LETTERS TO THE EDITOR

Dear Richard, 28.9.89

I was very disappointed to read your brief and rather inaccurate comments on our "Direct Membership" Scheme in the September 1989 issue of the SCCU Bulletin. I don't know where you obtained this information but the SCCU delegates to the Management Board have been given full details of the proposed Marketing Plan which is due to be discussed at our next Meeting on 18th November. They could, therefore, have put our progress in perspective or, if you had phoned me, I would gladly have dealt with any questions you had. We certainly intend to keep Unions and Counties well informed as our plans develop.

- me deal with specifics:-
- (1) It is proposed to pay a commission of 10% to Counties and 2.5% to Unions based on the subscriptions received from members in the respective jurisdictions.

In addition, it is proposed to phase out the levy over time by rebating the registration fee of each full member to the County concerned.

I think you will agree these are very positive steps by the Federation to provide an incentive for Counties and Unions to gain members for the Federation and also to help improve the overall financial situation.

- (2) The prime function of Union and County Coordinators will be to help the Federation promote the scheme on a localised basis, supported by advice and promotional materials generated by the Federation. It would be nice to think the larger clubs would have their own Membership Coordinator but this is a rather long term objective.
- There is no question that the promotion of the Scheme represents a challenge for everyone involved but this is not "donkey work". It requires initiative, intelligence and enthusiasm!

In developing our plans we faced options of promoting the Scheme solely from the centre or of involving Territorial Units. We have opted for the latter course for we fundamentally believe that the Unions and Counties infracture contains many of the elements to make the Scheme successful, not least the potential commitment of experienced officers and the local knowledge which is obviously essential.

Would you advocate we ignore Unions and Counties in formulating and promoting the "Direct Membership" Scheme of the Federation?

Our aim remains to launch the Scheme in January 1990. Of course there will be hard work for the key officials but it should be both exciting and rewarding. If we succeed, and we must, in improving the financial position of the Federation and its member units, as well as obtaining the commitment of more people interested in chess then that must be a very worthwhile objective.

Look at it as an opportunity and for goodness sake show more enthusiasm please.

You also carried some comment on the BCF stage of the Counties Championship. I would just add that the weekend at Derby resulted in exciting and close fought games in many of the finals - Counties and Leigh Interests National Clubs Competitions. It is surely arguable that getting everyone together provides a more interesting chess atmosphere. It also increases chances of publicising chess and of obtaining sponsorship. We will be looking closely at some of the aspects of a central venue that have been highlighted

such as the need for a fares equalisation scheme. As a visitor at Derby over the weekend I'd like to congratulate John Poole for his initiative and management of the Finals and Neil Graham of the MCCU for the efficient administration of the venue and facilities.

I have absolutely no objection to critical comment, indeed this is one way of stimulating interest in a subject and it is never possible to organise events in such a way that everyone is satisfied. It is better to have the objections ventilated because it is then possible to see what better arrangements might be possible but such criticisms should be based on correct facts, not on assumptions or inaccuracies. And I would have hoped an editor would have taken the trouble to ascertain the facts befor presenting an inaccurate picture.

In your September 1989 issue you refer to County matches: BCF stage. The proposal, which was accepted by Council, was £5 per game defaulted and £50 per match defaulted. Since all matches in the national finals are 16, 18 or 20 boards, to default more than 8, 9 or 10 games respectively must automatically lead to a match default, thereby the defaulting of 11 games is hardly relevant. The proposal specifically related the penalties to the county (ies) involved, not to "teams".

On the subject of fares equalisation for the 4 Finals, four suggestions were offered for consideration, one of which was an increase in the entry fees, payable by all counties which enter the qualifying competitions, which of course replace the old board fees. There is no question of an entry fee for the BCF stage.

As regards the central venue for the Finals, I have never stated that <u>all counties</u> favour this. What I have said is that the proposal to play the 1989 Finals at Derby was <u>generally</u> accepted because this was approved by Council at their September 1988 meeting. No county raised any objection until a few weeks before the event.

