The Executive met on Friday 23rd April 1982. Present were Messrs Douglas, Bamford, Parker, Dennis, Fewell, Haddrell, Horn, Jones, Lauder, Lean, Lee-Pentecost, Locke, Manning, Poole, Richmond. The main items were:

(1) Berks Juniors. We have reported several times that Berks were trying to get into the "Metropolitan" U18 competition. They still are. The subject came up again, but progress is painfully slow and there was a suggestion that Berks should raise it at the AGM 19.6.82. To repeat ourselves, the main problem is one of fixture congestion. There is also some doubt about who owns the competition (there are no written rules!) though the SCCU certainly appears to run it.

(2) Oxon levy. An Oxon appeal against their levy number of 2 is pending.

(3) Congresses/Leagues. There was some very general discussion on the desirability of offering Council representation to Congresses and (?eventually) Leagues. There was no attempt to reach a consensus, let alone a decision, but the idea is there.

(4) Money. The Treasurer produced provisional accounts 1981-2 and budget 82-3. We are heading for a loss of about £90 this year, mostly due to declining sales of Grading Lists (around 800, out of a run of 1000) and a contribution to the TCS London Junior event. Losses on the entire grading operation are very roughly £200, if we read the figures aright; on the other hand we benefit indirectly from the BCF Congress-affiliation scheme, which is tied in with grading. It was suggested we might charge more realistically for the computer-produced club grading lists.

It was agreed to propose the following figures at the AGM: Levy £8 per point; Bulletin sub £2.30; Grading List £1.70 (bulk £1.50). Current figures are £6; £2; £1.60 (£1.40).

(5) AGM 19.6.82 The Executive is to seek a central venue. St Brides, of course, is no longer available on Saturdays. Executive nomination for President is BA Fewell; Deputy President J Poole. All other Officers are willing to stand again and are nominated by the Executive.

It was decided that we cannot practicably send notice of the AGM to County reps since we normally do not know in advance who they are going to be. (Yearbook entries are unreliable.) Notice will be sent in triplicate to County Secretaries. If you are a County rep, please note this. We tend to get complaints that reps have not been informed. The date at least you know.

(6) Inter-County competitions. There was much discussion of a plan by NW Dennis for regionalising the MJ. Details in the last issue. Some supported regionalisation, but others were quite happy with the status quo. It was obvious that we must not take hasty action, and a sub-committee has been set up to consult the Counties and see what changes, if any, are desirable. No changes are envisaged before 1983-4.

(7) BCF Finance Meeting 15.5.82

The Union delegates will support the BCF's proposed levy figure, but with a strong recommendation that the Federation seek other sources of income or try to cut their costs. In particular, it was felt there must be ways of avoiding VAT by re-arranging things. (At least two Counties intend to vote for a levy of £73 per point, the current figure and about £10 less than the BCF wants.)

(8) BCET School Shields. The Union is to make two nominations (unusual, but the BCF say it is allowed). We never publish the names of nominated schools until the BCF's decision is made.

(9) BCF Travel Grant. This was abolished last year ("by accident", according to one Executive member) and Kent seek its restitution. Board fees, of course, were not abolished. One problem is that VAT would immediately swallow up 15% of the grant; it was suggested that this could be avoided if the Union handled the finances itself. The Executive is to think further.

(10) Bucks Golden Jubilee. Mr Parker wished to thank the President for attending the Jubilee Match, and Kent for re-arranging the date and venue to make it possible.

The Executive does not meet again until after the AGM.

IMPORTANT NOTICE

for those who didn't read the above. The SCCU Annual Council Meeting (AGM) is on Sat 19 June 1982 at a venue to be fixed. Formal notice will be sent to County Secretaries but not to County reps. Counties have 3 reps. Notice goes out at least 3 weeks in advance; if reps do not hear something soon after this they are recommended to prod their County Secretaries.

LETTERS

A reply to JA Speigel (issue 144):

Dear Mr Haddrell,

The SCCU bill for computer grading services at Grieveson, Grant and Co last year (Oct 80 to Sep 81) was just over £600. Several more hundreds were spent on printing (published list and master list) and postage. Just during the summer months I kept a record of well over 100 hours of my own time freely given in the office at Grieveson, Grant for programming and data handling work. I am happy to give this time free provided that those who

benefit are at least prepared to pay the total cost by whatever scheme the SCCU may devise. People are no longer prepared to buy the grading list in sufficient numbers and at sufficient cost to cover the total bill, so the shortfall must be made up. I think the present scheme of charging congresses to be graded is perfectly reasonable. This scheme is much more satisfying than charging players to have their grade published. I would object to doing the work I do if only to have half the output curtailed because certain players were not registered. If Mr Speigel can suggest a more satisfactory method for the SCCU to cover its costs I am sure the Treasurer will be pleased to hear it.

Dear Mr Haddrell,

...I notice that in the last issue of the SCCU Bulletin you note that in the match Surrey III v Essex III, on board 4 (Virk v Shaw), the former was given a win on adjudication despite having claimed a draw, and you query the legality of this. This is, in fact, incorrect, since I had claimed a win, not a draw, but nonetheless as a point of law I see no reason why a player should not be given a win when claiming a draw if the adjudicator thinks the position is a win (though arguably he could lose his deposit), just as a player can be given a draw if he claims a win.

Ed:- I didn't actually query the legality of this, I just said I'd always wondered if it was possible - which isn't quite the same thing. I don't see it as a "point of law" at all, rather a point of adjudication rules. The rules don't cover it, and I think they should. Otherwise the practice may vary from adjudicator to adjudicator.
