SCCU ANNUAL COUNCIL MEETING (AGM) will be held on Saturday 1st July at a venue not decided. Please note this date in your diary. Notice will be sent to the secretary of each County and to its delegate serving regularly on the Executive. But Counties are entitled to three delegates at the AGM, and the Union has no way of knowing who the other two are going to be. It will be the County secretary's job to notify them.

SCCU SECRETARYSHIP

You will know that Oliver Stobart is to relinquish this post at the end of the season. No suitable replacement has been found yet, and a candidate is urgently needed before the Executive meets on the 5th May to draw up plans for the AGM. If you have ideas, please contact Oliver Stobart. The job is considered to be less onerous than that of the average County secretary. Mostly it involves servicing meetings: of the Executive (maybe three per year), Management Board (probably one per year), and Council (once a year, and obviously this year's will be Oliver's responsibility). Plus, of course, the occasional telephone panic and other unforeseeables. Someone else writes the minutes. The new Secretary should have reasonable experience, and proven ability, at this sort of job. He will also need access to duplicating facilities. If you're the man, come forward!

SCCU MANAGEMENT BOARD

The Management Board met, virus-free, on Friday 13th January. Main printable items:

(1) Officers for next season. The biggest problem was the Secretary's job; a number of people have been asked but said no. There was also some discussion of the Deputy Presidency, and a feeling that new blood was needed. Most Officers are willing to serve again.

(2) County matches. There was some disquiet about the fact that Cambridgeshire is, to all intents and purposes, a University team. It was agreed, however, that so long as this was OK with Cambs it was OK with us. The old problem of out-of-term fixtures got resurrected, but in a very abstract sort of way.

Cambs had recently threatened a non-smoking venue. Nothing more had been heard, so it was assumed that the problem had been amicably resolved.

There had been early delays with adjudications, but things seemed to be working now.

(3) Juniors. The allocation of SCCU funds to junior training has been queried, and not for the first time. We have £150 a year set aside, and one County at least has suggested that it would be better to abolish this fund and reduce the levy. Your Editor (but not necessarily the Management Board) thinks it is time we had a good look at our policy on training funds.

It emerged that Herts would have liked to play their U18 team in the Minor jamboree, but had had to enter the Major (in London) because they wouldn't travel to Sussex. So much for moving events around outside London...

You may remember (issue 183:3) that the BCF accounts for 1987-8 raised (or rather, hid) a question over junior training income. The amount involved was considerable, and the answer hasn't been provided yet. This surprises your Editor. It is understood that the BCF proposes major changes in the administration of junior training.

(4) British Championship Qualifying Places. The last Executive meeting decided to offer one place each to Upton and Southend 1989. Both these offers have been taken up.

The SCCU Executive will meet on Fridays 10 March and 5 May.

BCF MANAGEMENT BOARD

A report from an SCCU representative of the meeting 21.1.89.

(1) BCF Stage County Matches. The draw for the quarter-finals, so far as it involves SCCU teams, is:

First Teams: S1 v N2; M1 v S2

Minor Counties: Prelim rd S2 v N2. Quarter-finals: S1 v M2; E1 v winner of prelim

Second Teams: W1 v S2; S1 v N2

Third Teams: The SCCU winner, which has to be Kent III, has a bye.

(2) Grading. There was some discussion on QP grades. Main topic though, we gather, was "rolling" ordinary ones. The various Union graders have declared that they won't have anything to do with these, and the matter was left on the table. (A meeting 9.4.88 had declared an interest in publishing a half-year list 1988-9. As your Editor, who is a grader, had heard nothing more of this, he had already assumed it was a dead duck. Seems it is. It is his impression that SWR takes too little account of practical difficulties.)

(3) British Titles. There was a proposal, or suggestion, to introduce the titles of Club Master, County Master and Regional Master. The qualifying system would be based on that of the English Bridge Union, which your Editor knows nothing of and he's too lazy to check. At any rate you'd score "master points" for various events. Our informant was in a minority of one in suggesting that a simpler system would be to award titles on published grades. Had your Editor been present, it would have been a minority of two.

LETTER TO THE EDITOR

Dear Mr Haddrell,

I received my November SCCU Bulletin today and I was sorry to see that one of your readers has cancelled his subscription because he says the Bulletin has too much admin and not enough chess content.

In contrast to this view, I think you are doing a grand job in providing details and results of County matches etc, which are not now published in the BCM and CHESS.