May I now refer to Mr Watson's letter on this subject. I find it extraordinary that "few, if any, captains were aware of [the finals being played at Derby] until too late a stage". As I have stated earlier, this proposal was passed by Council in September 1988 and the pairing notices I issued in January 1989 stated quite clearly "Finals of all competitions to be played at Derby on Saturday, 24 June". This was sent to all Union County Match Controllers. If the match captains did not know, the fault lies with the Union Controllers and County organisers, not with the BCF.

On the question of cost, Mr Watson is quite wrong in saying that "The finalists in the sponsored NCC Finals the next day had all expenses paid plus a buffet reception". The competing teams paid their own expenses, both travelling and any overnight costs. The buffet cost was provided out of the sponsorship fee. If we could find a sponsor for the Counties Championships, such costs would be covered and this is our aim. But to attract a sponsor we must first demonstrate that we have a worthwhile event - a major step forward has been taken with a prestige venue and Saturday afternoon sports coverage thanks to Radio Trent. Meanwhile, any contribution to costs can come only from existing income, e.g. levy or the like. However, the vast majority of those who attended commented favourably and, despite Mr Watson's criticisms, I believe the weekend was a considerable success.

Nevertheless, the Sussex problem is recognised which is why my successor as Home Chess Director will be seeking ways of easing the burden for any county which has a long journey. But there are ways in which the counties can help themselves and it does seem that in this case Sussex found it easier to complain than to take more positive action. I did in fact offer to reduce the match to a maximum of 5 hours play if this would help the travel problems but this offer was declined.

Maybe Derby is not the perfect venue but if anyone can suggest a better one with the necessary facilities away from London, we would be only to glad to explore the possibilities. What I am certain about is that we are not likely to see a return to each final being played in some dingy hall where no one is interested in it. At Derby we had about 100 spectators, many of whom also took part in the Quick Play competition, which was held in the adjoining fover during part of the afternoon.

After a full debate, Council approved the Derby venue for the 1989-90 finals but we will certainly do everything possible to further improve the arrangements.

Ed: - I didn't know, or had forgotten, that last year's Council meeting decided on the Derby venue. I also, for obvious reasons, didn't know about the pairing notice sent to Union Match Controllers. It is clear that the BCF gave ample notice of the venue; but did it get to the right people? The mechanism for filtering information down from BCF Councils to county officials is not perfect. In this case the obvious solution was to tell the match captains direct, with the quarter-final pairing notice. I don't know whether that was done. The general problem may be more intractable.

GRADING NOTES

BCF Quickplay Grading List is available from the SCCU Grading Secretary, Martin Cath, at 6 Northwood Avenue, Purley, Surrey CR2 2EP. Price by post is £1.25. The list does not include many SCCU players; quickplay grading does not seem to have caught on yet down here. Could be all the graders are waiting for someone else to start - your Editor knows one who'd do it if assured that others would. The demise of the Gaffney list has not helped.

Martin Cath still has SCCU and BCF "ordinary" lists for sale: for details, see inside front cover. (Actually, last we heard, the BCF list was re-printing but it may well be ready by now.) He also has County grading lists for Surrey. County lists for

Herts and Kent can be had from the secretaries of those counties.

Martin reports a "most satisfactory" input from graders last year of updates on things like players' clubs and initials. Over 2000 amendments were made last season. But there is still scope for improvement. In particular, he has urged graders to give forename (plus other initials) for players with common surnames. He acknowledges that this will involve considerable research. Your Editor, with a league grader's hat on, is writing to match captains telling them he intends to do no research at all. If they're interested in grading he expects them to identify their players clearly, giving full initials (or forenames as necessary), and full details of where new members have come from. Mystery players will be ignored.

I have grumbled, off and on, that congress reports from some organisers tend to be lists of prizewinners rather than lists of top players in order of points scored. Winners of grading and junior prizes get hived off to the bottom and omitted from their place in the main list, and sometimes a player who didn't happen to win a prize gets omitted altogether. This irritates me, but I'm an irritable fellow. I've found an ally. A correspondent has remarked on the results of the U125 section in the 1989 Charlton Congress, as published in the last issue. I didn't know, because I hadn't read the entry form, that ungraded players in this event were eligible only for the Ungraded Prize. As it happened an ungraded player won the tournament outright with

6/6, and another came =2nd. The winner's name appeared at the bottom of the list, as winner of the Ungraded Prize; his score was given but, in the absence of comment from the organisers, I assumed it was a misprint. The ungraded player who finished =2nd was omitted, because he hadn't won a prize; and the remaining =2nds were promoted to 1st place. Some other ungraded players were omitted further down.

