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SOUTHERN COUNTIES CHESS UNION

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Mr Lauder holds the title of Life Vice-President.

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The Executive met at St Brides on Friday 5th February 1982. Present were Messrs Douglas, Bamford, Croker, Dennis, Hooper, Jones, Lean, Lee-Pentecost, Locke, Manning, Morrish, Parker, Poole and Smith. The main items were:

- (1) TCS London Junior Championships: We reported in September that the Union had agreed to guarantee up to £50 against possible loss. Mr Morrish said provisional estimates suggested a loss of about £40.
- (2) "Metropolitan" U18 matches (40 bds): It still isn't clear who "owns" this tournament. Berks still want to play and the problems of fixture congestion have not gone away. Mr Morrish is to prepare a report for discussion.
- (3) Oxon levy: The Executive heard that the BCF is considering the case for a reduced levy number.
- (4) Quick-play grading: It was reported that the BCF is looking into the need for this. Current thinking seems to be that it is not required.
- (5) League affiliation: Subject to a couple of points of detail, the Executive responded favourably to the BCF's proposed system. (See last issue for details.)
- (6) Counties and Districts Correspondence Competitions: Our proposed reform, allowing promotion of 2nd teams to the higher divisions, has finally come up at the BCF Management Board. It was rejected by 8 votes to 5; the voting was not polarised by Unions.
- (7) BCF School Shields: Only one nomination had been received from the Counties so far. The Executive decided that, although it was a perfectly acceptable nomination, there was still time to wait for others. The deadline was thus extended to the 5th March. County junior organisers have been informed.
- (8) Graders Meeting: Mr Locke reported that the meeting held in January had been very successful. There has been a suggestion that it should become a regular event.
- (9) County Competitions: eligibility rules: The points referred to the Executive by the AGM were discussed, but it was decided to postpone final decisions until the next meeting 23.4.82. Counties with proposals to make should contact the Union as quickly as possible.
- (10) Montague-Jones Competition: The Executive was informed of some proposals for radical change put forward by Mr Dennis. These have been sent to the Counties. Details on a later page. (We have already seen these referred to in print as "SCCU proposals", but they are not quite that.)

LETTERS

The first letter has been somewhat abbreviated though without, we hope, detracting from its main points. To clarify the congress-grading issue a bit, we must say that Brian Locke tells us he did inform the congress organisers of the SCCU policy: direct, and as early as October 1980. What happened to Charlton's notification can only be surmised, but it is obvious that it went astray somewhere. As Charlton have now paid a negotiated fee to the BCF, their results have gone to the grader. They will not have been in time for the BCF interim list but will of course go into the 1982 SCCU one.

Mr Locke also asks us to say that congress results for non-SCCU players are sent to their Unions for grading whether the congress has affiliated or not. This is because the policy of the other Unions differs from ours.

Dear Richard,

Many of your readers will be puzzled and perturbed that the large and well-organised Charlton Congress was one of only three congresses in the SCCU which rejected the BCF congress-affiliation scheme.

I would be grateful, therefore, for space in the Bulletin, firstly, to reassure all chess players in the Southern Counties that their games in the 1981 Charlton Congress will go into the grading system, following our payment of a retrospective fee to the BCF.

Secondly, we have notified the BCF that the Charlton Congress this year (1982) will affiliate and participate in the Leigh Grand Prix, a policy which we will endeavour to continue for as long as the Club is able so to do.

Thirdly, I would like to explain why Charlton initially rejected the BCF congress-affiliation scheme and why I, personally, still have the gravest doubts about its validity and effectiveness.

The Charlton Congress was initiated ten years ago by a small group of Charlton CC members and, by virtue of much hard work and a professional standard of efficiency, has expanded year by year to its present position as one of London's leading congresses. The main reason for its inception was the injection of much-needed funds into the Club. It was, of course, also hoped that a number of the country's leading players would compete in the Open Tournament, giving the Club some welcome publicity. It was felt necessary on the first year's entry forms to state that the award of prize money would be conditional on the number of entries! I think it fair to say that the organisers of the first Congress were quite apprehensive about the risks, financial and organisational, that they were taking. One should remember that the Officers of a club are as responsible in law for debts incurred as any Directors of a business or firm.

However, the organisers took the risks (and it is salutary to remind everybody, including the BCF, that they still do) and Charlton CC have benefitted every year by sometimes large and sometimes derisory excesses of income over expenditure. I would remind

everybody that this money is used to benefit chess players who use Charlton House, whether at the Club, as members of the Kent County and visiting teams or as participants in the many chess events held there. We have installed chandeliers, doubling the lighting, and we have plans to carpet the Long Gallery, making it one of the best chess venues in London and Kent.