On the subject of the spelling of names, I was glad to note that you have emphasised (page 6) the importance of getting names and initials right for the grades. I can understand the difficulties that can occur with the name of Smith, but mine is not one that should cause confusion. However, I note that in reporting the recent Dorset Congress results at Weymouth, you have shown "JB Hewson" instead of "JB Hawson". I feel sure you would have typed what you were given, particularly as the BCM for December, which also published the Weymouth results, gave my name as JB Hewson. (Ed: I typed what I was given, knew it was suspect, and put "sic" after it to show what was happening!)

My name was certainly all right on the Results Sheet which was displayed in the Congress Room, and therefore I can only assume that in circulating the details to all those concerned, the "a" suddenly became an "e". I only hope that the grader gets it right. It is a coincidence that there is a J Hewson in the 1988 SCCU Grading List.

Incidentally, I find that my grade in that list is under-stated, and no doubt there are many others whose own record differs from that in the List.

Mr Cath told me that as far as he can recollect the Paignton Congress results have never gone in for grading. This is very surprising news because the Congress is very well known and well established, and enjoyed by many players over a long period. I further understand from Mr Cath that one Congress (I don't know which one) undertook to send all the results in for grading, but when he enquired as to who would be doing the grading, he received a rather hesitant, evasive and unsatisfactory answer. In other words, whilst it was no doubt said in good faith that the games would be graded, it would seem that in practice no one took the responsibility for doing it.

Reverting to the comments about the Paignton Congress, Mr RE James of Banstead told me that he thinks the local players' results would be included in the West of England Grading List, but for the other people in the Congress who live outside the West Country, the results should presumably be relayed to the BCF or the appropriate grading area. In the case of Surrey, to Mr Cath; but obviously he is not getting them.

No wonder my grade is wrong, and of course I am by no means the only one. There were players at Paignton this year who came from Droitwich, Jersey, Hastings, Wakefield, Sheffield, Bolton, Solihull, Southend, Maidstone, Maidenhead, Waltham Forest, Canterbury, Oakham and Hatfield, not to mention the players from London and Surrey. Now, will all their results be taken into account when their respective Grading Lists are printed next September? It seems doubtful from what I have heard.

This makes a farce of the grading. I have not written to anybody else about it as I thought your Bulletin might be best to get the matter aired.

What is surprising to me is that nobody seems to have complained in writing, not merely that some Congresses don't get graded, but that some like Paignton only

got graded for local players. In addition to the Weymouth tourney in October, I also played in the Torbay Congress at Torquay 18-20 November, and I am wondering whether the results here for players other than local West Countrymen will filter through to the appropriate graders.

Ed: - I think that if the Weymouth organisers had Mr Hawson's name right on the wall chart, and especially if they displayed his correct club and/or grade, there is not much chance of the grader confusing him with someone else. What went out to the media is incidental.

I don't think he needs to worry about the "locals-only" problem. One of the strengths of our new(ish) centralised grading system is precisely that it takes no account of where a player comes from, so long as it's in England. All players are in the same national list, and all graders use it. The congress grader will calculate results for everyone, and all his results, with Westerners and Northerners and Southerners mixed up any old how, go straight to the central BCF computer. (Well, they go through various administrative channels on the way, but they are not changed or sorted in the process.) The end product, in September, is a new National grading list; and the various Union lists which appear at the same time are merely extracts from it. If you don't believe this, you can buy a National list and check for yourself. The new system is a vast improvement on the old one, where the Unions really did work independently and the inter-Union result-shuffling described by Mr Hawson really did take place (or not, as the case might be). Between different countries, it still does. Scotland and Wales, and the Channel Islands I'm afraid, are foreign countries.

It is true that some congresses do not get graded at all. Mostly, I suppose, because the organisers just don't get around to doing anything about it. If they have advertised the fact that games will be graded, this is clearly immoral. The "hesitant, evasive and unsatisfactory" people referred to by Mr Hawson were, in fact, shamed into action by Martin Cath's enquiries; but still a large number of congress games are going ungraded, and inaccurate grades must result. Paignton does seem to be suspect. Mr Cath's estimate is that in the SCCU better than 75% of congresses are graded; he is not so sure about the other Unions. Even 75% is not good enough. The Leigh Grand Prix has new rules which stipulate that games other than quick-play must be graded, and the penalty for default is that no Grand Prix points can be scored in that event. This rule, given proper policing, is theoretically enforceable; we shall have to wait and see how it works out in practice.

There is no reason whatever, in the Southern Counties at any rate, for a congress to go ungraded. If the organisers haven't got a grader on tap, all they have to do is CONTACT THEIR UNION GRADING OFFICER and he will arrange for the job to be done. All he'll want is the completed pairing cards. Martin Cath assures me that he has the manpower to cover all the congresses in the SCCU, and I daresay the other Unions would say the same.

