## EDITORIAL Happy new year

## EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

The Executive met on Friday 26th November 1982 at St Brides. 15 attended. In the occasional flashes of silence granted by the men making holes in the road outside, the following business was conducted.

(1) SCCU equipment. Surrey, who hold the equipment, are to pay the Union £30 a year for its use. Other organisations wishing to hire it will pay a negotiated fee to

(2) <u>Junior matches</u>. At present, the cost of hiring the Highbury venue is shared equally between competing counties. There was some feeling that Middx, whose travelling expenses are lowest, should pay more. No decision was taken.

(3) BCF levy appeals. The BCF had still made no decision on the appeals of Cambs and Beds. We understand that Beds, noting the decision was overdue, have told the BCF

they are assuming it will be favourable.

(4) Inter-County competitions. The sub-committee reported that 11 Counties had returned the questionnaire. There was quite a lot of interest in regionalisation, and 5 Counties had said they would prefer 16 (or even 12) boards. By and large, Counties were satisfied with the number of matches they were getting at present. Surprisingly (to your Editor at any rate), only one County said it was tending to lose players and four were actually gaining more. Most were fairly happy with the existing eligibility rules. The majority in favour of adjudications as opposed to quick-play finishes is now small. Obviously there is still work to do before the sub-committee comes up with concrete proposals, but the data are starting to emerge. (It was suggested that a poll of players themselves, on things like QP finishes, could easily be arranged at matches.) The East Anglian Union proposals are still there; a meeting of 5 interested Coun-

es is scheduled for this month. The Executive discussed a number of points to be raised at the (5) BCF matters. BCF Management Board on the following day. One was a proposed increase in the number of "National Club" events. For those who haven't heard, there could be 3 or even 4 competitions next year, with grading limits going down to 130 or 115. The BCF has already sought clubs' views on this, though we're not sure if their inquiries have gone as far as clubs not currently competing. There was some feeling on the Executive that

four competitions would be too much of a good thing.

(6) SCCU individual championship. Fred Manning reported, to general consternation, that the Surrey Congress committee no longer feels able to accommodate the SCCU Champa onship as a separate event. The Executive felt quite strongly that incorporation in a large Swiss would be unsatisfactory; which meant we had to find somewhere else or drop the Championship for a year. In view of the always-unrepresentative entry, some favoured the latter. Other counsels prevailed, and efforts are now under way to find another venue. There seems no objection to holding the event at the beginning of May, avoiding the Easter counter-attractions. Will anyone with constructive suggestions to make please contact the SCCU President, BA Fewell, as soon as possible. (By the time you read this, the problem may have been solved. If so, more news on a later page.)

# (not all about grading)

Dear Mr Haddrell,

Many thanks for publishing my letter in the November 1982 SCCU Bulletin. With regard to my ungraded County match, as you correctly stated in your (private) reply my opponent does not appear on the 1981 grading list. However he does appear on the Elo list and I included a note to this effect on my analysis submitted to Brian Locke.

As to the two leagues, I have now spoken with Mr \*\*\*\*\* who has stated that my game played 26.3.82 will appear in the 1982/83 list. I have also spoken with Mr \*\*\*\*\*\* who confirms that a mistake has been made.

To date I have received no response from Mr Gunther about the County game.

I would like to make a few observations about the current grading structure. a system that is able to include results from the British Championship played in August, in a list published in September, but at the same time is incapable of including league and County matches played in March, has got to have something fundamentally wrong with its organisation. At the very least it requires a good 0 and M study to help sort out

the problems. Second, there ought to be an easy way for a player to query his grade and have any mistakes corrected. The present situation where the victim is pushed from one person in the graders' chain to another is totally unacceptable.

Ed: In a later letter, Mr Norman suggests that the Union should have an officer responsible for handling all grading queries of this sort. It would be a difficult, and unpaid, job. Any volunteers in Shepperton? On the other points: The British Championship is surely a special case, and of course March results do normally go in. A grader has made the point that ideally the grading season should be extended by one month to the end of May. Mr Norman's ungraded County game was the one on which we said last time that we couldn't agree with his figure. He has, of course, ignored the master list (which wouldn't have been much help anyway, as it turns out) and gone to Elo. Must admit this possibility hadn't occurred to us.