It has not been easy. We have had problems most of all with the hiring of a suitable venue. We had to move out of Charlton House in the early days owing to problems over staffing and overtime; the Congress was a financial failure the year we were forced to move to central London and, although Thames Polytechnic with its two large halls gave us our best financial return, we were unable to use it in 1981 simply because the halls were being redecorated. We were notified of this terribly late in the year and had to desperately cast around for another venue.

Fortunately, our Club has such a good name with the Greenwich Borough Council that we were able to persuade them to let us have Charlton House plus a grant of £200 to offset the increased rental charges for which we had not budgeted.

I have gone into some detail here to emphasise the extreme fragility of a congress, and ours is not in any way dependent on large sums of money by way of sponsorship for its existence. Too many congresses have failed as soon as sponsorship was withdrawn.

Charlton rejected the affiliation scheme initially simply because we were not satisfied that the "benefits" offered by the BCF justified the extra expenditure by us. At that time we had budgeted on the basis of previous experience, but also bearing in mind the fact that nearly all congresses are down about 10-20% on entries. 400 entries to the Congress would have meant a payment to the BCF of £120! The entry forms were in the pipeline and we had no time to add the 30p entry fee which the BCF gaily recommend. At that time, too, we were unaware that unaffiliated congresses might not be graded. In the event, the Congress achieved 303 entries and just about broke even.

It seems to me that, at the very least, there has been a lamentable lack of consultation between the BCF and the SCCU Executive and no co-operation at all. The BCF have clearly indicated that they would look sympathetically on problems during the transitional period. Merton had a big problem. They ran out of money! However, the BCF suggestion that the SCCU should accept the Merton results was curtly rejected.

I firmly believe that the BCF affiliation scheme was wrongly conceived and has been appallingly mishandled. Only about 60% of congresses have affiliated. Those that are forced to affiliate under pressure that their results will not be graded will look with some hostility to the BCF (even though that decision comes from a Union). That 10p per game can so easily rise to 20p, 50p or more. I believe that the fragmentary nature of British chess organisation will lead to the most appalling mix-up over who is affiliated and graded and who isn't. At the moment, chess players are paying a club subscription (or an individual sub) which registers them with their County and the BCF. They also pay the "board fee" at affiliated congresses, but not to County and BCF-affiliate congresses.

Apparently, we must now look forward to the eventual replacement of the levy system by this hotch-potch of unconnected "taxation" schemes and "payment by event" extending down to the smallest club tournament. The affiliation of leagues will no doubt produce more confusion.

In Mr Reuben's words, in another context: "A most peculiar state of affairs."

PS In case anyone thinks I am destructively critical without offering any viable alternatives, why can't the BCF (if they wish to raise more money) simply increase the levy and tighten up on BCF registration of all chess players?

Dear Mr Haddrell,

I don't normally have time to engage in discussions by post, especially with two-month intervals between replies, but recent correspondence has interested me.

(1) I do not think I have ever had occasion before to disagree with Stewart Reuben over an interpretation of a Law of Chess, but find I do so now. Specifically, I believe that until a player's hand has quitted a newly-promoted piece, the move is not complete (so he might possibly lose on time) and that he retains the right to nominate what piece to substitute for his pawn. To say (as does Kevin Thurlow in the same Bulletin) that this is illogical as "the Queen has been touched on the board" does not seem right to me for, basically, causing a piece to appear out of the box or from off the edge of a chessboard does not appear to me to be in any way comparable with touching a piece already on the chessboard. To say (Stewart Reuben) that the matter is trivial because it will never happen is wrong. It has happened and I was once called upon to rule upon it. Fortunately the red herring of unspoken advice from a spectator did not arise, else I should first have had to rule on that one (and eject the spectator).

(2) Turning to the interpretation of the Rules for Quick-play finishes, I find it hard to believe the circumstances were as described and that George Goodwin actually ruled a Draw simply because a player was 2 pawns up in a R+P ending at the time. If he

did, he was wrong. But I'll bet there were other circumstances!

