EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE MEETING

The Executive met on Friday 21st September 1979 at St Brides. The interesting bits of the meeting went like this:

• games in the MJ Competition towards the end of last season.

Payment for Grading: The Committee spent considerable time on this in preparation for the Special General Meeting (which has been fixed for Friday 1st February 1980). Work is in progress on a modified payment-by-event scheme which it is hoped will meet with approval at the SGM. It would be premature to publish full details of the scheme at this stage; Counties will of course receive them before the Meeting.

Rules: The Special General Meeting will also consider the new General Rules, prepared by the Committee, which were crowded out of the AGM in June. The Committee still has to debate one or two new points which have arisen, including some amendments proposed by Mr Lean of Hertfordshire. There was no time for this at the September Committee meeting, but it will come up at the next meeting (30th November).

Meanwhile, the Committee is still awaiting the opportunity to consider the new Tournament Rules which have been prepared by the Inter-County sub-committee. We hope to be able to present these to Council next year...

<u>Trophies</u>: The Executive is taking steps to purchase a replacement Shannon Trophy in accordance with the directions of the AGM. We have been offered two new trophies by Phillips and Drew, the prominent stockbroking firm (to whom thanks!) and it is felt that these may very suitably replace the irreparable Amboyna and Ebony trophies. A further trophy donation is on offer from Batsfords; the Committee is to undertake a review of the current trophy situation to find out exactly where our need is greatest. <u>BCF Stage County Matches</u>: The Executive agreed to seek a rule change to the effect that all matches in the BCF stage of the Championship and Minor Counties Championship be played over 20 boards. (The current rules stipulate a minimum of 16 boards.) The SCCU General Secretary was asked to write to the BCF making this proposal.

Treasurer's Report: Mr Richmond made some comments, which are appended to the accounts published below.

<u>BCF Representative's Report</u>: Mr Richmond also reported on the Management Board meeting held on the 15th September 1979. Perhaps the most important items were: (1) It has been suggested that some expenditure should be transferred from the BCF to the Unions, so reducing VAT liability; and (2) It has been proposed to divide the country into about 10 regions in order to evolve a national Junior development programme; each region to run two coaching weekends a year plus other activities as needed.

By the time you read this, fuller details of both these points will no doubt have appeared in News Flash.

Quick-play Finishes: You may remember that there was some discussion at the SCCU AGM on the possibility of replacing adjudications by some form of quick-play finish in County matches. Mr Douglas had invited the opinions of Counties. In fact no County had offered him an opinion up to the date of the September Executive meeting. Mr Poole said that Middx had debated the question and were generally against adjudication, though they had not yet completed their deliberations.

Forthcoming meetings: The Executive Committee will meet on the 30th November 22nd February and 18th April.

1980 Council Meeting (SCCU AGM): It was decided to hold this on the 14th June.

The Treasurer comments that some cosmetic changes have been made to the (unaudited) accounts presented at the June AGM:

(1) The reserves for unexpired Bulletin subscriptions and sundry creditors have been increased by $\pounds 25$ each.

(2) The £200 insurance money for the lost Shannon Trophy has been put in a reserve fund for a new trophy. The surplus for the year has thus been reduced by £200.

(3) The changes which the Treasurer had tried to make to the previous year's accounts have now been incorporated in this year's figures instead. The deficit on grading has thus been increased by &25; donations have been increased by &10; and junior prizes have been reduced by &15.

AN ALTERNATIVE METHOD OF FINANCING THE GRADING LIST

The following idea is not SCCU policy. I have not discussed it with any of my cleagues on the executive - and I have no intention of taking it any further unicss I receive some support.

The Grading List has high fixed overheads of around £750 this season, the bulk of this being computing. The cost of printing 1000 Grading Lists was £360 this season, giving a total cost of around £1100. Printing 2000 Grading Lists would only cost £230 more, so if we could sell them the price could be almost halved to 70p. A decline in sales, as has happened in recent years, has the opposite effect.

The total cost of producing 5000 would be around £2000 if there was no change in current practice.

Advertising at say £100 per side (the current rate for BCM) would, after printing, make a profit of roughly £75 per side. The 78/79 BCF Yearbook has 12 sides of non-BCF advertising. The October BCM has $7\frac{1}{2}$ sides. Without getting carried away, there is clearly some potential here.

The printing bill for 5000 would be around £1250 at current prices. I'm sure we could do better than that. How about getting one of the chess book publishers to sponsor it? Or approach the Central Council of Physical Recreation that the BCF so carefully joined on our behalf? Alternatively, we could surely find a back-street printer.

