#### SCCU MANAGEMENT BOARD

The MB met on Friday 5th February 1988 at St Brides. All were present except WA Suttill, who was in hospital. Interesting bits:

- (1) <u>County matches</u>. The Director of Home Chess and Services had sounded out the Unions on the possibility of replacing board fees by entry fees. Reactions on the MB ranged from "can see no objection" to "all for it". It appears that (?compulsory) quick-play finishes in the BCF stages may also be on the agenda.
- (2) <u>Information flow</u>. Very vague, this, but it was reported that one county was believed to be up in arms about a lack of information passing down from the SCCU to the counties. The MB member who happens to belong to that county didn't know anything about it. (We have since checked with the secretary of the county concerned, and he doesn't either, and we've heard no more about it.)
- (3) <u>Middx delegate</u> to the Executive Committee has resigned because of its ban on smoking at meetings. He is replaced by R Brown (address inside front cover).
- (4) <u>Junior finances</u>. A letter had been received from NW Dennis, Berks Junior Organiser, requesting vehemently that the Union cease to contribute to junior tournaments and training events. The background is that Berks are not interested in SCCU events held in London, and do not wish to contribute to them. It is Union policy to offer financial help to training events run by the counties, provided certain conditions are met. Surrey have received assistance for training events in the last couple of years, and Berks have recently refused it. Middx and Herts have also rejected offers in the past. A Berks player, among others, received an SCCU rant for last year's Lloyds Bank; whether with Mr Dennis's sanction the Bulletin cannot say. Mr Dennis also alleged shortcomings in the SCCU's willingness to co-operate with the BCF training set-up, and the Bulletin is too vague about this to comment. It is about three years since the Union ran a training event of its own.

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The Management Board felt that, in general terms, the Union had to go on collecting levy money from the counties and redistributing it as seemed best.

- (5) <u>Venue of Union Championship</u>. A feeling was expressed that, for future years, we really ought to look at the possibility of moving this event around. It is, of course, at Sutton again this year.
- (6) <u>BCF Management Board Meeting</u> at Leamington 23-24 January 1988 was reported on. Mediamate, a new company formed for the purpose, has offered to get lots of sponsorship money for English chess in return for a cut. The Federation would be required to satisfy the company that it was "professionally" managed; which would mean rationalising the BCF Management Board. Mediamate would be prepared to talk to (say) four people, but can't deal with twenty. The BCF has accepted this in principle. In addition, a direct membership scheme would apparently be insisted on.
- (7) <u>Grading</u>. The BCF supplementary list was still not out, but it was expected some ime in the next couple of weeks. The Federation has only printed 400 copies of the National list; how it has sold we don't know. The SCCU Grading Secretary cut his print run of SCCU lists to 800 (from 800) in view of the delay, and may or may not sell out. (Nearly 700 had gone already.) For more details, see Executive report below.
  - (8) <u>Future of Union(s)</u>. Though relegated to last position in this report, for two reasons, this topic occupied much time. The MB members had prepared discussion papers on their own provinces, and it was decided to distribute these papers, in expletive-deleted form, much more widely. (Postscript: they're going out with this Bulletin. Retrieve them from the waste paper basket at once!)

## SCCU EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

The Executive met on Friday 11th March 1988 at the Friends House, Euston. 17 attended.

(1) <u>Grading</u>. The BCF supplementary list had just appeared. There were numerous omissions of leagues and congresses in the SCCU and elsewhere, not because results had failed to reach the BCF but because the BCF (or their computer) had temporarily mislaid them. (The Middx Leagues are an exception: they were Middx's fault.) Some of these omissions may be rectified by the circulation of amendment slips. The BCF's new computer, which is of course blameless as it hasn't done anything yet, has now been installed together with a brand new Grading Administrator. It is a much more powerful beast (the computer, we mean) than its predecessor, and the BCF is confident that it will be man enough, or beast enough, to meet the deadline of publication on the 1st September.

Another thing the new computer will be able to do is print out selected data (e.g. County or regional lists). Preliminary soundings have established that there

would be some interest in these, and the SCCU could easily publish them if satisfied that it would be economially viable. The SCCU Grading Secretary is to do some costings and advertise accordingly. He would need advance orders before publishing any particular list. It was suggested that a county might add any text it liked to the county list - the SCCU could handle this - and use the document as a sort of county yearbook. (One county has said it would not be interested in regional lists but would welcome rolling grades produced once a month, with a facility to telephone the BCF computer for your latest grade. It admitted that it didn't know where the money was coming from.)

The BCF is to hold a meeting, to discuss the future shape of English grading, on Saturday 9.4.88 at the American School, Loudoun Rd NW8. The Director of National Grading, and Stewart Reuben, will attend. The meeting is from 2 till 6 p.m. and all are welcome.

