EDITORIAL

To a match captain, inefficiency from the other side is always irritating. Most of us learn to live with it; some for the sake of playing chess, some for the brownie points, and some with the day in mind when they themselves will need indulgence. The Surrey I match captain, or maybe I mean his committee, is moved by none of these things. Cambridge's sin (see Executive Report) may not have been an isolated lapse, and Surrey were right to make a fuss; all the more so if other counties have been similarly at fault, as I am sure they must have been. But match defaults do no one any good. There has already been one unnecessary one this season, and another is in the air after apparent mix-ups. Claiming one here, for a venial offence that half the match captains in the country might have committed, was taking things too far.

From the SCCU President to DW Anderton, BCF International Director, 7.12.84:

Dear David,

The news of the British team's success in the Olympiad in Salonica was absolutely splendid. What a boost to chess in this country and to the Federation!

EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

The Executive met in Bayswater on Friday 23rd November. Here is your Editor's account of what happened.

(1) County match Cambs I - Surrey I (17th November). As reported last time, this match had been awarded to Surrey because the Cambs match captain failed to notify them of the venue by the stipulated date. Cambs had appealed against this ruling. It turned out that Cambs had confirmed the venue, in good time, as "Cambridge" but not said exactly where. A couple of weeks or so before the match, Surrey tried to get in touch but found the Cambs man unavailable. Dr Opie, County Match Controller, had no more luck, and made his default ruling.

The Executive felt that Dr Opie had had little choice. However, it disliked the idea of defaulted matches and wanted to go out of its way, if possible, to get the match played. After very thorough consideration it recommended strongly that Surrey should look for another date; Cambs to travel to Surrey and pay for the hire of the venue. Dr Opie will keep in touch with arrangements; the final decision will be his.

It was noted that Cambs have a poor record for communicating with other counties, and they have been requested to put their house in order. (Some thought Cambs were by no means the only offenders, and wondered how often the venue-confirmation rule is strictly observed.)

Postscript: The Surrey match captain (RW O'Brien) has declined to re-arrange the fixture against Cambs, and the default stands.

(2) Grading. Philip Clemow reported continuing success with sales of Grading Lists. We are well up on recent years.

A number of people expressed serious doubts about the viability of the BCF's centralised grading plans. These have since been conveyed to the BCF, and the Management Board has agreed to seek professional advice on the scheme's chances of success. Should the report be unfavourable, the SCCU may need to get its thinking cap on quick.

(3) SCCU Trophies. Investigations continue. The Imperial Cup, mentioned in a previous issue as the "prime candidate" for donation to the EACU, turns out not to be our property at all. (No one seems to know whose it is; we just found it.)

(4) BCF Stage county matches. It was agreed that the Union would certainly take up both its places in the Minor Counties; if one county was not interested we should nominate the next one down. (It is most important that any county not interested should say so!) We understand Sussex would not be too proud to play.

(5) New County Competitions. The Executive agreed, following questionnaire returns from the counties, to set up a one-day inter-county quick-play event as well as KO competitions for the MJ and Amboyna/Ebony teams. These will happen after the principal match season is over. A working party is to sort out the details.

(6) British Under 21 Championship. You may remember that the SCCU expressed concern about the BCF's decision to discontinue this event and award the title to the highest placed eligible player in the British Championship. There has been some BCF feeling that we should have made our views known before the decision was taken; your Editor is still not too sure whether the question will be re-opened. (Communications, and the time scale of Meetings, being what they are it is difficult to ensure that a Union debates all issues before the Management Board does.)

NEW IN CHESS YEARBOOK 1 (1984A)

Published by Elsevier-Interventura,
Amsterdam. £15

This volume represents an attempt to launch a western European (or more specifically Dutch) alternative to Informator. Like Informator it is to appear twice a year and contains games selected and arranged by classification of openings, annotated by a system of symbols (closely imitated from the Informator ones). It is issued simultaneously with the New in Chess Keybook (£30 hardback, or two paperback volumes at £16 and £11.50), a survey of opening theory from games of 1970 to 1982, in effect a scaled-down NIC equivalent of the Informator Encyclopedia of Chess Openings. The Yearbook too aims very much at the Informator market: serious players (graded 180 or more?) who want a cross-section of important games pre-selected (how many of us really want every game from a tournament?) but not pre-digested into theoretical dogma.

How then does the new arrival compare? It has a good hardback binding and is well produced, with more diagrams than Informator, but it costs rather more (£15 to about £12). Yearbook 1 contains about 1300 games, about 800 of them annotated, but it covers all of 1983 and January-April 1984 (1984B will cover May-December 1984, subsequent issues will be six-monthly), so a direct comparison with the 650-750 games in an average Informator, all annotated, is not possible. Yearbook's special claim is that its games are chosen from a computer database of 5000 games a year, so that errors of omission are less likely, but final selection of games and annotators remains up to the editors, Sosonko and van der Sterren. This judgement is the real variable, with Informator and Yearbook sometimes choosing very different material from the same tournaments. Annotations in Yearbook are of similar depth to Informator, which contributors have obviously used as a model. On occasions one may get a useful comparison (e.g. Chandler-Timman, London 1984, annotated by Chandler in Informator, Timman in Yearbook, though their verdicts are much the same); in other cases the same annotator has supplied the same notes to both publications (Chandler again, for one).

For me, Yearbook is no better than Informator and perhaps not quite as good. Its database has yet to be proven a real asset and its un-annotated games are probably of little use to most readers. If you can afford it in addition to Informator, fine; otherwise it is certainly worth watching. A few improvements might turn it from a good imitation of Informator to something better, and in the meantime it is providing healthy competition.

FIDE Laws have been revised, we see, with effect from 1st January 1985. No, we haven't seen the text; photocopy from BCF for 50p and a "large" SAE. Not BCF-enforced until 29 July. Newsflash has it that you are now allowed 100 moves to mate with K+R+B v K but we expect that's a misprint. You can claim a draw if your opponent has bare K (if this also applies to other cases in which he cannot legally mate you, NF doesn't say so), and it's an automatic draw if you get down to K v K, K+B v K, K+N v K, or K+B v K + same colour B. Plus sundry other changes. Must get a copy.