Most of this applies to Leagues as well, of course. I don't know what proportion of league chess gets graded. Even the official County Leagues (the internal ones, I mean) are subject to mishap.

The grading process itself, if you get that far, offers no insurance against error. One player may get mistaken for another. A game result may get incorrectly reported, or not reported at all. (In one event I graded last year, there were some adjudication results missing. I chased them, but they never came.) A grader may miscalculate, or overlook a game, or do one twice, or misread the national list when looking up someone's grade. He may use dubious estimates for the strength of new players; he may have to, if he can't get reliable information. A figure may get incorrectly copied, either by the grader himself or by someone else copying his data into a computer. (The BCF reference numbers, which are used instead of names in the computer input, have check digits which will screen out nearly all the misprints; but obviously there's no check on the other figures unless they produce ludicrous results, and even when they do the check has been known to fail.) To cap it all, things may get lost in the post; it has happened. Considering all the hazards, it's remarkable things go as well as they do. The centralised grading system is far from perfect, but for the moment it's the best grading system we've got.

ROUND THE COUNTIES

MIDDX: Winters Trophy (an annual KO for teams of 4 in the Middx area, played in the second half of "the year") attracted 38 entries this time and was won by Hendon who beat Mushrooms 3½-½ in the Final. The Plate tournament was won by Metropolitan II.

SUSSEX: SW Sussex Jamboree 14.12.88 (5 teams, 26 players, think someone cheated) was won by Rustington 4/5 ahead of Chichester 3. Tony Kosten gave a simul in Chichester against "about 25 players" and dropped at least a couple of draws. Sorry precise information not available.

BERKS & BUCKS (otherwise Amersham) CONGRESS 1989 has been reluctantly cancelled. It would normally have been held in August. The Committee has experienced difficulty in retaining the army of volunteers needed for controlling, catering and admin. The Congress, which started at Marlow in 1964 and moved to Amersham in 1975, has run for 25 consecutive years. It is hoped to re-start in 1990 if fresh volunteers can be recruited.

ON A POINT OF LAW

Your Editor's county has just introduced adjournment sessions as an optional alternative to adjudication in the internal county leagues. Good idea, though we don't know as yet how often it's going to be taken up. Anyway, your Editor was startled when a sealing opponent, the other week, wanted to put both score sheets in the envelope. In 22 years of adjournments at Tunbridge Wells Chess Club he had literally never come across this one. (We just stick a bit of paper in the envelope, and both players take their score sheets home.) Perfunctory research revealed that the opponent was right, so far as FIDE is concerned; and the county uses FIDE rules. (So does the Club, in theory!) In a congress, where both sides have duplicate score sheets, the rule makes obvious sense. Does it make sense in carbonless club matches? Your Editor has no firm view either way, and it made no difference in the game in question because he resigned anyway, as soon as he was free to move the bits around; but what do readers think?

An earlier inter-club game this season (against the same club, as it happens, but not the same opponent) produced a different question. This time both players were happy to stick a bit of paper in the envelope. Your Editor chose not to resign immediately, but still the adjournment session never happened, because the players subsequently agreed, by telephone, to have the game adjudicated instead. And this time the question was, Should the sealed move be taken into account by the adjudicator? Again it didn't matter, because the sealed move was probably best anyway, but what do readers think? (If you're interested, your Editor got his draw and the appeal is sub judice.)

Then we saw the other day in the BCF Newsletter (still with us, incidentally, and a damn sight better than the unlamented newsflash) that FIDE had made some rule

changes, to take effect from the 1st March 1989. Nothing to do with adjudications. Two of the changes are boring. The other two are:

(1) a player with bare K cannot now win on time, or because the opponent has sealed an illegal move; and

(2) the 50-move rule is extended to 75 moves for K+R+B v K+R; K+N+N v K+P; K+Q+P on 7th v K+Q; K+Q v K+N+N; K+Q v K+B+B; K+B+B v K+N.

Your Editor dislikes both these changes because they're messy. The rules ought not to be clogged up with needless (and sometimes arbitrary) exceptions. If any opponent is fool enough to try and mate me with Bishop and Knight and three seconds on his clock, why shouldn't he be able to lose on time? And why doesn't the provision apply to other situations where a win for me is impossible? As for the 75-move rule, the Bulletin doesn't know how many moves are really needed in those cases and it has a sneaking suspicion that FIDE doesn't either. But what it is pretty sure of is that FIDE have not identified all the exceptions. And if you're going to be precise, you have to be precise. Give me 10 moves for K+Q, 17 moves for K+R, 18 for K+B+B and so on. (These are Fine's figures, not the Bulletin's.) Precision impossible? Then admit it, as FIDE used to, and for tidiness' sake give me 100 moves whatever I've got.
