EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

The Executive met on Friday 27th April 1984. 13 attended. From a long agenda the following are the main items of general interest.

(1) SCCU finances. Mr Suttill presented his preliminary figures for the accounts 1983/4. The overall picture looks very satisfactory, with a result somewhere around the break-even point. Grading figures (which always have the biggest turnover, since they include production and sales of Grading Lists) are healthy; in particular, Trevor Jones's special-service income had surpassed all expectations. Your Bulletin is slightly in the black. Biggest items of expenditure were adult and junior prizes (£250) and a donation, if that is the right word, to the East Anglian Union (£100).

The Executive agreed to propose the following at the SCCU Council Meeting on the 23rd June: County Levy £6 per point (no change); Bulletin sub £2.30 (no change); Grading List £1.75 by post - £1.60 for five or more - or £1.50 if collected direct

from the Union.

(2) <u>BCF finances</u>. The Federation, at its Finance Meeting on the 12th May, is to propose a County levy of £85 (at present £80). The Executive made no final decision on its reaction to this but hoped that all Counties would make an effort to

be represented, if only by proxy.

(3) A dispute had arisen between Middx and Essex over a match in the Amboyna/ Ebony competition. It was one of those confirmation-of-fixture affairs that crop up from time to time; no one had travelled, the match had not been played, and both sides were claiming expenses. The Tournament Controller felt that both were partly to blame, and recommended that the match be counted void and no expenses awarded. The Executive supported him in this.

(4) County matches 1984/5. It was noted that the current arrangements always place a solitary first team in the Montague-Jones; should the first teams all play in the Championship? On balance the Executive felt not, mainly because that would leave

only four teams in the MJ.

Jeff Douglas, who has been Tournament Secretary for twelve years at least - just how long he isn't sure - has finally invoked his long-standing threat to resign.

His brand of quiet efficiency will not be easy to reproduce.

(5) The role of the Unions. The BCF has been looking at the role played by the Unions in the national set-up, and the Executive thought the time was ripe for it to do the same. The national grading scheme, which could be introduced in 1985, would take over one of the Unions' most important functions, and the SCCU role in the South East would be more or less limited to running County matches and individual championships. The very raison d'etre of the Unions (though, as far as your Editor knows, the BCF has not said this) will be in question. Should the Union be more involved with the chess scene in general, including leagues and congresses? Are there new things it ought to be doing? The Executive is to hold a special meeting on the 9th June to consider the whole question.

The BCF has asked the Unions to prepare Reports on their activities. It sounds a little vague, at least to your Editor, and it is not very clear what the Reports are for. (Publication in Yearbook? Or just for BCF consideration?) Nevertheless the

CU is going to have a go.

(6) Grading. It was noted that the BCF's - sorry, BCM's - new machine, to be installed shortly, should be doing the grading in a year's time. The NCCU grading, indeed, is to be done on it this year. The money side is still not too clear, but it looks as though the cost to the Union could go up a bit. The actual published lists will still be produced, and sold, by the Unions. "Magnetic" - which presumably means cassette - directories of players will be available to local "graders". There is still no word on whether the system will offer the special services which have proved so popular in the SCCU. The BCF is conscious that details of the system have not been well publicised, and will attempt to put everyone in the picture shortly.

The Executive noted that the interim list was out; and agreed to offer

advertising space in the SCCU Grading List for 1984.

(7) <u>Juniors</u>. The Union has called a meeting of County junior organisers for the 9th June. This will try to solve the problems of venue, and communication, encountered this year over the SCCU U18 jamborees. (Who knows, it may even find an SCCU Junior Organiser!)

(8) SCCU Individual Championship. It was noted that the new SCCU Champion, Daniel King, is already qualified for the BCF Championship on the strength of his grade. The SCCU nomination, therefore, goes to the next eligible player (RG Granat).

(9) BCET nomination. The Executive agreed its nomination for a British Chess

Educational Trust award. Only one name had been put forward.

(10) SCCU Council Meeting 23rd June. The Executive made some final arrangements. The Meeting, as last year, will be at the Fairway Inn, Bayswater. One item for the agenda will be the grading of non-affiliated leagues. These are graded at present; should they continue to be? (Please remember, incidentally, that formal notice of the Meeting will go to County secretaries but not direct to County delegates.)

LEONID KUBBEL'S CHESS ENDGAME STUDIES

REVIEW Edited by TG Whitworth. Available from TG Whitworth, 8 Sedley Taylor Rd, Cambridge CB2 2PW Q £5.50. 175 pp, paper covers.

This kind of book, as I am not the first to discover, is hard to review unless you're

a specialist writing for specialists. But here goes.

Leonid Kubbel (1892-1942) - and I glean this information from the introduction by veteran composer Alexander Herbstman who knew him personally - belonged to the Leningrad circle of composers. He was one of the founding fathers of the chess study; the middle one, and the most prolific, of three brothers. His 500-odd studies are far outnumbered by his problems. There are two old collections of the studies, both scarce. This book brings together 300, including some from other sources.

The 300 studies are grouped not by themes - as well for me; I wouldn'r recognise a Bristol theme if it sat up and said "hello" - but by the nature of the material on the board. When I got to the ones with queens on, I gave up and just looked at the solutions (figurine algebraic) which accompany the diagrams. Not that I did all that well on the others, and I was selective with those. Some are simple enough, once you see the idea; some are fiendishly difficult.

The book seems good value for £5.50. It is fairly solid, the paper is good, the diagrams and print clear. Chess studies are an acquired taste, but Kubbel has gone quite a long way towards whetting my appetite. But be warned: they should only be taken in small doses. There's enough here for a lifetime of rainy weekends.
