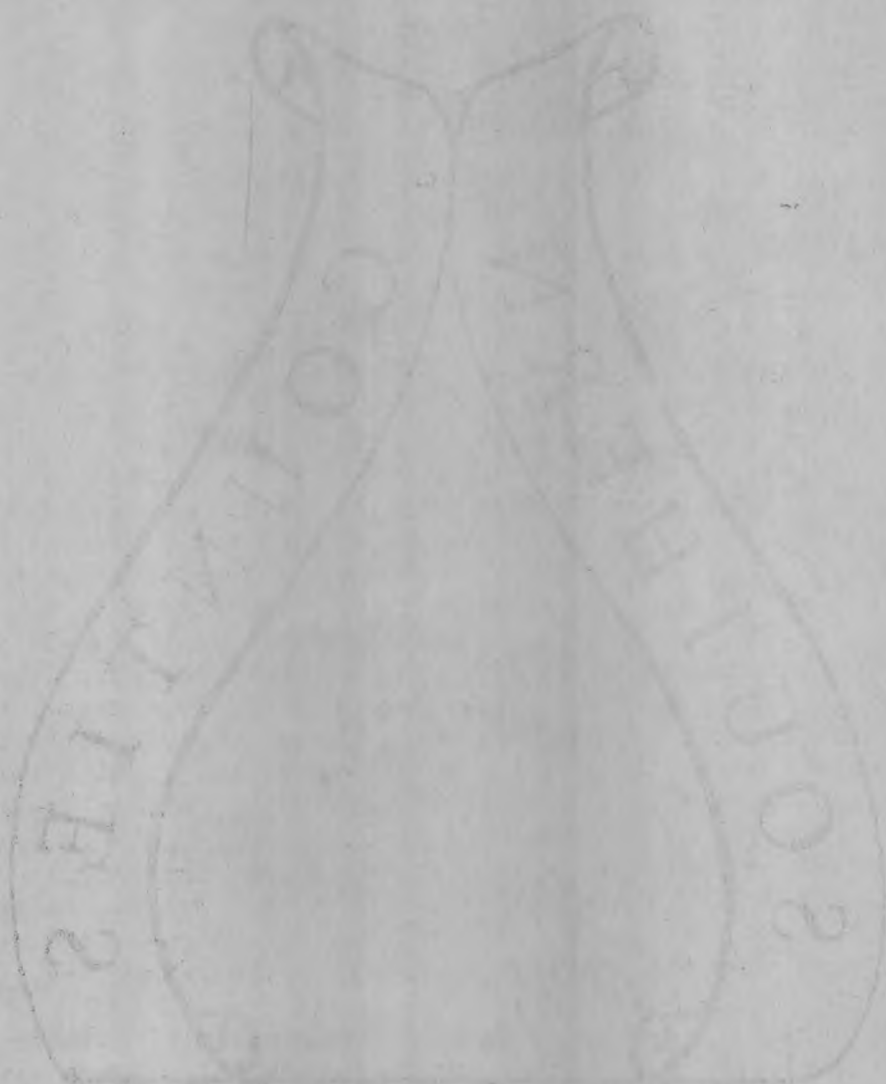

EDITORIAL

At the end of my first year as Editor I would like to thank all those who have contributed to the Bulletin: club, county and league secretaries, match captains, local organisers, congress secretaries, and all the other people without whom this publication could not exist. Please keep the copy rolling in, and remember the more there is of you the less there'll be of me.

I said when I started that I hoped to enjoy editing the Bulletin and would stop when I stopped enjoying it. Well, I'm still enjoying it so far (and not only because it gives me a chance to air my views in public, whatever you may think!). There's just one part of the job I hate, and that's typing out reels of county match results. Not because some match captains can't write legibly, or get their own players' names right, or add the scores up correctly; these are indeed irritants but whenever I start getting annoyed about them I remind myself that a match captain's job is to run a chess team and if he does that properly the rest is incidental. No, I hate typing county match results because it's such a tedious job in itself. I tell myself that this a journal of record and they've got to go in. Do people read them, though? Do they have to be printed in tabular form, or could they run along the line saving quite a lot of time and space? I've got no immediate plans to change, but I'd be interested to hear readers' opinions. Non-Union match results (e.g. Chiltern) pose another question: is it worth printing them the way I've been doing, along the line, or would it be better to omit them altogether?

As an afterthought, I'd like to propose one minor modification to the Tournament Rules: all players with Polish surnames, and all players with names longer than Easterbrook Smith, to be banned from these competitions.

