Other county officers receiving free copies do so because their counties have subscribed on their behalf: prod your secretary/treasurer if you think he's likely to forget! A small number of people get complimentary copies in exchange for magazines or other things; they need take no action.

There is also an order form for grading lists. This has to go to a different address. Don't attempt to combine Bulletin and grading list orders in a single cheque, it could lead to part of your order getting overlooked. County secretaries are being sent lots of grading list order forms, with a request to spray them around when

convenient.

## SCCU COUNCIL MEETING

Council met on Saturday 30th June 1990 at the Great Northern Hotel, Kings Cross. Main points:

(1) County matches. You will remember that Sussex, who finished top Minor County in the rst division, were victims of an unfortunate misunderstanding and did not get nominated. They accepted this with a good grace, but were then understandably annoyed when Cambridgeshire, who did get nominated, withdrew from the quarter-finals and Sussex were not invited to fill the gap. The President explained that Cambs did not notify the SCCU of their withdrawal; they simply told their opponents and the BCF controller (with 18 days notice), and the controller assumed the SCCU would know about it. It seems likely that he would have accepted a replacement nomination had we made one, and Sussex would almost certainly have been able to get a team together.

Sussex argued, and Council agreed, that counties defaulting in the BCF stage should be subject to some form of SCCU penalty (like, maybe, being ineligible for nomination next time). The trouble was, no one seemed to know whether Cambs had explicitly accepted nomination in the first place. Clearly this should always be checked. The

matter was referred to the Executive.

(2) <u>Rule changes (County matches)</u>. There were three proposals, a proposal-that should-have-been, and a proposal-that-couldn't-be.

Nomination of players accounted for two of the real ones. Lester Millin of Oxon wanted to base nominations rigidly on the previous year's matches: anyone who played anywhere in the top 10 boards, reserves excepted, would be "nominated" for that team in the following year. There were refinements about reserves, and a rather odd (this is bur Editor talking) provision that bona fide match captains could play in any team whatever. This proposal was rejected in favour of a proposal from Chris Howell of Kent to retain the present rules but with a provision that nominees who had played less than twice in the previous season should not count towards the total number of nominees required. "Less than twice" seems to mean "less than twice, including the BCF stage".

Quick-play finishes accounted for the third. The Executive had proposed QP finishes, with an option to restrict them to late-season matches. The manner of QP finish was not specified. All the old arguments for and against QPFs were wheeled out. To cut a long story short, Council decided to adopt accelerated finishes (an extra 15 minutes for 15 moves) plus adjudication. This will apply only to matches played after the 1st March.

The one that should have been was a proposal to allow 16-board matches. Kent had raised this at last year's Council Meeting, which had agreed to have it on the agenda this year. Only it wasn't on the agenda this year, because the Kent committee fairly recently changed its mind and asked to have it removed. The SCCU secretary had mistakenly complied. Mistakenly, because the proposal had by then become the property of Council and other counties besides Kent would have been expecting to see it on the agenda. Don't know why Kent changed its mind, since the Kent teams have actually played quite a few 16-board matches this year, with the bottom four being technically double defaults. Fortunately game points didn't come into the reckoning at the end of the season.

The one that couldn't be was a proposal which Berks would have made if they hadn't been out of time. This was to the effect that a county first team can't be relegated below the second division. On a straw poll Council was overwhelmingly in favour of accepting this proposal even though it wasn't on the agenda. The one who voted against would probably have had a fit if the Chairman hadn't happened to agree with him. There was, of course, another way. Council is empowered to adjust the number of promotions or

relegations between any pair of divisions, and it was the easiest thing in the world to say that there will be no relegation from division 2 this time. The beneficiary, if you hadn't guessed, was Berkshire, and yes they had said they probably wouldn't be in next; time if relegated.

Provisional forecast for next season was 8 teams in Division 1 and 5 in each of the

other two. A new second team from Essex had made this possible.

- (3) Money. The accounts for the season showed a small surplus. The proposed increase in Bulletin sub to £4.50 was approved, and the SCCU grading list will cost the same as last year (£3.40, but see inside front cover for details). As for the SCCU bit of the county levy, it's whatever the Executive was proposing but your Editor doesn't seem to have any note of what that was and he isn't going to lose any sleep over it. The BCF levy, apparently, could well come down from £225 to £200 at the autumn Council Meeting. Apparently the April Meeting provided for this possibility; your Editor hadn't heard.
- (4) <u>BCQ congresses</u>. The BCF has not in the past charged an entry fee for people qualifying via congresses. (Your Editor didn't know that either, but the officers who matter did.) It seems, but it's a bit vague, that they have now reversed this practice without notice. At any rate they sent a bill to the organisers of the Sutton congress. The bill had not been paid, and would not be pending enquiries.
- (5) SCCU Junior Organiser. There were no volunteers or suggestions for a new organiser, and the job is still vacant. It could be split. Ideally it would be filled by someone with interests going beyond the Metropolitan area.

## SCCU EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

The Executive met, as usual, immediately after the Council Meeting. As usual it did routine things like appointing delegates to the BCF Council and Management Board, members of rules-and-appeals sub-committees and the like. No revolutions worth noting.

