special thanks are due to them for their arduous work in this task.

Each grader has now received a copy of the computer print-out of the records of all players who played graded chess in the 1972/73 season. Thus the graders have the goahead for their usual operations at this time of year and we look forward to the computer performing the collating job and some time in September the end-product, namely the September bulletin should be available complete with the new Grading List.

Members will appreciate that the financial aspect of the new system must involve extra cost, but it is felt that this will be accepted as a worth-while expenditure. Orders for extra copies should be sent to the Editor some time in August.

that "Any County can instruct the Grading Committee not to publish the grade of a non member, but to insert 'non member' against the name", thus adopting a firm line against players who receive and sometimes expect to receive facilities provided by, but who cannot be persuaded to register with and pay fees to, the B.C.F. and M.C.C.U.

SUBSCRIPTIONS PLEASE

As many readers are aware, during the past season we have asked subscribers, as and when their subscriptions fell due, to pay varying sums which would bring the due date of the next payment to August 1974, so that in nearly all cases this issue completes their entitlement.

Receipt by the reader of the September (Grading List) issue will acknowledge receipt of the subscription paid.

THE COST OF CHESS

For some time the British Chess Federation, of which we are all members, has studied in depth the complex problem of finding an equitable method of sharing (and meeting) the cost of national and international administration of the game. The study of this problem falls mainly to the Development Committee of the Federation, of which our President-elect, Mr. W. A. Cordon has been a member for several years. I have asked him for his up-to-date assessment of the problem, and Mr. Cordon writes:-

"For several years attempts have been made to find a substitute for the B.C.F. registration scheme. The present scheme can be faulted as being expensive, time-consuming and divisive, since co-operative counties see the ease with which other counties evade it.

The Development Committee sent two ideas to the B.C.F. Council for consideration. First, a Levy Scheme under which, briefly, each "county" would be allocated a percentage of B.C.F. expenditure to find - such an allocation would be partly based on the population and partly on the "Chess Activity" of its area. An annual meeting of "County" representatives would approve (?) the projected expenditure for the next year and then it would be up to each "County" to find its money as it wished.

The second alternative is a two-tier scheme whereby those who play in B.C.F. events, including the Union stages of the County Championships would pay a large fee - say £1.50 - and those who do not a small one say 25p. Board fees would be abolished.

There is not room here to discuss the pros and cons, but personally I believe the cons to be stronger, and expect that we will have to live with the imperfect Registration Scheme - though perhaps with modifications - until the day when a voluntary membership can pay for the B.C.F. and its ventures and those for whom the B.C.F. has little relevance or interest need not be compelled to support it."

To which your Editor, who has suffered seventeen years service on the Federation Executive Committee would add his opinion that the last paragraph has his entire approval. Latest information is that two Unions have stated flatly that they would not be able to operate a Levy Scheme.
