Club news, county news, views, ideas, innovations, anything, just send it. This is your Bulletin.

HOW THE OTHER SIDE SEES IT

This account of the Hitchin Congress 1987 is reprinted, with permission, from the Herts CA Newsletter for 1988.

The inside story of a congress. Congress means "coming together" and this is the best way to describe the organisation.

We start about a week after the last congress. A few ideas are noted in a book, and some ideas are batted around. Some of the control team have already signed on for next time, Alan Roochove, late of Stevenage, now of Brighton, has declared his intent to come, and the regular team does several congresses together

The entry form is revised in committee. The congress committee consists of the controller, the treasurer and the organiser. Translating that into English it means that Chris Lean and Glynne Jones sit down and have a mag for an hour or so. The entry form is revised, a draft budget drawn up, and a couple of coffees supped. The entry form then departs to PROVIDENT MUTUAL LIFE for printing.

May. The entry form appears. Samples on display to the Herts AGM. The hall was booked this time last year, it is now time to book the rooms for next year.

Distribution of the Entry Form starts now, with sets of a hundred or so being sent to various congresses in diverse parts. There are 4000 of these, so waste no time.

Updating the mailing list. Various congress mailing lists are amalgamated via box-files in Glynne Jones's office. About 1200 individual names and addresses, and some 200 clubs listed in the BCF yearbook. Some poor person has to write out 1400 envelopes. That is mainly Glynne with some help from Tim Thurstan, Dave Stapleton, Ken Liddle if they happen to be passing by.

The chess press is informed for listing in "Forthcoming Events" columns. The

Summer Holiday arrives. Hooray!

THE GREAT EVENT OF THE YEAR. Actually there are two of these, one at the end of August, one after Christmas. THE STUFFING PARTY. Take four or five congresses, possibly Pergamon Press, with at least one poor stuffer from each, and put 5 or 6 forms into each envelope, more for the clubs. This is incredibly boring and takes hours. Light relief from a few beers. Each agent takes their share of post and posts it the next day. No; franking is no good, the Post Offices ignores them for days, then charges twice for good measure all those it forgot to frank in the first place. It still takes them a week to post locally.

Then the entries start coming in. Most wait until the last minute. There are enquiries, phone entries, checking gradings, digging out the draw boards, checking supplies of board numbers, scoresheets, result slips, referral sheets for the team of 4, Panadol (see last year's article). Then Friday night, Setting Up. This is the second most boring job, even in front of writing envelopes which at least you can do when you feel like it. A couple of beers and some last minute phone messages later you tumble into bed feeling that something has finished, not that you haven't really started yet.

Saturday morning is Cat-Out-Of-Hell time. On the day entries are the profit margin. Getting phone entries to pay up(?), re-pairing for absentees only to find someone arrives 2 minutes later... Well you see all that stuff at the congress for yourself. It is our proud boast that we have not given a bye since 1978, and we mean to keep it that way. The Extra Prizes have to be allocated... Is there a

group of Vets in the Premier? Probably not, it is stuffed with juniors. Any juniors in the Major? Only one? Not worth a prize, no competition. The juniors are getting too good.

So now the congresss is running steadily. No one notices the control team opening windows, closing doors, selling soft drinks, selling pens, processing results before the players have bothered to fill in the slips, finding out the result of the game that wasn't reported, decyphering results from F..B.. that would defy the Enigma machine or Bletchley Park. Finding the driver who left lights on without causing heart attacks, quieting down Q..L.. or the other controllers in animated discussion, explaining the touch-move rule to some twit in the who should know by now.

The trouble with controlling is that the meals go sideways to funny times. This leads me to JONES'S FIRST LAW OF CONTROLLING. This simply states that control teams march on their stomachs. A few biscuits and some sandwiches with a Mars Bar and 3 coffees for breakfast. A little reinforcement by 11 a.m. with a second breakfast about 12. "Hey Glynne what are we doing for lunch?" Sent out for some Kentucky Fried Chicken, eaten after the draw is made for round 2.