Ty Jefferies, who sent the results, tells me the list I got was an accident. SCCU COUNTY MATCHES

We're off. The Bulletin's the only place you're going to see these results, and it's probably the only place the grader's going to see them as well, so here's the annual Editorial injunctions to match captains.

Please send me copies of all your result sheets. Don't rely on your opponents to do it. Even if they do, they may get your names wrong. If neither side sends it, the match may not be published at all; which means it probably won't be graded either. An asterisk by a county's name means I have received the result from that side.
 Be prompt. Don't wait for adjudication results, I get those independently.

(2) Be prompt. Don't wait for adjudication results, I get those independently. Don't assume, because the official copy deadline's past, that you've missed the boat. You may not have. (Unofficially, the Bulletin nearly always goes out on a Sunday in the second half of the month and I'll squeeze results in if they come on the Saturday.) Don't assume, because the deadline's miles off, that a three-week delay is of no consequence. I like to space my typing out. (And if your opponents' version has been with me for ages when yours arrives, I may have typed it already and not be too careful about checking for discrepancies.)

(3) Be legible. If you can't write, get someone else to do it. Or borrow a propertier. Capitals don't usually help: if your lower case is illegible, chances are our upper case is as well. And if you do use capitals, try to distinguish between (for example) Macdonald and MacDonald. The Grading List may not care, but I do.

(4) Give full initials for all your players. I know the habitual offenders don't think this matters, and in most cases I'm sure they're right. Usually it will be pretty obvious who the player is. But not always! Especially if you put A for Albert when Mr Hall's real name is Henry. (Sussex please note: I have not the slightest reason to think your Hall isn't "A", particularly as you're good with initials most of the time. I expect D Bird and A Barber are right too. It's just that, with a new player and no second initial, one wonders sometimes!) Again, will the grader guess that "B Scott" is DB Scott? (A real example from the current issue, that one, though I admit it was the opponents' version. I was in genuine doubt until the Sussex version arrived with "DB" on it, and "Prof" for good measure.) A common surname with a single initial can easily cause doubt in the grader's mind, especially with occasional players. There may be only one J Smith in the grading list under your county, but what about all the other J Smiths who could have just moved in, or turned up as new players? You may know that only one J Smith ever plays for you. You may know you've got the sense to put neon signs up if you ever used a different one. The grader doesn't know this.

Similarly, if you use an immigrant from Heckmondwike put a note in, first time round, to say it really is the Heckmondwike man. The grader cannot, in conscience, just assume it's the same man without checking. Why not save him the trouble? I promise to copy the note out.

If you give the occasional first name, I will assume it is to aid identification and follow suit. Even then, other initials are helpful.

A note for sexists: I refuse to print first names given purely because the player is a woman. I will print Mrs, Miss or Ms, reluctantly, if you give me no alternative. "J Saunders" would not be clear. But I much prefer "Jody" to "Miss J". Well, you must allow me some house rules.

(5) Try to spell names right. I try not to introduce any more of my own mistakes than I can help. Apart from obvious slips of the pen, my policy is to copy the spelling given by the player's own match captain. Even when I don't believe it. "Sic" (or "so") in brackets after a player's name means I really have typed what I was given. If it doesn't say that and the spelling looks dubious, suspect an error on my part. I am more likely to "correct" a name if I only have it from the opposing match captain.

(6) Please add the scores up, even if there are adjudications outstanding. Apart

from saving me the bother, it's a check on my typing.

(7) If there are adjudications, tell me the claims or probable claims (your own side's, at any rate). A simple "+" or "=" next to the result column is fine. I am sure readers want to know. If the result is through by the time I go to press, I will give both result and claim(s).

(8) If you're reading this over some other match captain's shoulder, go and order

your own copy! (Actually I think only two match captains don't subscribe.)