The total cost would, I guess, be between £1000 and £1400 - roughly the present cost! This would be met by Payment by Event. The Grading Lists would be distributed "free" to all organisations sending in input. Since there are 4000 graded players in the Union I think we would need to produce 5000 Lists.

There are three categories of Grading List consumer: (1) those who will buy at the current price of £1.25; (2) those who would buy if the price was slashed; (3) those who would not buy at this vastly reduced price.

For this idea to be acceptable category (2) must be much larger than category (3).

Category (1) players are generally the keenest. Congress players for example.

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Category (2) and (3) players are by and large league only players. The rate charged to leagues should therefore be as low as possible. At 2p per game the 10-games-ascason league only player would pay 10p - below the pain threshold in my opinion. If the rate to congresses was 5p per game the total raised from leagues and

congresses would be about £1200. Grading will in due course be taken over by the BCF. As everybody knows, the ordinary player doesn't care two sods and a damn about the Federation because it doesn't appear to do anything for him. Is this not a great opportunity for the BCF to substantially improve its image?

ROUND THE COUNTIES

CAMBS

Lion Yard Simultaneous was held for the second year, in the rain. (If they will play out of doors...) Dugald Macpherson won all but two of his games.

Victorian Fair (14 July) also sported a simul which raised £4.40 at 10p a game. "The appearance of 'The Turk', Cambridge's first chess playing automaton, caused a mild sensation if only because people wondered what kept the cardboard in place." (Tempo) - Yet another simul a few weeks later at the Leisure Fair raised a similar amount.

Bar Hill endgame tournament (25 Sep) attracted 9 entrants.

KENT

Team Lightning Championship (29 Sep) was won by Charlton $25\frac{1}{2}/32$ from Lewisham 24, Hayes $22\frac{1}{2}$, Sidcup $19\frac{1}{2}$... 9 teams played.

John Nunn gave a simul against 27 Thanet players, winning 27-0. "We were all impressed by his friendly (away from the board) manner."

Maidstone Prison have applied to join the Kent League. Unfortunately the restrictions imposed by the authorities have proved an insurmountable stumblingblock, and the application has been reluctantly turned down. Nobody minded the Prison playing all their matches at home(!), but the exclusion of junior players was aukward and there seemed no way in which adequate time could be allowed for matches, or acceptable starting times arranged. (Your Editor has played in friendly matches against the Prison - starting about 9 o'clock on Sunday mornings - and he can recall one occasion on which they inflicted a thumping defeat on Tunbridge Wells.) BUCKS: The experienced Slough team comfortably won the Ul6 section with a 100% record, followed by the Royal Grammar School and John Hampden School (both of High Wycombe). The Ul4 league attracted new teams, being won by John Hampden School from Maidenhead. There are some indications, particularly among the newer teams, that an Ul3 age limit would be preferred to the Ul4 one.

The individual Championship was cancelled this year for lack of entries. Last year's individual final, held over from 1978, was won by Kevin Beedle (Chesham and Amersham).

The Bucks Free Press has offered some financial support for junior chess in the coming year.

A friendly Ul6 match, perhaps combined with an Ul3 one, will be played against Borks - provisionally on the 8th Feb.

LONDON: Once again the London Primary Schools Chess Association has gone from strength to strength. Readers who follow junior events will know that they retained their National title in 1979. Some internal results for the season: Under 11 ChampionsEdward Lee and John Franklin; Under 10 Champion Gavin Wall; best girls Karen Holle and Shelley Metzger; best Under 9 (and Under 8!) Simon Ting. There are now . 161 affiliated schools.

The National Under 11 team Finals will be held in London in 1980. London won the new National Under 9 Team Championship last year.

NEWBURY PARK PRIMARY SCHOOL, REDBRIDGE

As reported in the last issue, Newbury Park have been awarded a BCET Schools Shield this year. Mr TG Cole, their chess teacher, sends this account of their activities.

Chess began at the school with the formation of the Redbridge Primary Schools League in 1971. Newbury Park finished "runners-up" in the first year, and since then has won the league every year except 1974.

However, despite local success, chess at Newbury Park "took off" in the 1975/76 season. The Essex Primary Schools Under 11 tournament came into being during that year, was won by Newbury Park, and has remained in our hands ever since. The Redbiologe League affiliated to the London Primary Schools Association in 1975, and Newbury Park represented this League in the London Under 11 competition in 1976. The trophy, in the shape of a carved elephant, came to us in that year, and has remained, apart from 1978, when we were the "runners-up".

