OBITUARY: BRIAN GIBBS LOCKE

May 1983

Many will have been saddened by the sudden death of Brian Locke, who collapsed on the 31st March at Horsham railway station while on his way to work. He was 53.

Brian was the son of Robert Locke, a former manager of the Westminster Bank at Hatch End, whose father was a mayor of Aylesbury. Brian was educated at St Johns School, Pinner, and at Merchant Taylors, Northwood. In 1959 he married Honor Jackman of Pinner. Both Brian and Honor were members of the Pinner and Hatch End Light Operatic Society and performed in a number of Gilbert and Sullivan productions. Brian's job with the Sun Alliance Insurance Group took him to Horsham in 1964 and, though the firm moved him back to Iondon later in a more senior capacity, he continued to live in Horsham and was much involved with amateur operatics there until his death.

Although Brian was a keen chess player who participated in many congresses, he was perhaps better known as an able administrator. He joined the Harrow Club in the late 1940s and was their honorary secretary from 1950 until 1961. From 1953 until 1959 he was also secretary of the Middx Association, and he remained on their executive committee until 1962. He served Horsham Chess Club as Treasurer, and later as Auditor and tournament controller. He became SCCU Secretary in 1972 and continued in that capacity until being elected Deputy President in 1976 and President in 1977/8. In 1974 he became SCCU Grading Secretary, combining that job for a while with that of Secretary. He remained Grading Secretary until his death. Only a few will know how much time he devoted to this job, and how hard he will be to replace.

Brian leaves a widow, two sons and a daughter. Our condolences to them and to his many friends, in chess and opera alike.

EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

The Executive met, for the last time before the Annual Council Meeting, at St Brides on Friday 22nd April. 16 attended. The main points of general interest were: 1. <u>SCCU Individual Championship</u>. Readers will already know that this is to be held alongside the Upminster Congress 28-30 May. It appears that it will clash with a oneday Quick-play event, offering high cash prizes, of which the Bulletin knows next to nothing. We can only hope this will not draw off too many of the best players.

Some felt we ought to make the maximum publicity capital out of the event. We could, for example, send winners' details to their local papers. We might, indeed, have a formally elected Publicity Officer. (The Bulletin notes that the BCF one, with budgeted expenditure around £3000, cannily says: "As with all publicity the return on investment is nearly impossible to measure.")

2. <u>East Anglian Chess Union</u>. By the time you read this the EACU will in all probability exist. Some things discussed:

(a) <u>Cambridge University</u>. The Executive could see no objection to admitting a University team to the SCCU Championship competition, provided it called itself Cambridgeshire and paid the full Cambs levy to the Union. Admitting a University team as such could set an unfortunate precedent. What would happen to the Cambs 2nd team playing in the EACU if the University appropriated the County title is unclear.
(b) <u>Grading</u>. No real problem; the FACU list for 1983 would, as already reported, be merely an extract from the SCCU one. It was agreed we ought not to make any charge for SCCU data provided to the EACU.

(c) <u>SCCU assets</u>. It was felt we should make over £100 to the new Union. This is about the sum suggested by the levy payments of the EACU Counties.

(d) <u>Trophies</u>. It had been suggested we could hand over two trophies that are not currently competed for. On closer examination there was some doubt whether the two really were spare: one of them, though not dusted down for years, may actually be in official use. Investigations continue.

3. <u>AGM 11 June 1983</u>. This is to be held at a hotel in Bayswater; formal notice to Counties in due course. Apart from the usual items, there will obviously be something on the EACU. Efforts will be made to have Officers' Reports circulated with the notice rather than presented orally.

4. Draft Budget. Subject to confirmation, the accounts will look much healthier than expected. (There may be a surplus of several hundreds of pounds.) It is intended to propose a levy reduction from £8 per point to maybe £6, and no increase in the cost of grading list or Bulletin. (Both are in surplus this year.)

5. British Chess Educational Trust. The Executive decided on its nomination. Or rather two nominations; we are surely big enough to merit two, though traditionally it's only one per Union. We piloted two through last year. As always, we are keeping quiet about the names of the schools until the BCF has made its decision. 6. Default claims. Jeff Douglas informed the Executive that he had approved a number

6. Default claims. Jeff Douglas informed the Executive that he had approved a number of claims for compensation. One was against a Middx I team which had just failed to turn up for an away match v Sussex, having given no notice whatever. (Middx now have a new match captain.)

7. <u>Berks Juniors</u>. The participation of Berks in the "Metropolitan" U18 matches is once again in serious doubt. Partly fixture congestion, partly expense, and partly the weakness of their team. The Executive sympathised with Berks.

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"METROPOLITAN" JUNIOR MATCHES

About that last item on page 1. County Junior organisers are notoriously lone operators. Nigel Dennis excepted, you can't get them to committee meetings. So in the hope of provoking a response, a suggestion from the Editor:

I understand Berks's wish to play with the four stronger Counties, in what is after all an SCCU competition. The odd match against Oxon, say, over not many boards, may not be enough for them. But I can also understand the frustration engendered by bringing a player from the depths of Kent or Essex to play someone very much weaker than him. Look at some of the scorelines from last season. Couldn't the problem be at least partly solved by turning the competition into an Under 16 one, but allowing Berks to go on fielding an Under 18 side? This would also help with the fixture congestion as it would be less important to avoid clashes with adult County match dates. Or you could bring the number of fixtures back down to three by holding jamborees.

All right, so what are the objections?

No BCF officer has taken up the challenge to explain the grading rule, but we've stirred them on other fronts:

Dear Mr Haddrell,

Having just received the Bulletin for March 1983 I have read therein the letter by Robert Richmond headed "A change to the appeal rules?" and your comments on it. One of my last acts as Director of Home Chess and Services was to redraft completely the BCF Adjudication and Appeal Rules to cover, inter alia, just the point raised in that letter. After discussion of this draft with the Adjudications Secretary, Hugh Phillips, and the new Director, Peter Wilson, and after the incorporation of various suggestions from them, the final result was printed in the BCF Year Book of Chess 1982-3, and the relevant extract reads:

"Where one or more games in a match have been adjudicated and an appeal is made against one or more of the decisions

8. The opposing side may submit counter-appeal(s) in the same or any other of the adjudicated games in the same match... Such counter-appeals must comply with Rules B 3-7."

Rules B 3-7 include the requirement for a full analysis to accompany the counter-appeal. It might not be a bad idea for those who wish to complain about rules to read the

latest version before rushing into print. At any rate, I think you yourself might allow that these rules do now "***** well say so"! Yours sincerely,

Ed: Not guilty, I did read them. And I don't allow that the rule quoted covers the case of analysis sent in support of an adjudicator's decision, which is what it was all about. It's a question of what you mean by "counter-appeal", and the rules don't say. This has fast degenerated into a private game in which I am attempting, purely for my own amusement, to convince the BCF that their Rules want changing. But the important thing to note is that analysis in support of the original decision is accepted. Jeff Douglas, SCCU County Match Controller, confirms that he has interpreted it this way all along. I doubt if he's been called on to apply the rule yet. And though the rules actually say otherwise, such analysis does not have to be accompanied by a fee. I have absolutely no quarrel with the BCF's practical application of the Rule.
