# SCCU MANAGEMENT BOARD

The Board has had no meetings in the flesh, but one or two points raised last time have been cleared up. The SCCU Individual Championship will stay at Sutton for the time being; the (other) two British Championship qualifying places will be up for grabs at Upminster. There looks like being a new SCCU Quick-play Championship hosted by Berks in May 1988. Suggested Union contribution is £50 towards the prize fund.

### LETTERS

Dear Mr Haddrell,

The September issue of the Bulletin contains some comments which I believe should not go unanswered.

The article "SCCU Management Board" says that the Board consider the time-scale and rate of play of the Berkshire Open (alias Bracknell Congress) render it unsuitable as a British Championship qualifier. I would like to point out that the Kings Head London Open (which had both SCCU qualifying places last year) has the same duration and almost the same rate of play. Is this another case of "London Bias"?

Peter Morrish's letter accuses the "Anti-London Faction" (Mr Fergusson's term - Ed) of illogicality with regard to Junior tournaments. He fails to understand our premises. What we object to is the poor outside counties, which have few chess onts, having to pay money to the rich inner counties, who have many chess events, organise chess events that are too far away for our juniors to attend. It does NOT involve very much more difficulty for Berkshire juniors to stay away from a chess event in Southend than it does for them to stay away from a chess event in London. We wish Peter every success in organising his local events, but we do not want to pay unless we get some benefit; even if it is only once every nine years!

My final comments concern "How to run the County Matches!". Oxfordshire pay their levy and have as much right as any other county to compete in the County Championship. Oxfordshire may not be very strong at the moment but their courage is greatly to be admired. Berkshire lost every match a few seasons ago but finished third last season ahead of Kent. Oxfordshire could do the same. Surrey have more strong players than either Berkshire or Oxfordshire and their gutless departure to the second division is to be deplored.

Having said this, I must agree that all is not well with the County Championship. There is a very great disparity between the populations of the counties which does make the competition unfair. I believe that the very big counties (Middlesex, Kent and others?) should be split up and the very small counties (outside the SCCU) should be amalgamated. The second and third divisions have the same problem as the junior inpetitions: they are local metropolitan events masquerading as regional events. Weak players in the outer counties do not need (or want) to travel long distances to get competition.

Dear Mr Haddrell,

The Editor of "Sussex Chess 1987" has asked me to convey these comments to you in reply to your frequent references to that publication in the September Bulletin:

(1) It is regretted that the date of the Sussex Lightning (April 11th) was omitted - no personal slight was intended.

(2) The Cup in question is engraved "McArthur's Cup". Unpedantic but inaccurate usage in Sussex calls it the McArthur Cup. Both appear from different contributors in Sussex Chess 1987.

(3) St Margaret's School Ditchling won the Ull Team Championship. The report was printed as received.

(4) The remark "bald" about a Sussex 3rd team needs to be seen in context. Under the rejected SCCU proposals for teams of 16 in revised 2nd and 3rd divisions, Sussex were able to enter a third team. As this scheme was not implemented, Sussex were not able to field an extra team of 20 in addition to the unchanged second team of 20. Sussex do not have a problem: the problem lies with the SCCU, who cannot make the Montague-Jones an attractive competition.

(5) Sussex Chess was pleased to provide material for the Bulletin, and would have been happy to provide clarification of any of the above matters.

Incidentally, the remarks of J Poole in the same issue caused great amusement - is this the same person as the recent SCCU President, and the current Executive member for Buckinghamshire? A bold ploy by the BCF to label its Trojan Horse so clearly!

## REVIEW

## THE COMPLETE CHESS ADDICT

Mike Fox and Richard James: Faber and Faber Short algebraic, paper covers 264pp £5.95

This is an extravagant collection of fact, fable, foible, games, blunders, personalities and problems. The authors have scoured, or so it seems, every book, magazine, tournament bulletin, movie guide, literary gazette, court circular, gossip column, scandal sheet and Daily Telegraph of the last several centuries. (With one notable exception, and this annoyed me.) The first part, take it or leave it as you will, selects teams from the ranks of royalty, rogues, sportsmen, politicians, entertainers, thinkers and so on. (Would Frank Bruno have beaten Albert Einstein? Did you know that Rabelais gave the first description of castling in literature?) There follow sections on the Greatest Players (statistically arranged, of course), egregious blunders, Cheating (a bit thin, this bit), world records, computer chess, unorthodox chess, and strange ends (Which Greek dramatist was killed by an eagle dropping a tortoise on his head? This isn't in the book as far as I've discovered, but I couldn't resist asking and it's a fair illustration of what is).