Training sessions are held during the lunch hour. In winter the number of children playing simultaneously can rise as high as 80 (about a third of the total number in the Junior department), with two or three non-playing teachers helping out. . From the time that chess began in the school, the over-riding ambition has been to win the English Primary Schools National Championship. Having been the South of England Champions in the years 1977, 1978 and 1979, we have been involved in the final stages of the competition for the last three years. In 1977 we lost the final to the magnificent Sacred Heart team from Birmingham. The year 1978 saw us knocked out in the semi-finals, and only last year did we finally realize our goal.

On the way to this central achievement, various other successes accrued. The Lloyds Bank Girls' Trophy was won in 1978, and narrowly missed the following year. The North London Under 12 team competition was won in 1977, and we finished "runnersup" in 1978. The school became a zone finalist in the Sunday Times tournament. Amongst the more light-hearted events entered, we became the Essex Under 18 Lightni Champions in 1977.

At the same time as these team triumphs, the children of Newbury Park have experienced many individual successes and honours; far too many to list. These culminated in Edward Lee's achievement of becoming the British Under 11 Champion at . Chester this year. He, and his brother Simon, have been the outstanding players and captains in the school teams.

These team and individual performances were, I feel, the main reason for the • BCET Schools Shield presented to us this year. This of course was a great thrill for all at the school.

REVIEW

46th USSR Chess Championships 1978 Edited by RD Keene, JDM Nunn, RG Wade. Master Chess Publications, 81 Troughton Rd, SE7 7QF 120pp paper covers £2.95 (obtainable from Chess Ltd, The Chess Player Ltd, BCM, and all major suppliers)

All the games of the Final League in figurine algebraic notation, lightly annotated; preceded by all the games of the First League, similarly annotated. 294 games altogether which works out at 1p a game, as near as dammit. Tal, Tseshkovsky, Polugayevsky, Georgadze, Belyavsky, Geller, Romanishin, Sveshnikov, Kasparov... You name them, everyone seems to have been there except Karpov and Petrosian. Complete with Otborochny (it says here) league table, First League table, Final League table, Rabar index (I don't know what that is but knowledgeable readers will), Openings index and illustrations of leading players. That's what's in the book; it's hard for a reviewer to say more about this sort of work unless he's checked it for misprints and I haven't.

I have also received a copy of the <u>Lloyds Bank Masters Tournament Bulletin 1979</u> (available from Peter Morrish, 3 Elmside, 55 Stoneyfields Lane, Edgware HA8 9SG: price £2.50 payable to London Chess Association). This is a 40-page duplicated recontaining 188 games (without annotation) from the Lloyds Bank Masters and Junior Invitation, plus one from a clock simul played by IGM Kraidman against 10 Under 13s. Includes round-by-round summaries, an introduction by Stewart Reuben, and an explanation of the norm qualifications. Lightened by the human touch: buy this bulletin to see who won the Bobby Fischer Memorial Prize for the Most Untranslatable Score!

LLOYDS BANK BRITISH CHESS PROBLEM SOLVING COMPETITION

Readers will have seen the first stage of this competition, a straightforward two-mover, published in various newspapers and bulletins (including this one) earlicr this year. This attracted over 800 entries, of which 416 were correct (and I thought it was easy! -Ed). Successful solvers were posted a further six problems including a 2-mover, a 3-mover (twin), a 2-move self-mate and an endgame study, with about 9 weeks allowed for solving. A total of 180 Stage Two entries were received; 5 entrants scored the maximum possible points.

Arrangements are now being made for a "live" final in London on the 12th January 1980, in which up to 15 of the Stage Two leaders will be invited to compete. Many entries were received from overseas. As the entrants' physical presence at the final is essential, the Bank has offered a special prize for the overseas entrant with most marks in Stage Two. (See also page 12)

Graham Hillyard gave a simul against 21 fellow members of the Billericay Club at the start of the season, "thus continuing a long tradition going way back to the formation of the club in 1978". He scored +18 =3 (T Bennett, S Hubay, R Neil) -0.

TIE-BREAKING: A NEW METHOD

I cannot for the life of me remember where I have read this, so apologies to the unacknowledged inventor, but at a recent Swiss tournament ties were split not by SOS but by Sum of Progressive Scores - so that 1,2,3,4,4 would score higher than 0,1,2,3,4, for example. Seems an excellent idea. It is much easier to calculate than SOS, and has the added advantage that going into the last round you would have a much clearer idea of everyone's potential tie-break scores. It was also claimed, . I think, that SPS is "more accurate" than SOS, but I'm not sure that that means anything. I tried tie-splitting this year's British Championship on SPS to see what would happen, and the results - until I got sick of it - looked broadly similar to • those that SOS would have produced. (Nigel Short still came third.)

SB, of course, has nothing to commend it at all.