- (2) Money. The Treasurer reported that the Essex levy had come down from 13 to 12.
- (3) SCCU County Matches. The County Match Controller reported that there were 5 entries for the U180 KO: Herts, Kent, Middx, Oxon and Surrey. The quarter-finals are Surrey v Kent and Herts v Middx, and Oxon have a bye. Astute readers will have deduced that there is also to be a bye in the semi-final. (The Bulletin thinks this odd. But four matches is four matches, wherever you put the byes.) There were two-and-a-bit entries for the new BCF County Team QP: Kent was the only entrant for the Metropolitan section, and apparently qualifies automatically; while two non-Met counties were interested but no one had come forward to run their competition. It seems possible that both may be allowed in.

There had been 5 appeals against adjudication so far; 2 had succeeded, 2 had failed and 1 was pending. Dr Opie remarked that some match captains were still submitting their claims incorrectly, and one had nearly done a Kent by running out of credit.

- Juniors. The only real item of interest was one which hardly seemed to concern the SCCU Executive. Oxon had complained to the BCF that Oxon, and/or parents, had baid for three training events in the last season, only one of which had materialised. The BCF proposed a solution which may or may not satisfy Oxon. It is the Bulletin's impression that things have not been efficiently handled. Oxon are believed to be making their own arrangements now anyway.
- (5) <u>SCCU Individual Championship</u> at Sutton. It was stressed that, as in previous years, the SCCU title is only open to paid-up members of SCCU counties. Birth alone is not sufficient qualification.
- (6) Future of SCCU Inter-County Championships. The Rules-and-appeals sub-committee had come up with some recommendations. In brief (and see below for more details) they proposed three divisions with compulsory promotion and relegation. There was little time for detailed discussion, but it was agreed by 11 votes to 2 that the Executive supported promotion and relegation in principle. County reactions, solicited in advance: General support from Kent (strongly), Middx (provided dates are carefully arranged), Cambs, and Surrey. Qualified support from Oxon (so long as no one can play for more than one team). Ambiguous return from Herts, whose match captain would not be interested in running a 2nd division team. Concern from Bucks, who are worried about weak opposition for top players in a relegated team. Opposition from Sussex, who would give everyone the right to enter division 1. Your Editor has no information on Essex. He does not know, in most cases, whether the opinions reported are personal or corporate ones.

The Rules-and-appeals sub-committee will deliberate further, and the SCCU Management Board will no doubt have its say. Final proposals will be put to Council.

(7) <u>Future Meetings</u>: Executive 6th May; SCCU Council (AGM) 2nd July. County delegates will not receive direct notice of the AGM; copies will be sent to county ecretaries.

# HOW TO RUN THE COUNTY MATCHES! (episode 4)

The rules-and-appeals sub-committee has proposed a system with 8 teams in division 1 and 5 or 6 in divisions 2 and 3. Promotion and relegation would be 2 up 2 down. I have two reservations. Firstly, I'm not happy about such a disparity in size. The number of teams currently playing - 17 - would presumably split 8-5-4, which doesn't sound too sensible; and if you're unlucky it may become 8-4-4 (or 8-5-3). Why not go for 6-6-6? OK, there may be political reasons. Secondly, 2 up 2 down in divisions of only 4 or 5 or 6 teams sounds like overkill.

The sub-committee would attain the target of 8-5-4 by adjusting the number of promotions and relegations at the end of next season. If you went for 6-6-5 it might

he a good idea to take a couple of seasons over it. (My original idea was to go straight there on the strength of this season's results, but it might provoke dissent!)

One criticism, and a valid one, which was levelled at the sub-committee's proposals was that a 2nd team (or a Minor Counties one) in division 2 would have no chance of nomination if there were 2 or more eligible teams in division 1. This was because the sub-committee proposed simply nominating the top 2 teams. They obviously didn't read the Bulletin's comments of 2 issues back! Of course it is wrong for the top 2 teams to qualify merely by virtue of being in a higher division. (They are there on the strength of the previous season's results, and may be very weak this year.) I proposed, in Issue 178, that a system of play-offs should operate if there were 1 or 2 eligible teams in a higher division. This would give a lower-division team a chance of nomination. You could object that lower-division teams should always have this chance, irrespective of the number of eligible teams in higher divisions. I think this would be taking things a bit far; you don't really want the highest-placed first team in division 2 playing off against the division 1 runner-up for nomination in the Counties Championship. But we could meet the objection half way, and operate play-offs provided the number of eligible teams in the higher division was not higher than (say) 3. This would give the following amended RJH rule:

- (1) If there is just 1 eligible team in a higher division, nominate the highest-placed team in the lower division and hold a play-off between the second-placed team in that division and the team in the higher division. (For the logic behind this, see Issue 178.)
- (2) If there are 2 or 3 eligible teams in a higher division, nominate the highestplaced of these and hold a play-off between the second-placed of them and the highest team from the lower division.
- (3) If there are more than 3 eligible teams in the higher division, nominate the top two. No play-off required.

If the nominees come from different divisions, it will not be obvious which of them is "number 1". But they will have had one opponent in common - the play-off loser - and you could simply use their scores against this team.

None of this is as complicated as it may look, and it would be fairly certain to produce the two best nominees. It is not intended for cases where there are eligible teams in all 3 divisions; if this happens, ignore the bottom division.

