And on the grading issue...

Dear Mr Haddrell,

During my recent terms of office with the BCF I have served on a number of committees and sub-committees at which the question of payment for grading has been discussed and am in consequence conversant with the arguments both for and against.

I have also held offices at Club, County and Union levels and so can appreciate the choices involved.

I was therefore very interested in your editorial on the subject.

I am a firm supporter of the belief that payment for grading is the most equitable

method of financing the Federation, and, in my opinion, Mr Threadgall's proposal is the most practical method by which this can be achieved.

I do not consider the "main disadvantage" you mention to be as serious as may be supposed, as the possession of a grade is nowadays much valued by a very large proportion of ordinary chess players, and it is my belief that if we have the courage to introduce this system, many of the non-contributing events will be compelled to contribute by pressure from the rank and file particularly in the case of congresses.

My one doubt is expressed in Mr Cay's letter to the Surrey Chess News, part of

which you quoted - I wish you had quoted it in full.

If grading is to assume this new importance, we must take vigorous steps to ensure: -

(i)that all gradeable games are submitted for grading

(ii) that all persons responsible for the reporting of matches are urged to report full initials and correctly spelt names - avoiding such misleading abbreviations as "T" for "Tony" or "Ted" - both of which I have met.

Mr Reuben's suggestion of giving all players numbers is of course logical, but there is still the danger of mistakes, and I think this would be resented as reminiscent of the time we spent in the barracks - or in prison!

Dear Richard,

I too think payment by event is better on almost all counts, though I give greater weight to the philosophical rather than administrative advantages.

Payment by event allows free BCF membership. This could well double membership and is surely the most effective way of promoting the BCF, supposedly the object the exercise.

The BCF is supported in theory by a system of Voluntary Individual Subscription (VIS). This is a historical accident stemming from the days when the BCF was what might loosely be called a large club. In 1950 for example the higher categories of BCF membership raised over twice as much as registrations. Today the figure is about one-seventh. A similar decline has taken place of the representation of these categories on the BCF Council.

VIS implies some sort of positive commitment. The BCF today is a mass movement with large and almost totally passive membership. VIS is therefore utterly inappropriate. The logical organisational structure is for a chain of affiliation from club to county to BCF.

The analogy with FIDE reinforces the point. I, and I suspect the vast majority of players, feel that FIDE is remote and I have no wish to become a member, but I do feel that the BCF should affiliate. The ordinary player feels the same way about the BCF.

It is, apparently seriously, claimed that if payment for grading is adopted a useful concept of BCF membership will be lost. To those who actually think there exists a useful concept of membership to be lost I offer the following idea. The computer grading number becomes the BCF registration number. Membership therefore becomes important to the ordinary player, because for example he may need to quote his number when entering a congress. The idea would also improve the accuracy of the grading lists and further reduce the necessary administration.

Editor's note

At the risk of bludgeoning this issue to death, I feel I must make one or two comments. Firstly, I have not heard from anybody who would like to see the West of England scheme introduced - does this mean I have convinced them? Secondly, however much we talk about the practicality, morality and philosophical implications of these proposals, what really matters is whether we can make them work and get players to accept them. We know the West of England scheme works - in the West of England. The proportion of players registering in the WECU went up from 71% in 1977 to 79% in (Post hoc...?) I have doubts about its practicality in the SCCU, and I don't think it's the fairest system. But what I can't prove is that Clubs, Counties, Congresses and Independent Leagues in the SCCU (or anywhere else) would accept Bryan Threadgall's scheme. I think they would. I am sure that my own club would be happy to replace its registration payment by a sum related to the number of games it wants graded - in the knowledge that congresses and independent leagues are doing the same. It so happens that my club gets all its internal competitions graded, and so would pay more than some clubs of similar size which are less interested in grades. But what's unfair about that? As for the independent leagues, I know that the one in which my club plays would be ready to pay for its grading. That's two examples out of I don't know how many, and the only way to find out what other bodies think is to ask them. I do have some ideas about doing that, but it's quite an undertaking ...