SCCU ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING

The annual General Meeting of the SCCU Council, held on the 9th June 1979 at St Brides, was attended by 31 members. All counties were represented.

Treasurer's Report: Mr Richmond announced a surplus for the season of £228.74, due mainly to the £200 insurance money received for the Shannon Trophy. (The Meeting decided later, incidentally, to replace the Shannon Trophy.) We had made a loss of some £63 on the Bulletin and Grading List, but this had been roughly balanced by surpluses elsewhere.

The accounts had not yet been audited at the time of the Meeting. When audited they will be published in the Bulletin, along with the 1978 accounts which have not previously been available for publication.

Budget for 1979/80: Mr Richmond proposed that the County Levy and the price of the Grading List should remain unchanged, while the price of the Bulletin should go up to £1.25. There was a possibility of a modest loss on grading activities, but he felt this was acceptable in view of anticipated surpluses elsewhere.

All these recommendations were accepted by Council.

County Tournaments: There was much discussion on venues. Some, especially the Sussex delegates, thought that the Union should be prepared to impose half-way venues when distances were long - a thing it has recently refused to do. Debate was lengthy and teetered on the brink of acrimony, but eventually it was decided by a large majority that the Tournament Secretary should decide in cases of disagreement.

There was also some discussion on the possibility of quick-play finishes in County matches instead of adjudication. Some counties, at least, seemed to like this idea. The matter was not on the agenda, so of course no decision could be taken, but Counties are invited to make their views known to the Tournament Secretary.

Payment-for-Grading: As was reported in the March issue of the Bulletin, the Executive Committee had decided to introduce a scheme whereby all congresses and independent leagues would pay for grading. This was not on the agenda either, but some delegates had obviously come along determined to express their feelings.

They did so, to no small effect, and the upshot was that the Executive Committee was instructed to drop its plan to introduce the scheme this season, and instead to go back and have another think. The general feeling seemed to be that the Executive was trying to bleed leagues and congresses dry, had not given enough notice, and ought to have put the whole thing to Council in the first place.

General Rules: These on the other hand were on the agenda, but by the time we got there so much time had been spent on other things that the only sensible course was to postpone them for discussion at a Special General Meeting to be called later in the season. No date was fixed, but it was agreed that it should be a Friday evening.

There were only ten nominations for the Executive Committee (with the exception of three retiring committee members who declined to stand) and so no ballot was necessary. All the outgoing Officers were re-elected unopposed, apart from Oliver Stobart who is still in Brussels. Eric Croker has been deputising for him for some months already.

Fixtures: Some thought it unfair that the Fixtures List should be arranged so that Oxfordshire and Cambridgeshire could play all their matches in the university term. The Cambs delegates said they would simply not be able to play matches outside term time; and the point was made that it would not be fair to other counties if these two were sometimes strong and sometimes very much weaker.

Match defaults: It was observed that Middlesex's Championship victory - on game points after a tie on match points - might have been unfairly assisted by their 20-0 win by default over Oxon. There was some suggestion that we might profitably change the rules. (It must be said that Middlesex finished rather comfortably ahead on game points, and nobody was suggesting that they might not have beaten Oxon by a sufficient margin had they played the match. - Ed)

The above is a reasonably full account of the Meeting, but inevitably some things have been left out. Counties will of course receive the official minutes in due course.

SCCU BULLETIN

Readers will by now have noted that the Bulletin is to cost £1.25 per annum in the new season - excluding Grading List. This a big jump but at an effective price of 11p per issue, including postage, the Bulletin was simply not an economic proposition. It should now more or less pay its way.

The decision to sell the Bulletin without a copy of the Grading List has been taken advisedly. For one thing, the old system was artificial (and complicated accounting), and for another it is recognised that Bulletin subscribers may not want a Grading List. Those who do will presumably be capable of ordering one separately, and Bulletin and Grading List will still be distributed from the same address.

Will subscribers please note that all subscriptions lapse with this issue. An order form for next season's issues is attached to the front cover; please detach it and send it promptly.

PAYMENT-FOR-GRADING

It will have been rightly guessed, or if it hasn't it should have been, that your Editor now wants to have another go at this thorny topic.

It's been a funny old year. In the other Unions, opinion seems to have gradually hardened in favour of the West of England scheme. In the Southern Counties, Oxfordshire have taken a step in a parallel direction (though not the same one) by not sending in grading cards for unregistered players; Surrey have rejected the West of England scheme and payment-by-event schemes as well, opting

for the status quo; while Kent have vacillated, first following a course similar to Oxfordshire's and then coming out unequivocally in favour of payment by event. I do not know the opinions of any other counties. Meanwhile, the SCCU Executive Committee sat deadlocked for half the season and then suddenly, in March, more or less unanimously agreed on a payment by event scheme which it promptly prepared to set in motion. And then the AGM puts everything back in the melting pot by overruling the Executive and telling it to have another think.

