SCCU EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

The Committee met on Friday 8th December 1978 at St Brides. The main items that arose were as follows:

- (1) SCCU President: Mr Stobart's business has unexpectedly whisked him off to beassels for the remainder of the year. Mr Croker will deputise as President until the AGM.
- (2) The preparations for amended Rules and Tournament Rules are going ahead as planned.
- (3) It was pointed out that we have only nine elected Committee members, whereas the Rules provide for ten. The Committee agreed that AB Bamford (Sussex), one of the unsuccessful candidates at the last AGM, should be invited to fill the gap for the rest of the season.

(4) SCCU Individual Championship: This event will be included in the Sutton

Congress at Easter, starting on the 13th April 1979.

(5) Payment-for-grading: The Committee held its traditional discussion on this topic, and the outcome was that the SCCU will take no action at the moment on the BCF's proposal that the grades of unregistered players should not be published. However, the organisers of congresses and independent leagues will be circularised in an attempt to find out whether they would be willing, in principle, to pay for grading. In the meantime the grading sub-committee will look at ways in which it could be managed.

PAYMENT-FOR-GRADING (AGAIN)

In the course of the Committee meeting reported above, it emerged that Oxfordshire are already taking action by not sending in computer grading cards for unregistered players; Kent are not sending in cards for new unregistered players, though they continue to include unregistered players for whom records already exist; while the Surrey Committee has rejected both the WECU scheme and the Threadgall proposal, opting by 7 votes to 2 in favour of the status quo.

We have not yet heard from any other counties, but we understand that the matter

is on the agenda for further discussion in Kent.

BCF NOTICE

The BCF notifies the following rule change, binding with immediate effect on all FIDE affiliates.

The 50-move Rule

In endings of King and two Knights against King and Pawn, the 50-move rule will be extended to 100 moves, if the following conditions are met:

(a) the Pawn is safely blocked by a Knight

(b) the Pawn is not further advanced than R5, N3, B4, Q5 or K5

ON THE LAWS

Since we're on the subject ...

Some comment has been aroused by the bizarre incident (see November issue) in which White (to play) offered a draw, Black said "I'll see your move", White played a mate in one, and Black accepted the draw.

You may recall that Black got his draw, on a show of hands of all present

(it was that sort of event). Was that right?

First, to clear up one misapprehension: a correspondent remarks that Black, having refused the draw, obviously had no right to accept it one move later. This is wrong: Black did not refuse the draw. The expression "I'll see your move" is a commonly accepted way of saying "I will postpone my decision until you have played a move" - a right which Black undoubtedly had, since White had offered a draw in his own time.

Unfortunately, the rules say that checkmate ends the game so it would seem that Black's acceptance came too late. Your Editor believes that a strict interpretation of the Laws must give White the win; though morally he's on Black's side (stand up the man who said morals don't come into chess).

What I don't understand, if I may revert to the first person, is why offering a draw in your own time should be illegal. There's no penalty for the offence, and an offer so made is binding on the offerer anyway, so calling it illegal seems next door to meaningless. But then there are quite a few oddities in the Laws if you look closely enough. I expect a committee wrote them.

Try this position:

White to play and mate in one.

Solution:


White plays 1 b5!! mate.

It is a little known fact that the Laws of chess do not prohibit moving your opponent's pieces.

No, I'm not joking: you try and find such a rule, if you think there is one.

Did you know that there is no such thing as an absolute, or "legal", pin? There is nothing in the Laws to prevent you moving away a piece which is pinned against your King.

Kings are not allowed to move into check, that's all.



Did you know that the rule which says "illegal moves can't be corrected once the game is over" is a myth? I'm sure FIDE believes in it, but it doesn't exist for all that. (You find it.)

Did you know that there is a perfectly legal way in which both sides can win a game? There is a big loophole in Article... No, I'll keep this one to myself.

Did you know that it is forbidden to calculate variations during play? (Article 19b)

The second problem is guaranteed to stump anyone who doesn't actually take the rule book to bed with him at night:

White to play and mate in one. Oh, I nearly forgot: White has touched his King and must therefore make a King move.

Solution:

There obviously isn't a solution unless... Suppose White has just picked up his King from el and placed it on cl, intending to castle long. Suppose further that he has let go of the King but has not yet touched the Rook. Now according to Article 7 "the move is still not yet completed, but the player no longer has the right to make any other move except Castling". OK, we'll castle. Put the King back on el and castle short. Mate. No, I don't suppose I'd allow it if I were the controller but the Laws seem, to say the least, rather inexplicit.

Of course there are grey areas where it really isn't clear what the rule is (pawn promotion offers a few interesting cases), but the examples I have given aren't like that, they're just cases of sloppy drafting — or possibly sloppy translating, though it doesn't look like it. Unimportant? It depends on your point of view. Personally I feel that a serious intellectual game deserves, if only for aesthetic reasons, a self-respecting set of rules that says what it means.