Do the boards when the punters are sitting down. General exit for town while there is not much to do. A pint will do, with a light snack. Return to the welcoming eyes of the lady doing the sandwiches. Ever wondered why the main control table at Hitchin is next to the tea bar? A couple more sandwiches, coffee, Mars Bars, Kit Kats, coffees and sandwiches get us through till tea. When round three is duly under way, the teams heads out into the night determined to find sustenance. A quick Tandoori or two, followed by coffee and sandwiches. We don't finish until about midnight, and all we need before bedtime...

Sunday is similar to start with, the re-pairings for absentees, the quick snacks, the boards, the coffees, the team of 4 charts to update, the sandwiches, the coffees, the results to process, the enquiries to answer, the "Hey Glynne what are we doing for lunch?". Club together for a Chinese. The last draw, the coffees, the Mars Bars, the Kit Kats (the sandwiches have run out), the coffees. Can't slip out now, town is closed. Prepare for the final rush. Results, collecting equipment. Too busy to eat, must survive on our reserves. Allocating the prizes, writing the cheques, filling the envelopes, labelling them, g etting in order for the prize giving. Give it all away.

Everyone leaves except the team. We have to check we have everything and load up. Some goes here, some there. Pile up the office. Now guess what. We go out for a meal.

Nothing much to do now except balance the books, report the results to everyone, replace missing equipment, send off prizes to those who coulnd't wait, or didn't realise there was one for them. The graders must have results, the cards in the boxes must be updated, the mailing list is never still. Old cards thinned out, change of addresses noted. And then the wives start up "You said that after the congress you would..." Give me the quiet life, the easy hours in the club. Why do I do this job? I must be mad? What do I get out of it? I don't know. Only I know that next year, God willing, come October...

Don't know what this proves.

BCF MATTERS

BCF NEWSFLASH, which last appeared in July, is now officially dead. When Peterborough Software's 2-year sponsorship of the National Club came to an end, newsflash went with it. The Bulletin does not much regret its passing. It is to be replaced "for the time being" by a dot-matrix non-glossy BCF Newsletter (and thank goodness for the capital N) whose first issue we received on the 9th November. It contains useful information, and no photographs, in 4 sides of A4. Editor is William Hartston, who writes better than most of his predecessors. He is fairly optimistic about gaining new sponsorship.

Other items, briefly, from the BCF meeting of 5.11.88:

(1) FIDE Code of Ethics. David Anderton has done a draft for FIDE, to be considered at the Thessaloniki AGM in November. The Code has been interpreted as an attempt to muzzle criticism. No, your Editor hasn't seen the full draft.* Apparently the section on race relations has caused international dissent.

(2) British Ladies Championship. This year's was devalued by the absence of most of the strongest players (taking part in the British Championship). It was decided that there would be no separate Ladies Championship in 1989; but up to 6 women, selected on grades, would be invited to play in the British, and the highest-placed would be Ladies Champion. There was a feeling that beyond 1989 a sponsor should be sought for a separate Ladies Championship, to be held at a different time of year. (3) National Club entries are down; last-minute entries are invited (but when were

they not?) in the Newsletter for November.

(4) Levy Numbers. Middx and Surrey have applied for reductions, and the Appeals Committee will decide.

(5) "Player Registration Scheme". The scheme so named, and look in our last issue if you want to know what it is, has been referred to a sub-committee.

* He has now. The wording; being legal, is naturally ambiguous here and there. But essentially the offences to be proscribed are bribery (for points or office); the breach of rules or Laws; and the public uttering of written or oral matter likely to stir up racial hatred. Sanctions range from censure to a four-year ban (on membership if you're a federation, on holding office if you're an individual). Individuals guilty of rule-breaking, or bribery for points, would also face a four-year playing ban. And sorry Mr Calvo, but "persona non grata" doesn't get a ention.

BCF YEARBOOK is out, not much late. It costs the same as last year's (£4.50), but is in a smaller (so fatter) format. It has a rather more professional look, and is on general sale (first time, this) through a national chain of booksellers. It contains more results than its predecessor, but no rules or Constitution: these are to be published separately, perhaps in loose-leaf format to permit cheaper updating. The print is larger; which, together with the smaller pages, has made for a much messier layout in the names-and-addresses section. One Union has its entry starting at the bottom of a column. (Incidentally, why does the Thames Valley League always come out looking like a member of the SCCU?)