It is worth remembering that the SCCU does not have to fall in with the rest on payment-for-grading, whatever they may decide. It would be quite feasible for us to operate one scheme while the other Unions operated another. But at the moment what the SCCU has to do is to make up its collective mind, and it won't do that by means of a deadlocked Executive Committee of twenty individuals sitting down and talking about it.

To conclude the subject of grading (for this issue) I should point out that a list of amendments to the Grading List appears on page 8.

IK Hardwick, Sussex Junior Organiser, writes:

The Sussex Chess Association caters for the junior players of the County by organising three team competitions for those under 14, under 16 and under 19. Recent years have seen a remarkable growth of interest in the game as can be seen clearly from the entries to these tournaments. The 1970-1 season saw 18 teams compete for the three trophies, while the same competitions attracted 49 entries for 1977-8. A county which is over 60 miles long and has strong teams at both of its geographical extremes obviously has a problem, but remarkably few matches are played after the dates suggested for each round. Two recent finals have involved teams from over 50 miles apart, and such occasions are always full of interest both for the teams concerned and their local leagues whose members can gauge their own strengths relative to other teams in the county.

The U14 and U16 competitions in particular have produced some excellent matches and it is clear that we have quality as well as quantity, with some strong teams playing very good chess. "The best reflect the standard of the rest" some say, and Sussex has some outstanding individuals of whom David Cummings and Stuart Conquest are obvious examples. There is no county junior side as such, but the strong young players are introduced to the three senior sides and several have done very well there and earned regular places.

If the current growth in junior chess persists, as of course we hope it will, we can look forward to more and better players emerging from their schools in the future.

SOME SCCU ODDMENTS

Minor Counties Championship: Only Middx II, Essex II, Sussex II and Norfolk have elected to play in the Minor Counties competition this year. The SCCU bit of this competition will be decided on matches played between these four in the Montague-Jones

Counties Corresponence Championship 1977-8: Not a particularly distinguished season for SCCU teams. Surrey came 4th out of 16, Middx joint 5th, Sussex 8th, Kent joint 9th with Bucks, Oxon 15th.

While these prove nothing except that most counties don't register all their players, I think they are of interest. LETTER (just arrived)

Dear Mr Haddrell,

I read the report in the recent Bulletin of the SCCU Executive meeting with interest, in particular the item no. 7, referring to the Oxon-Sussex dispute: "...the Committee decided that the normal home and away arrangement must stand."

I have lived in Sussex since 1965 and have every copy of the Sussex Chess Bulletin since it was first issued in 1966. Since 1973 I have been a Sussex match captain. During the period 1965-1978 there is no record of any Oxon-Sussex fixture other than at a London venue.

More specifically, when the SCCU reorganised the competitions into 4 divisions in the early '70s:

1973-4 Oxford withdrew from all sections

1974-5 Oxford v Sussex was at St Brides

1975-6 Oxford v Sussex II was at Commonwealth Institute

1976-7 Oxford v Sussex II " " "

1977-8 Oxford v Sussex II was at St Brides

On each occasion I was match captain of the Sussex team. Thus there is no recent precedent for home and away matches between these two counties. I find the use of the word "normal" unusual, and can assume only that it is based on gross ignorance.

I would add that last season Oxford approached me with a view to playing home and away in the M-J: I declined, for reasons which were then apparently acceptable and we agreed to play the two year cycle in London. Oxford's promotion seems to have caused their officials to reject identical reasons presented this year by the Sussex I captain.

The Committee's verdict merely accentuates the fact that Sussex are not represented on the Committee: a surprising situation for a county with three teams competing, and one which must cast doubt on the composition of the Committee. (It is true that Mr BG Locke lives in Sussex, but to my knowledge he has never been invited by the county to represent its interests.

I should emphasise that I write this in a private capacity. It is very likely that the Sussex Chess Association will be making formal representations to the SCCU and the BCF in due course.

Editor's note

I will not comment on the rights and wrongs of this case, but I feel I must defend the Committee against a charge of "gross ignorance". The words "normal home and away arrangement" were mine, and they were intended to convey not that home and away is normal between Oxon and Sussex, but that it is normal in the SCCU competitions in general. I try to be brief, and I become ambiguous.

On the matter of Committee representation, my own view is that every county should have one member elected specifically to represent it. That would, of course, mean changing the rules.