We have also had a letter from Mr Gunther, the man who didn't grade the County game. As his letter is rather long, and hard to edit, we summarise the first part. To clear the name of at least one grader, Mr Gunther explains why Mr Norman's letters to him went unanswered. The first never arrived; the second was incorrectly addressed and took more than a fortnight to reach him. This second letter (which we have seen) is to say the least rather undiplomatic. Mr Gunther has told the Bulletin, if he hasn't told Mr Norman, that he thought the master list information on the opponent far too sketchy for him to grade the game; he has put it on one side in order to grade it later with more information, and it should go in next time. (Whether he considered the Elo rating we don't know, but it was totally at variance with the master list data anyway.)

Mr Gunther concludes:

If anyone would like to speak to me about grading (e.g. how it's done) they could give me a phone number to ring as I am not on the phone (but reversed charges please - I haven't claimed any grading expenses since 1976 and can't afford to pay for the call) and I will gladly explain any problem I can. I make this offer because, whenever I go to a congress, I take my master list with me and very often people who think they understand grading ask if they can look at it; and very often I find myself explaining how it works to more than one person. At one match I was at I explained how you got a grade to one man, and when he crossed my path again 3 or 4 years later he hadn't a clue how the grading system works.

Regarding Mr Norman's last comment (issue 148): "We never make mistakes", I admit I do. But so do match captains — or the Bulletin, I am not sure which. Example: issue 148, page 8, Ebony match (there's only one). Board 11, Surrey IV: Dr B Swetman (sic). Two things I would like to know here: (1) What does "sic" mean after the name? (2) Who is Dr B Swetman? In the list I have a Dr B Sweetman. Is this a new player or a spelling error? If a spelling error who made it, the captain or the typist? When I come to grade it I will take it as Sweetman with 2 e's. I haven't started grading yet but I am willing to bet anyone £100 that I find at least one other error. (No takers in the Editorial office —Ed)

In fact an idea has just come to me. I will put pen to paper in June 83 and let your readers know about all the errors I find in the County Championship and the Fbony.

I take this chance of thanking you for reading this letter and I ask you if you could publish it in the Bulletin with my correct address.

Ed: I'll look forward to the lowdown on mistakes, and promise complete candour about the proportion that are my fault. "Swetman" wasn't: "sic" is the typist's way of saying that an error, or apparent error, isn't his. I used to correct such "mistakes" whenever I noticed them, but don't any more unless I'm absolutely sure. Who knows, there really could be a new player called Swetman. Or maybe everybody's been spelling the name wrong all this time. So I type what I'm given, and put "sic" to let the grader know that I have. If it doesn't say that, then either I've not noticed the "error" or (heaven forbid) it really is my mistake.

Dear Mr Haddrell,

I have read the rather acrimonious correspondence about grading in your November issue. May I as a grader be permitted to make some observations?

You yourself touched lightly on the subject of late results, though I very much doubt whether you realise the extent. About the end of July or possibly in August I received the final results of the Surrey leagues. These comprised 43 matches ranging from 12 a side to 6, according to the competition or division, totalling 331 games. Only the competitions secretary can explain this, but it is well known that many match results are delayed by adjudications. It would certainly be an improvement if results

were circulated without waiting for adjudications, as you do with County matches.

Obviously all these games failed to appear in last season's figures, but I shall include them with this season's results applying current gradings. Hence a player who tries to fix his grading for season B and finds that it does not agree with his official grading should make some trial calculations by omitting some end-of-season results, which will be carried over into season C, and adding some late results from season A.

Another matter, of lesser importance, is club championships. One of my statistical fads is to encourage Surrey clubs to send me the results of their internal competitions, provided that they are serious competitive chess played with clocks at conventional club rates of play. Actually only 5 of the 24 clubs that compete in the Surrey leagues bother to do so. But I dare say that there are many competitors who are unaware whether their tournament secretary reports their performances or not.