SUPPLEMENTARY GRADING LIST is also out, but not on sale this year (it is intended for graders only). The SCCU received one copy, sent to Grading Secretary Martin Cath with a recommendation to have more copies made if required. (It was.)

Ipdated Adjudication Rules have been circulated. (Might have been better to put them in the Yearbook?...) They do not seem very different from the old ones except that the fees have risen.

TV PROGRAMMES: an appeal

The regions, on track record, will have no plans to carry the series. Stewart Reuben, BCF Director for Congress Chess, makes this appeal:

COUNTY MATCHES

We're off again. This is the only place you're going to see most of these results,

so a few points for match captains:

(1) Please, always send the Bulletin a copy of your result sheet. Don't rely on your opponents to do it. Even if they do, they may get your names wrong. An asterisk by a county's name means I have received the result from that side. There were three match captains last season who never sent results; presumably they weren't interested in having them published. In consequence, one match never got published at all and two others were only unearthed, without the match captains' help, at the very end of the season. It would be nice to have a complete record this year.

(2) Be prompt. Don't wait for adjudication results, I expect to get those independently. Don't assume, because the official copy deadline's past, that you've missed the boat; you may not have. And don't assume, because the deadline's miles off, that a three-week delay is of no consequence. I like to spread my typing out. (And if your opponents' version has been with me for ages when yours arrives, I may well have typed it already and not be too careful about checking for discrepancies.)

(3) Put the home side on the left! Putting teams the wrong way round is at best confusing - for me - and at worst a source of error. It has already this

season caused the BCF to invert a match result.

(4) Be legible! If you can't write, get someone else to do it. Or borrow a typewriter. Writing in capitals is not usually the answer; I have just as much trouble with capitals as lower case. What's more, unless you're very careful capitals mask the distinction between, for example, Macdonald and MacDonald. I

don't like the Grading List's use of capitals.

(5) I know the habitual offenders won't take any notice, but <u>please</u> give full initials for your players. It is absolutely infuriating for the grader when he comes to "J Smith" and has to guess whether it's JA Smith of Anytown or JB Smith of Whatsitborough or, perhaps, Q John Smith of Thingyville. Or maybe none of them. In fact the grader will not guess but will spend considerable time finding out what you should have told him in the first place. Or more likely, being human, he'll shrug his shoulders and put him down as a New Player, and you'll wonder why Q John Smith has two different grades.

If a match captain gives the occasional first name, I assume it is to aid identification and I follow suit. Even then, other initials are helpful. (First names given purely because the player is a woman will be ignored; as will "Mrs",

"Miss" or "Ms".)

(6) Try to spell names right. I try not to introduce any more of my own mistakes than I can help. Apart from obvious slips of the pen, my policy - and practice, I hope - is to copy the spelling given by the player's own match captain. Even when I don't believe it. "Sic" (or "so") in brackets after a player's name means I really have typed what I was given. I am more likely to "correct" a name if I only have it from the opposing match captain.

(7) If there are adjudications, tell me the claims or probable claims (your own side's, at any rate). A simple "+" or "=" next to the result column is fine. I am sure readers want to know. If the result is through by the time I go to print I will obviously give it; but I will still put "a" (or + or =). Sometimes I may put this when a result has actually been agreed without troubling the adjudicator. This

means either no one's told me, or I've been careless.

(8) Sometimes a match captain will put "Reserve" by a player's name. I've always ignored this in the past, but in future I will put an "r" in brackets.

Cambs claim a record 15.10.88 for their win over Kent though outgraded on every board. A prior claim by Staffs v Greater Manchester last season (16-4 or thereabouts) is slightly dubious; one Staffs player may actually have outgraded an opponent who changed boards. Anyone got authoritative information?

There were no adjudication results through by the 20th November. This is unusual.