(3) Finally, on the matter of payment-for-grading, I am well aware that Mr Haddrell and I are not going to agree about it, but nevertheless I wish to comment that the BCF and SCCU, who do nothing to organise the actual events and bear none of the financial risk, nor pay the actual graders, have a nerve expecting a cut of the profits for no service other than a twice-yearly computer run. It is a Congress Tax and at least the BCF Congress Director (the same Stewart Reuben) is honest enough to admit it (in a previous letter to myself). How mean, therefore, to deny grading to Merton Congress, which had intended to subscribe, but which actually lost a lot of money, not out of BCF or SCCU pockets but out of the Organiser's. Shame on SCCU and shame on BCF. A pox on both their heads.

Dear Mr Haddrell,

Continuing the discussion of Quick-play finishes in gradeable tournaments, over the years I have seen several decisions made by officials which not only appeared to be unfair to one player or another, but were actually opposite to decisions taken by other officials in similar competitions. I believe the basic problem with the "Rules", if you can properly call them by that name, is that they are open to all sorts of interpretations, and even, God forbid, abuse!

The only solution to the present state of affairs is to have a set of hard and fast rules which leave no room for error. Players would thus know exactly where they stood and so would the officials. Such a set of rules may seem unfair in some positions but let's face it, this type of finish is artificial anyway - ranking in my view with the taking of penalties to decide a soccer match. Skill is undoubtedly needed but it remains a bit of a lottery.

In a game of chess the onus is on the players themselves to make claims affecting the outcome of the game, so why not in QP as well? If a flag falls, it's a bit late in my opinion to claim that one has a draw anyway, since the game has finished the moment the time ran out. Claims should be made before the flag falls and the rules should incorporate this point. A player with a substantial advantage will then have to decide whether to play for the win, and risk losing, or settle for the draw. I think it unfair to allow a player the option of threshing around randomly hoping a win will turn up and then claim a draw if he loses on time. Also a player with K in the corner against a RP should be given the opportunity to call a halt. To continue in such drawn positions (not just theoretical draws but dead draws) makes a mockery of the game.

I have enclosed a draft of my own thoughts in rule form, which you may wish to publish for general discussion. (See later: -Ed) I believe they would be fairly easy to police and players could learn how to use them as quickly as the present rules.

On another matter, under the Laws of Chess Supplement 4, regulation 9(e) a blind player may have the fact that his opponent's flag has fallen pointed out to him by an assistant. As a County captain I have in cases where my team's players are involved in time trouble, stood by the board and as soon as either flag has fallen, have pointed out to both players. Is this wrong? If it is wrong, does a game which has finished by law continue in fact because the players haven't noticed - even though someone else has? What about a player who notices his own flag is down? Can he play on? And if he does, is he cheating?

If outside witnesses are not allowed to interfere, what happens when they do? It was suggested to me recently by a young but strong player that outside interference should result in the loss of the game by the player who had apparently won!

I look forward to your views on these questions since I have been rather worried by them.

Ed: Since you ask... I don't think there can be any doubt that match captains should intervene (especially as the sort of matches most of us play in don't have controllers anyway). Personally, I think any spectator should intervene on very simple matters of fact like flag-fall. Provided he's right! FIDE wouldn't agree with me, I don't think. The player who plays on knowing his flag is down is cheating. And I presume the young but strong player was joking. (Haddrell's views on flag-fall would fill a small book but if you really want some of them look up your carefully preserved copy of issue 135.)

QUICK FINISH RULES

We give here (slightly edited) Mr Stewardson's suggested playing rules. We have reservations, but we have reservations about the usual sort too.

- A. The player whose flag falls first loses, unless his opponent has only a bare K (draw).
- B. A player may on his move stop his clock and claim a draw on any of the following grounds. No play after such a claim will be allowed. The draw will be upheld if -
 1. Opponent has K+B or K+N v anything (unless there is an immediate forced mate)

2. Opponent has K+N+N v bare K
 3. " " K+N+N v K+piece or pieces (no Ps)
 4. " " K+P v K+piece if either K or protected piece covers the progress of the P
 5. " " K+RP v K in corner of RP
 6. " " K+RP+B v K in corner of RP, provided it is the "wrong" B
 7. " " K+B+P v K+B of the other colour, if B covers progress of the P
 8. " " K+Ps v K+advantage of 9 "points"* minimum. (Opponent's Ps on 6th and 7th ranks count as Qs)
 9. " " K+pieces v K+ advantage of double material (unless forced mate available)
 10. " " K+Ps+ v advantage of 9 pts minimum, provided no P of opponent is pieces beyond the 4th rank
11. Player has perpetual check.
12. Position recurs 3 times. Player may substantiate this by means of game score or witnesses, or call controller who will stop the game if he sees repetitions.
- C. Incorrect claims lose.
- D. Illegal moves lose if the opponent makes a claim; stand otherwise. Any move leaving K in check is deemed illegal.