It is a bigger book than you might think, from the number of pages. There is also a great deal of chess in it, though the authors (two self-confessed patzers, and that's all I know about them because the blurb says nothing) go in for snappy one-liners rather than in-depth analysis. I only wish they, or the publishers, had heard about the rule Always Say Whose Move It Is With The Diagram. I also wish they'd been a bit more scholarly with their cross-references: "Solution at end of Section" is irritating if you have to scan ahead, or look in the table of contents, to find out just where the section ends; and even more irritating if you haven't yet worked out what they mean by "section". There are goodies promised in the blurb which I haven't found yet! But I quibble. This is a most acceptable bedside book, and guaranteed to make you the club bore for months to come. It is well produced on decent paper, the print and diagrams are clear, I have spotted but lost track of one solitary misprint, and as for the price - well, I usually ask myself what I'd be prepared to pay before I look, when I have a book to review. I was 5p out.

#### BCF YEAR BOOK OF CHESS 1987-88

Price £4.50

Leonard Barden once told me he'd reviewed a grading list. Reviewing a Year book, while somewhat less eccentric, is nonetheless an oddish thing to do. One Year Book is much like another. My excuse, mostly, is that I want to put on record my ppreciation of its unwonted promptitude. It was, to be sure, a little late; but I believe the management are now on the right course.

It is much the same as its predecessor. The layout, however, is greatly improved. In the county lists, the rule now is one page (or one column) per county; in contrast to the old style which had odd bits of counties sticking out everywhere. The penalty is smaller print, a greater proportion of white space (that's a penalty?), and about 15% more pages. And a bigger price I daresay, though I can't remember what last year's price was.

Criticisms? This wouldn't be the Bulletin without criticisms. The congress results towards the end are a bit selective (they say why, but that's no excuse). Why does Southend 1987 get a whole page to itself, very spaced out, while Sutton gets a corner of a page?

# SCCU COUNTY MATCHES

We're off again. The Bulletin is the only place you're going to see these results; so please, match captains, try to follow these "rules":

(1) Always send a copy of your result sheet to the Bulletin. Don't rely on your opponents to do it. (Even if they do, they may get your names wrong.) An asterisk by a county's name on the following pages means I have received the result from that side.

(2) Be prompt. Don't wait for adjudication results, I get those independently. Ion't assume, because the official deadline is past, that you've missed the boat. iou may not have. And don't assume, because the deadline's miles off, that a four-eek delay is of no consequence. I like to spread my typing out. (And if the other side's version has been with me for ages, I may have typed it already and not be too careful about checking for discrepancies.)

(3) Put the home side on the left!(4) Be legible!! If you can't write, get someone else to do it. Or borrow a typewriter. Writing in capitals is not usually the answer; if your lower case is illegible the chances are your upper case will be as well. (I speak from years of experience.)

(5) Try to give full initials, and spell names right. I try not to introduce any more of my own mistakes than I can help. Apart from obvious slips of the pen, my icy is to copy the spelling given by the player's own match captain, even when T

don't believe it. (Who am I to contradict him? He may, for all I know, have just discovered that everyone's been spelling the name wrong for years.) "Sic" (or "so") in brackets after a player's name means I have doubts.

(6) When there are adjudications, tell me the claims or probable claims (your own side's, at any rate). A simple "+" or "=" next to the result column is fine. I am sure readers are interested in this information. (And incidentally, if you must write just "A", put it next to the result column or offset it a bit. Damn sight easier to read, when I'm checking the scores.)

(7) I do check the adding up. More as a check on my typing than your arithmetic; but very occasionally I find you've got it wrong. This doesn't help!

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<u>Correction</u> (see last issue, page 10) In the friendly match Civil Service v SCCU, the SCCU board 8 was HL Duckers. (This really did come to me, quite legibly but from one side only, as "LH Dawkins"; which looks like a case of one match captain being illegible and one or the other being careless. Change of date Middx 2 v Kent 2 has been moved from 24 Oct to 12 Mar.

# HOW TO RUN THE COUNTY MATCHES! (episode 2)

The story so far: Haddrell recommends promotion and relegation.

I've not changed my mind yet. GT Fergusson argues on another page that all counties pay their levy and are equally entitled to play in the County Championship. He's right. <u>Equally</u>. But I have not suggested that Middx should be immune to relegation! Of course Middx are "too" strong; but that's the way the world is. Mr Fergusson's counter-suggestion (split the larger counties up, and amalgamate the dwarfs) makes sense but has, I think, less chance of being accepted. (You can't impose a thing like that. I would favour counties doing it at their own discretion; and effectively, if not officially, at least one of the SCCU big boys has been known to do it at third-division level. I don't see them doing it in the Championship.)