With reference to Mr Speigel's poser in the May SCCU Bulletin:

I should say that as arbiter he was empowered to act in order to implement the Laws of Chess: therefore, on discovering that white's flag had fallen before he had completed his 40th move, he should have awarded the game to black, even though the game had continued beyond move 40. The question of what the player intended by glancing round before making his 40th does not seem relevant because the arbiter saw what happened, which was a loss on time by the player of white. Had the arbiter not observed the flagfall, and had the player of the black pieces claimed a win after white had played his 41st move, then I do not think the arbiter would be in a position to do anything very confidently except ask for the game to continue.

Well, that's what I think, though I dare say I'm missing something...

I note the rise in price of the Bulletin (the new price seems much more realistic!) and take this opportunity to enclose a cheque for £4.50 as subscription for next season.

Eric Croker, who hates writing anything, expressed similar views by telephone. (On the flag-fall, that is.) Your Editor agrees, but see below.

Dear Richard,

Technically I should have announced that white had lost on time the previous move when from a distance I saw his flag fall. But it's not what I did! On the basis of "Why cause trouble where none exists?", since both players were playing on, what I did was... walk away!

Ref. the Interzonal incident wherein black played an illegal move and white, short of time, resigned, yes, I can see a case for appeal: Article 15.1(d) says "It is forbidden to distract or annoy the opponent in any manner whatsoever." It might have been held that playing an illegal move came into that category.

Many years ago — when Ebony matches were 100-a-side, that's how many — in an exciting game with multiple pawn promotions, my king was on e2 when black played a newly-promoted queen to el and yelled: Mate! Finding my 3rd rank squares escape squares either occupied or covered I shook hands and thanked my opponent for the game... whereupon a spectator said: What is wrong with king takes queen?! The queen was not protected. It ought to have been, as the Mikado would have said, but it wasn't. Now, by shaking hands, had I resigned? Not possible. You can't resign if you've been mated. Should I snatch K x Q? A bit unfair since I had assumed it was impossible when I shook hands. Without recourse to a Controller (remember, it was a County match) I invited my opponent to take back his last move and play his queen somewhere else, which is just what happened and the game continued amicably.

Justification: The Rule at that time said "It is forbidden to worry or distract the opponent in any way whatsoever." If banging a queen down on el and yelling Mate at the top of one's voice is not distraction, I should like to know what is!

This might be seen as analogous except a handshake replaced a resignation.

Eric Croker also made the "disturbance" point about the Interzonal incident, as indeed did Leonard Barden in his "Guardian" article. Your Editor doubts its relevance. The phantom-mate incident is mind-boggling. As for an arbiter turning round and walking away, the Bulletin thinks this would be fine if all arbiters did it. Not just to avoid rouble, but because it's wrong for the outcome of a game to depend on whether an arbiter happens to notice something. You could make a strong case for changing the rules so that arbiters never intervene uninvited. Even if they see an illegal move played. The onus would be on the opponent to claim, and the accidental presence of an arbiter would matter only if there was a dispute as to facts. Now I think about it, I quite like this idea. Must tell FIDE. Trouble is, FIDE don't live in the real world.

#### BCF NEWS

We have received the first issue of ChessMoves, the BCF's new "professional" monthly magazine. It runs to 8 A4 sides, densely printed, and has a much more sober and attractive appearance than the former Peterborough Software effort. It has an editorial panel, largely anonymous though we see Paul Buswell's on it, and as far as ou can tell no editor-in-chief. Rather early to comment on its style and contents. Most of issue 1 is devoted to the just-launched Direct Membership scheme, but it also contains some local news and the full results of the Counties and National Club finals. We have actually copied one of the finals from it. A chunk from the Editorial has a familiar ring. "We are not competing with the commercial chess magazines, but we do hope to complement their coverage, and to include not just news but comment, controversy, features, perhaps even the occasional game! But there won't be anything to write about if you, the readers, don't contribute..."

Benefits of direct membership are still not fully worked out. For your £20 (£12 students, veterans, unemployed) you get ChessMoves (usual sub £10); a 16-month diary; copy of the Laws of Chess; one free copy each of BCM and Pergamon Chess; special book offers from BCM "from time to time"; 5% off certain chess computers; a fiver off your sub to Pergamon Chess; a free disc or magazine on request from ChessBase; £2 off your BCF grading list; "reduced" entry fees for congresses including British Championships and Lloyds Bank Masters, others to be arranged; a monthly prize draw; and anything else they add later. "Early" members get a free Batsford book and a free tie. If you would have subscribed to ChessMoves and Pergamon Chess anyway, and bought a grading list, that's already £17-worth of goods. Members are asked to name a "sponsoring" body which gets a 10% cut. We assume this is how the counties get their 10% kickback, though you are allowed to name a club. Last we heard, the Union got something as well (2½%, we think). Plan is to phase out the levy over 10 years from 1992. (Do the kickbacks continue when the levy disappears?)

We hear that Yorkshire and Lancashire are to secede from the Federation at the end of 1990. Presumably over money. The whisper is Durham may join them. Your Editor, as a long-lapsed Lancastrian, is slightly sad. Actually we think it's a conspiracy by the BCF to boost direct membership.