Thanks for SCCU Bulletin 148. Regarding your mate in 12 (8/8/q2n4/8/plp5/8/K2RR3/5k2 White to move), I have not seen this before but I was intrigued enough to work it out. The main variation is:

1 Rh2 Kgl 2 Rdg2+ Kfl 3 Rc2 Kgl 4 Rhe2 Kfl 5 Red2 Kel 6 Rg2 Kfl 7 Rcf2+ Kel 8 Rb2 Kfl 9 Rgd2 Kel 10 Rdc2 Kdl 11 Kbl and 12 Rcl mate. (Or more prosaically: 8..Qb6 b6 Nb5 10 Rb5 Kfl 11 Rc2 and 12 Rbl mate)
As will be seen, the main point is the devices of the White Rooks in shepherding

the Black King to his fate at dl while he endeavours to escape back to hl.

Farlier deviations by Black lose more quickly, e.g. l...Kel 2 Rc2 Kdl 3 Rhd2+ Kel 4 Rg2 Kfl (4...Kdl 5 Rb2 Qb6 6 Rb2 and mate in 2) 5 Rcf2+ Kel 6 Rb2 reaching the position after move 8 in the main line.

I hope this is right!

#### NEW LAWS

In case you missed it in the December Newsflash, the FIDE Congress at Lucerne made two new rules.

- (1) Rule 8.2(b) now stipulates that if you touch one of your own pieces and one of your opponent's, you must capture the one with the other if possible; and if this is not possible you must move or capture the first one touched. This is at least the third version of this rule we've had in the last 10 years, and it is far superior (in the Bulletin's opinion...) to the other two.
- (2) Another extension of the 50 move rule. You now have 100 moves if the material is -White: Pa2 + K + R; Black: Pa3 + K + KB. Also, if the cryptic parenthesis means what it ought to mean, appropriate reflections and rotations of this position.
- . There is also a new Interpretation to Article 18.1 which alters nothing and seems to have been just a response to a silly question. At least we think it alters nothing but FIDE have such a way of woffling around a point that it's hard to be sure. Look it up if interested: we decline to copy it out. To judge from PB's note his reaction was similar to ours.
- "We should also like to acknowledge the advice and help of our editors, to whom all errors in spelling should be attributed." From the authors' preface to a not-very-recent B\*tsf\*rd book.

Jeff Douglas, tournament controller, reminds match captains that he will be abroad from 15th Jan to 15th Feb 1983. Results, and adjudication claims, should still be sent to his address in the normal way and will be processed as quickly as possible on his return. Postmarks may be used as evidence in case of disputes!

It seems unlikely that adjudications will need urgent attention, but if <u>both</u> match captains think it necessary, they can be sent direct to the BCF adjudications secretary. Take care to observe all the rules if you do this, and don't do it unless you really have to.

In response to a query, Jeff points out that 10 points should <u>not</u> be added to juniors' grades when determining eligibility. There is no such rule. However, the SCCU may consider introducing one.

G Woodhead (Surrey II) had great difficulty getting a team together on the 11th Dec. He attributes this partly to a simultaneous Surrey III match, and partly to the counterattractions of Christmas shopping. He suggests that (1) no adjacent teams (e.g I and II or II and III) should play simultaneously; and (2) no matches should be played within 2 weeks either side of Christmas. (1) is more or less the rule anyway; the clash was presumably the result of re-arrangement.

We have no result yet for Kent v Suffolk (MJ) 20.11.82 though we feel sure it's been played. Everything else seems to be there. But about 30% of the results published have been received from one side only. It really does help if both sides will send results to the Bulletin; if only to minimise confusion over players' names. (Strangely enough, it sometimes happens that a player's own match captain gets his name wrong while the other side gets it right.) And we know we're crying in the wilderness, but how about full initials next time? And legible handwriting? That's the ritual grouses for this issue. And if you don't know what "sic" means, see page 2...