I am conscious that I skated over one problem last time: that of sorting out nominations for the BCF stage, when our first and second and third teams are all jumbled up. I said that play-offs would be an easy solution. It would; but it wants a closer look than that. I am going to assume, for argument's sake, that third teams will be eligible for nomination in the Second Teams competition (or, for that matter, in the County Championship) if they do well enough in a high enough division. This seems only fair. I am also going to assume that no team may be nominated for more than one competition, and I will come back to this later.

For purposes of qualification, I shall treat the various divisions as a continuous array, with the top team in division 2 coming immediately below the bottom team in division 1. I was tempted, originally, to leave it at that and say, "Top two eligible teams qualify". But this would mean that a single second team in division 1 qualifies automatically; which is unfair because they are in that division by virtue of their results in the previous season. The same applies, of course, if there are just two second teams in division 1; with the added disadvantage that there would be no competition whatever for the two nominations. So: -

#### Rule number one:

Take the top <u>three</u> eligible teams. It is from these three that the two nominees will be selected. Not more than one play-off match will be needed. (Three teams is a handy number, and probably enough to take care of the automatic-qualification-onprevious-season problem. Four would be workable, but perhaps too much of a good thing.)

# Rule number two:

(a) If the 3 teams so selected are all in the same division, nominate the top two.
(b) If they are in two different divisions, then two of them must have played in the same division and the higher-placed of these has already "proved" its superiority over the lower. The play-off, therefore, will match the lower of these two against the team from the other division. This applies whether the "other" division is a higher or a lower one.

This rule is obviously fair if the "other" division is a lower one; and equally it is fair if the "other" team is the bottom one in the next higher division. (It may have had a perfectly lousy season and be extremely weak.) If the "other" team has finished well up in a higher division, there may be an <u>appearance</u> of unfairness. But if it's as strong as all that it won't have any trouble winning its play-off, will it? And the real point is that until it has done so it will not have <u>proved</u> its superiority.

(c) If they are in three different divisions(!), nominate the top two. Or, if you prefer, have a play-off between the bottom two. I'm easy, especially as it's unlikely ever to happen.

We are required by the BCF to place our nominees in order (that is, they will want to know who was first and who second). There are cases in 2(b) where the answer will not be obvious, but an arbitrary rule will do. I'm easy again.

playing below its "proper" division should not be eligible for nomination. It wasn't necessary, and it spoiled the symmetry. (So, of course, does the rule that third teams can be nominated for the Championship but first teams can't be nominated for the Third Teams. There are more important things than symmetry.)

I must come back, as promised, to the rule that no team can be nominated in more than one competition. (I fancy the BCF might insist on this rule!) It would be quite possible for a team to reach the top three in two (or more) competitions, and you've got to thin them out at some point. You could either require them to choose at the outset - that is, before they take part in any possible play-offs - or, alternatively, allow them to try their hand in the play-offs and force them to choose only if and when they actually qualify for more than one nomination. The second course seems fairer. If they drop out, at either point, then that would leave the way clear for the other two teams to go forward. (No point in bringing in a fourth, just for the sake of having a play-off!)

## BCF MANAGEMENT BOARD MEETING 21.11.87

Stop press, because we had forgotten there was a meeting until Eric Croker rang ten minutes ago (22.11). In fact if the Bulletin production team had not had a hiccup this afternoon, the thing would have been already stapled and enveloped and you'd not have read this. As it is we also have an opportunity to apologise for putting the page number in the wrong corner.

The MB spent some time on matters relating to RD Keene's resignation and his projected English Chess Association. The Bulletin is not sure what this latter is, or even whether it's got the name right. Other items of interest:

(1) <u>Grading</u>. There was, of course, much disquiet and some feeling that the whole thing had been badly mishandled. The Federation is considering the purchase of some kind of IBM clone, and expenditure in excess of £4000 was talked about. On the 1987 front, things are slightly better than we thought: there has been a preliminary ru of the new grading lists, and if it passes muster the published lists could be out fairly early in December. Computer gurus up and down the country have been offering help with future development.

(2) <u>Levy numbers</u>. Essex (and Beds) have applied for reductions. The MB rejected their applications. This was, apparently, to clear the way for them to go to the appeals committee!

(3) <u>Calendar of events</u>. The one that went out with the new Year Book has come in for much criticism, and an improved version is to be prepared.

(4) <u>National Club</u> grading limits have been increased since last year. (Must confess we hadn't noticed.) Some clubs have been squeezed out, and the limits will be reconsidered for next season.

(5) National Club Quick-play has been abandoned for lack of entries at all levels.

(6) <u>Counties Quick-play</u> is going ahead. No idea who, if anyone, has entered from the SCCU.