CLOCK SIMULS

England Under 13s v GM Kotov: After the Eumig triumph, 12 Under 13s took on Alexander Kotov. Kotov won $7\frac{1}{2}-4\frac{1}{2}$, conceded three defeats, and commented that his opponents "would probably beat Russian juniors". Kotov lost to GA Waddingham (13, Notts), NL Carr (10, Essex), and CR Dawson (12, Warwicks); and drew with DL Lee Hiddx), NI Fox (12, Herts) and JM Emms (11, Norfolk). Other SCCU players taking part were SC Conquest (Sussex), JD Hockaday (Middx), Teresa Needham (Essex) and RA Morrison (Kent).

BCF Under 13s v IM Bob Wade: Wade also found the going tough, winning 9\frac{1}{2}-4\frac{1}{2}. to PR Harrington (12, Notts), and DR Norwood (10, Lancs); and drew with ES Lee (11, . Essex), PM Spurgeon (12, Hants), PG House (12, Glos), D McCabe (13, Warwicks) and M Pridmore (11, Cleveland). Other SCCU players taking part were RJ Blackwell (Middx), JB Kirk (Bucks), A Rose (Middx), J Franklin (Essex), Susan Walker (Surrey) and GA Reid (Essex).

Kent Juniors v GM Kotov: Kotov played a second clock simul on the 19th November, beating selected Kent Juniors 9-3. He lost to JR Richardson and NF Dickenson, drew with PJ Dawes and SJ Barrett, and beat RJ Jacobs, ID Thompson, DJ Edmonds, AP Dowton, SM Taylor, JA Brown, NR Calver and M Tottman. (GMs aren't what they were. Kotov lost a piece on move 12 in one game, and that was one of his wins.)

Nearly 40 Surrey girls attended a training session in Streatham on the 11th November. The day started with a 15 minute Swiss tournament, followed by an instructive talk by DL Massie, and finished with a simul given by the top Surrey girls. It is hoped that these sessions, which are the brainchild of Peter Granat and will be held about once a month, will improve the standard of girls' chess in the county. Surrey are also looking for more girls' schools interested in playing in the Surrey Girls' Chess League. Does any other county run separate competitions for girls?

REVIEW

The Chess Teacher by Alan Phillips: Oxford University Press 149 pp £3.95 boards, £1.95 paper covers. In short algebraic notation.

This book is intended mainly, one imagines, for school teachers. Alan Phillips is a former joint British Champion and has taught chess in seven schools, so should be well qualified to write such a book. As a school teacher myself, and one who attempts to teach chess in his spare time, I feel reasonably qualified to review it.

It is the most ambitious work of its kind that I know. It starts with the moves of the pieces (is this really necessary?) and travels fast, covering in 25 lessons all the basic principles and a good deal more besides. There is much more material in the book than any teacher I know could get through in a year; but then the author reveals that he introduced chess as part of the maths curriculum at one of his former schools, and suggests (hopefully) that the book may be issued as a class text-book. The to be a headmaster' I shall use it, perforce selectively, because there are a number of things I like about it. I like the way the lessons more or less follow the historical development of the game itself, with chapters centred on various prominent players (Greco, Anderssen, Blackburne, Morphy... and up to Karpov). The early swashbucklers are undoubtedly easier for a beginner to understand than Petrosian is, and it makes sense to start with them. I also like the way the book concentrates on general principles (look elsewhere for specialised opening analysis) and provides plenty of positions to solve. Some of these will tax most teachers' abilities.

On the whole I think this is one of the two best books for the school chess club library (the other one is much less ambitious). THE LONDON SCHOOLS! CHESS LEAGUE

Dr ML Levin, Chairman of the League, writes:

The London Schools' Chess League has been in existence since the early 1900s, having been founded to promote and encourage the playing of chess in schools in the London area.

The main activity of the League is the running of an annual League competition between the various schools in order to find the champion school. Since London is a rather large region, the preliminary stages of the competition are arranged on a zonal basis which caters for the spread of schools, from Haberdashers' Aske's in Elstree, in the north, Ilford County in the East, Purley High in the south, and Kingston Grammar in the west.

The winners of each zonal league then compete against each other on a knockout basis, to find the overall winner. Two competitions are run simultaneously one for the under 14 years, and one for the seniors. Recent champions of the League have included St Pauls, Ilford County High School, and Glyn.

The composition of the League has varied enormously over the years. Schools have entered and left, depending on their current enthusiasm for chess, and (continued on page 13)

someone to organise this within the school. Whilst members have numbered as many as 56, there has been a gradual reduction over the last 5 years, to an active membership of 37. It has been the unfortunate tendency that the casualties occur amongst the weaker schools, who do not have any interest in chess, and those ex-grammar schools who go comprehensive.

Current members of the League include Highbury Grove, William Ellis, Ilford County, Southfields, Charlton, all LEA schools, as well as St Pauls, Harrow, West-minster, Haberdashers', Glyn, and Whitgift amongst the independent schools.