We're not quite back where we started. The one thing we have now that we didn't have a year ago is an Executive Committee broadly agreed on one plan. (I only wish more counties would tell us what they think, but in the absence of guidance from them it is up to the Executive to take a lead.)

So why did the AGM reject the Executive's plan? Not because it basically disagreed with payment-by-event, or if it did it didn't say so. No, it seems to me that in trying to get the thing started quickly we have rather fallen down on communication. Nobody is trying to milk congresses dry; the suggested fee for grading could be covered by adding a very small sum to the entry fee. Nor is anyone trying to squeeze extra money out of the Counties, because revenue would have been channelled back to them in the form of reduced levies in future seasons. But I'm not sure that either of those points got across.

At the moment the Union's revenue comes (almost) entirely from the counties. The Union's grading service accepts results from organisations (the independent leagues and congresses) which do not contribute. The Executive's scheme was intended to spread the load more fairly by getting money from these organisations and reducing the county levy accordingly - as well as paying a proportion to the ECF. Some independent-league-and-congress players might object that this would hit them twice since they are already registered through a county anyway. Well, yes; but their county affiliation fees would come down since the county would be paying less, and for the rest it doesn't seem unreasonable that people who play in more events should pay more.

Maybe the Executive made a mistake in trying a rather muddled compromise. It might have been better to leave the county congresses out of it, concentrating on the independent organisations. That way at least the counties would not have felt we were trying to hit them twice. Or of course we could have gone the whole hog and included everything, county leagues and all - and dropped the county levy.

One red herring trailed across the scene at the AGM was the fact that many events do their own grading. This misses the point that the charges were envisaged not as payments for doing the grading, but as payments for including it in the system. Doing the grading costs little; it is normally done by unpaid volunteers and it makes little difference whether the volunteers are found by league and congress organisers or by the Union. Including results in the system is not cheap.

This leads to another point it is all too easy to forget: this debate is not really about grading at all. It is about sources of revenue, and if grading comes into it that is only because it represents the only available "sanction". The real question is whether the independent organisations should be drawn into the system, and in my opinion there can be only one answer to that.

NORFOLK SCHOOLS CHESS ASSOCIATION

There's been quite a lot of activity going on here over the years. S Webb, past President, reveals that the Norwich and District Schools Chess League was founded as long ago as November 1959 with about half a dozen schools competing, including one girls school (Dereham High). The title of the organisation was later changed to Norfolk Schools Chess Association. Today the Association still runs a league, divided into two competitions at the Under 15 level, and an annual junior congress which goes back to 1963 (this year's winners appear on page 4). About 12 schools currently play in the league; this year Mrs Hindle's junior team from Cromer Secondary School won all their 5 matches in the U15 and they will play in the senior division next time.

A Training Committee was set up last season and has so far run two Training Days; the second one, under the direction of RG Wade assisted by OM Hindle and C Cubitt, attracted juniors from Suffolk and Cambs as well as Norfolk. It is hoped that similar Training Days will be held at least twice a year in future. Backing comes from the "Eastern Evening News" and the Aaronson Foundation.

In 1967 the Association was awarded a BCF Schools Shield and this is awarded annually to the team the Committee considers to have done particularly well.

SUSSEX: A four-cornered match for the Crowborough Cup was won convincingly by Fernor Primary School, Crowborough on the 30th June. Teams of 10 included two players from each year going right down to Infants level!

KENT: The new Medway and Gillingham U13 League was narrowly won by Hoo Middle School "B" team from their own "A" team. Six schools competed.

REVIEW

Korchnoi's Chess Games Edited by David Levy and Kevin O'Connell: Oxford University Press. 291 pages paper covers £7.50 (Figurine algebraic)

A massive collection of all Korchnoi's discoverable games 1945-1977, in languageless figurine notation; some games annotated. I wish I could say how many games there are in this book, but they aren't numbered.* It's a heck of a lot, anyway. There is a symbolic reference system of baffling complexity; tournament cross-tables; indexes of openings and opponents; and a short polyglot introduction by Bill Hartston.

A tremendous amount of work has gone into this book, and it deserves to find its way onto the shelves of every Korchnoi fan who can afford it. (For your money you do get a very solidly produced book which isn't going to fall apart in a hurry.)