* Pts: P=1, N/B=3, R=5, Q=9

Mr Stewardson would require score to be kept until you have less than 2 minutes left.

Can you be as mechanical as this? Any views?

MONTAGUE-JONES

Nigel Dennis has come up with some ideas for a complete reorganisation of the Montague Jones competition. He believes this to be necessary because (a) travelling distances are too great; (b) partly as a result of this, the competition is now down to 7 teams; and (c) it is not very satisfactory to mix 1st and 2nd teams in the same league. He proposes:

(1) A new competition for the 3 1st teams not in the Championship, double round APA. (Currently at least this would be geographically sensible.) The winner would be promoted to the Championship. Matches would be on "Championship" days.

(2) A new 2nd team competition open to all Counties, divided into 2 sections:
 North - Norfolk, Suffolk, Cambs, Beds, Herts, Essex. }
 South - Kent, Sussex, Surrey, Berks, Oxon, Bucks. } Middx to choose N or S each year
 Within each section, there could be either a single APA or 2 regional APAs + play-off. Mr Dennis suggests that a play-off between the N and S winners would not be necessary.

Counties would be able to enter more than one "2nd" team and Counties on the N-S border might have teams in both sections.

Eligibility: No player would be allowed to play for more than 1 "2nd" team. Players would become ineligible after 4 appearances in the Championship; but in the case of Counties whose 1st team was not in the Championship, there would be no restrictions at all on players representing both 1st and 2nd teams. No nominations or grading limits.

Matches would be on the current MJ (i.e. non-Championship) dates.

The Championship competition would be unchanged. The Amboyna would be unchanged, except for a relaxation in the eligibility rules: players would be disqualified after one appearance in the Championship, but could make any number of appearances in both 2nd and 3rd teams. We cannot find any mention of players representing 1st and 3rd teams where the 1st team is not in the Championship. Perhaps that wouldn't arise.

Ebony: This competition has become very small. No decision would be taken on whether to hold an Ebony league until the fixture list for the other competitions had been distributed.

Copies of the proposals have gone to all County match captains for their comments; we have summarised them here because they seem to be of general interest. Mr Dennis hopes that decisions could be taken at the AGM on the 19th June. (We have heard the proposals described as "confusing", incidentally, but don't see it.)

INTERIM GRADING LIST: SCCU SERVICES

The SCCU has now produced its interim (Spring) grading list on the Grieveson, Grant computer. It has gone to the BCF for inclusion in the combined Union list, to be published by the BCF, probably in March. The SCCU list will not be published separately.

The interim list will include results from congresses played in the summer (say May - September 1981 but we're not sure about the final date). Players without congress results from this period are by and large not included.

Once the BCF list is published, clubs may also have certain data direct from the SCCU by special order: (a) If you bought a club list dated 16.9.81 you can send an SAE for the additional interim data. (b) If you didn't, you can still have the 16.9.81 data, plus interim additions, for £0.50 plus SAE. (c) County lists are available, with interim additions, for £5. REVIEW

BENT LARSEN'S GOOD MOVE GUIDE Translated from the Danish by Lene Knudsen and Ken Whyld.

Algebraic. Oxford University Press Paper covers £4.95 136pp

This is an amalgamation of four slim volumes originally published in Danish. The volumes are here preserved as (1) "Find the Combination"; (2) "Find the Plan"; (3) "Find the Master Moves"; and (4) "Practical Endgames". (3) is a collection of 40 brevities presented on a "How good is your chess?" basis, with minimal comment but plenty of points to be earned - usually only one move scores, but then the games have been chosen so that usually only one move is right. The other sections consist of diagram positions with solutions hidden away at the end. (1) - 100 positions - is pretty conventional, the usual bedtime solve-it-off-the-diagram sort of thing. (2) is far more demanding: 48 positions in which the reader is asked to sit down, evaluate things and form a plan. "Solutions" here are full and helpful, starting with general observations and progressing to what actually happened or (sometimes) ought to have. (4) is 60 endgame positions with the emphasis on tactics rather than technical niceties. Solutions again are full and readable.

A nice little book with something for the browser as well as the more serious character. Diagrams OK; print very clear though small (so there's a lot more here than some publishers would get into 136 pages). Good value.