Ed: I think that's the first time a review of mine has ever aroused comment! Wish they did more often. Mr Ransome has read more into the "sneer" than was there: I don't despise books, even by players not in the first rank, which explain tactics to beginners. I just thought these two were awful. On re-consideration, I admit that I was rather unfair to "Winning Chess".

FIDE CONGRESS 1987 at Seville sounds to have been fun. (Read New in Chess for the polemics.) Spanish IM Calvo was on the receiving end. However the decision was reached, and it may or may not have been as byzantine as NIC suggests, it is hard to respect a body which declares someone persona non grata without saying what it means. No, he isn't banned from FIDE events. Gens duplex sumus.

Speaking of which, did you know that FIDE had two co-Treasurers, one in Wales and the other in Japan? (Actually they haven't any more, because the Japanese one has resigned.)

FIDE is to reconsider the name "Active Chess" which apparently is its way of saying "(30/30) Quick-play". (Since when? Why?) And whatever it's called, there's going to be a rating list for it. And international titles, and a world championship, if proposals are accepted at the next Congress. (Some oppose this on the ground that it would devalue the "real" thing.) They didn't change the Laws of Chess, but they're threatening it for next time.

LOYDS BANK BRITISH SOLVING CHAMPIONSHIP 1987-8 reached its climax in London 30.1.88. The 17 (UK-based) qualifiers, from an initial entry of more than 2,200, competed under world title conditions with problems set by John Rice of the British Chess Problem Society. Places: 1 AJ Mestel (Cambridge) 19/30; 2 D Friedgood (Leatherhead) 15; 3 CJ Lennox (Isle of Mull) 14; 4 JR Coward (Harrow) 11... Mestel's score, and the fact that one finalist scored 0, shows how hard it was.

A record 20 overseas entrants scored maximum points, so that a draw had to be held to decide the winner (an Irishman). Other all-correct entries included 11 from West Germany, 3 from Israel, 2 from France, and 1 each from India, Norway and the US.

Champions v The Rest match was won 8-4 by the Champions, but we can't quite make out who they were because they seem to have drawn on three different companies.

CHILTERN LEAGUE results: Oxon II 14 6 Bucks II 23.1.88; Herts II 17 3 Bucks U18 23.1.88; Bucks U18 6½ 13½ Bucks II 13.2.88; Bucks II 14 6 Berks U18 27.2.88. (You have probably guessed that most of our Chiltern results come from Bucks. We wouls be happy to publish results from other counties.)

This would give him a simple and effective means of communication. Most of what he wants to say to them is of general interest and has always been published anyway; but he may insert some extra material. For the remainder of the season the Bulletin will be sent, at the expense of the SCCU junior budget, to all those not already subscribing (most do). No decision has been taken on future seasons. Peter's messages:

This season has developed only with continued difficulties over dates and venues, and this last may be even more difficult next season. The BCF Calendar appeared very late, with no consultation where clashes existed, and even more clashes introduced by late changes of date for various reasons. Please advise me early of dates for your events, and I will try to contact you if any clashes can be foreseen.

The Under 14 Jamboree was reported earlier, and results of the Under 18 Open, Girls and Minor are given in this issue.

Training

I still hope that more 1 or 2 day sessions will be organised by area groups. They should look to finance themselves as far as practicable, but if this is difficult John Hennigan (address below) will give advice and, if possible, some financial help with coaches - particularly if your top group includes juniors from other areas.

The partial breakdown of strict Union boundaries has my full backing, and we are all working with Paul Dansey of the EACU and Laurie Walker of Hampshire for integration and consultation.

An attempt to solve the special problems of the three "Chiltern" counties is now under way with the formation of a special sub-group, and more detail will shortly be made available to all concerned.

Many problems have impeded progress in the special small-group IM coaching scheme, but much closer consultation with the coaches is now developing, and the availability of a regular central venue has made arrangements much easier. There has been some re-arrangement of groups to make strength, and ages, more even. Sponsorship has not yet answered all our financial problems, but we go on developing in faith, and hope for more charity.

Thanks to Sussex and Middx who pointed out an error in the tables last time. If you spot any more, please tell the Editor. Montague-Jones and Amboyna/Ebony are final. Championship waits on adjudications, but the finishing order should be as above unless Oxon overtake Bucks or we've got our sums wrong. (Some of the match point totals have been adjusted to reflect likely adjudication results: it seems to be agreed by all concerned that Middx will beat Berks and lose to Kent.) The triple tie on match points led to a curious discovery - the version of the rules currently in circulation has an important paragraph missing from the tie-break provisions. As printed, the rule makes (literally) no sense. It has been confirmed that the full version is the valid one; the omission was a clerical error. Tie-splitting criteria, in order of priority, are match points, game points, and the match(es) between the tied teams. (How these last would be used if plural is not specified.) If your Editor's calculations are correct, the only way Essex can not come first is for them to be awarded a loss in their outstanding adjudication; and they're claiming a win. If they draw it, the best Kent can do is to tie on games, and come second by virtue of the match result Kent-Essex; which was a draw, but Essex win on board count...!
