The increased number of First Team matches has given me a bad case of Typist's Finger. But you didn't want an Editorial anyway. Let's get on with the letters.

LETTERS TO THE EDITOR

Dear Richard,

6.10.92

Thank you for the SCCU Bulletin for September. One or two observations.

(1) U180 Final at Long Hanborough. The Middlesex car which arrived late drove through Long Hanborough past the playing venue half an hour after the start of the match. It then took three quarters of an hour to return. The village is clearly marked, and there is only one main road from Bladon to Witney. [Ed: I assume said main road featured in the directions Oxon had provided. No more on this topic please.]

(2) Chiltern matches. The Chiltern League does not have compulsory QPF. The time limit is 36 moves in 1½ hours then 18 in 45 minutes followed by adjudication. If both counties agree, the 45 minutes can be for all moves. [Ed: I said QPF was compulsory except in matches involving Oxon. I haven't seen the rules, but that's how it works in practice.] During 1991-2, Oxon had no games adjudicated from 10 20-board fixtures. Several players from Herts, Bucks and Berks have commented to us that they enjoy playing Oxon because they do not like QPF.

(3) The Oxon League: 30 moves in 2½ hours [sic]. If one player wishes to play on, he/she must travel to the other player's club. We have never said to players wanting QPF "Go and play in the Swindon League". If players wish to play in the Bristol, Wiltshire and Oxon Leagues in the same season, then they will obviously desire QPF but they cannot expect us to agree. Much can be gained from adjournment analysis, particularly by juniors. You are wrong to say "Oxon won't touch QPF". [Ed: just careless, really. I meant the League.] We agree that QPF is the best way for congresses, KO tournaments such as National Club, Times Schools, and BCF stages of the County Championships, where there is little time between rounds. However, we are aware that many people do not like QPF, normally older players. Hence, although we agree 40 moves in County matches is too few, we feel 54 as played in the Chiltern is a better solution than QPF. Why should QPF apply in every game at lower levels of chess when Hastings, Lloyds Bank Masters etc do not use it? Surely we must prepare juniors for these tournaments as well.

My own opinion is that QPF, adjournments and adjudication all have their advantages and disadvantages, and all should be used. To say that all games should have QPF [which of course I didn't: Ed] is as silly as saying none should. Hence, in Oxon, we try to cater for all views.

(1) Kent U175+ players are clearly not excluded (by virtue of their numbers: Bulletin 207:4) from ALL county matches. I (grade 157) played for Kent 1 away v Sussex last Saturday, and I'm sure my captain would have preferred a stronger player if one had been willing to play. Meanwhile it gave me a nice sunny day out in the country with just time to walk from Hassocks Station up onto the top of the Downs and back before the match.

(2) I suggest (for venue directions) all that is needed is: (i) full address; (ii) 6-digit national grid reference; (iii) directions from nearest railway station. This should be sufficient both for rail travellers and for properly equipped motorists.

Dear Richard,

Thank you for featuring me so prominently in the July Bulletin. I crave the indulgence of your readers in allowing me to comment on a few of the matters raised in that issue and the September one.

My prize-winning game in the SCCU Centenary Team Tournament was awarded the Beauty Prize, not the Best Game Prize. The Best Game Prize was won by Gareth Anthony of Hackney and the Best Attack Prize by Mark Lyell of West London; so far as I am aware, neither game has been made available for publication. There was a dishonourable mention for the game that commenced 1 d4 e5; 2 dxe5 Nc6; 3 Bf4 Qe7; 4 c3 Nxe5; 5 Nd2 d5.. (eventually 1-0).

In relation to the now vexed question of the rule about women players in county matches, it is now clear that the version published in the 1992 BCF Yearbook did not reflect the decision taken at the September BCF Council Meeting. This has now been corrected in the BCF Counties Championship Rules circulated for the current season. I first became aware of the problem when Bryan Fewell wrote to me on 31st July as a result of the matter being raised by the NCCU; subsequently I learned of the problems at the Kent-Staffordshire semi-final on 30th May and the disadvantage that Kent may have suffered as a result of the erroneous published version. To my mind, Glynne Jones was perfectly correct in his ruling as he could not be expected to do other than apply the rules as published, but Chris Howell was also correct in that he knew what the original BCF Council decision had been; it seems to me to be a little unfair of Lester Millin to say that "only Kent did not appear conversant with this rule". The question of whether the actual rule goes as far as is desirable is of course a separate issue; personally I'm much more sympathetic to the idea of positive discrimination than you are.

Both the BCF and the SCCU County Match Rules were revised this year only to the extent necessary for the adoption of the new grading limited structure (and to introduce quickplay finished in the SCCU). A more general review may be appropriate and I would welcome any suggestions for changes to either set of rules.

Finally I turn to the subject in relation to which the Bulletin has "to shoulder alone the burden of beauty and truth". Following the Centenary Team Tournament, this appears to give me my second Beauty Prize in as many months; I can't remember ever winning one before. Turning to the official minutes, I find that the record of the item doesn't mention me at all. I believe that what I actually said was "If you were to fall under the proverbial bus, the Game Fee Scheme would be likely to collapse and I myself wouldn't shed too many tears about that." Are any of the 22 witnesses out there prepared to come to my rescue and back me up? Be that as it may, the Bulletin's wider dissemination of the incident has forced me to abandon any plans I may have had to assassinate the President - and the Game Fee Scheme may therefore survive.

BUCKS Results 1991-2

League Div 1: Poisoned Pawns (of Chesham); 2 Bourne End II. Bourne End I were third. "A new name on the trophy... Some would say that while the name may be new the team bears an uncanny resemblance to the old but now sadly defunct Chesham & Amersham."
Div 2: 1 Bourne End III; 2 Gerrards Cross.

Individual Championship: 1 EN Bramley (for the 14th time, and the first was in 1946); 2-5 JG Brookes, AG Brown, JH Springall, DR Smith. Div 2: 1-2 H Manning, D Turner; 3 G Pierce. Div 3: 1 E Bolduc; 2 J Arthur.

Ruddle Trophy: 14 teams of four turned out to compete for this new trophy. The tournament was opened by Edward Ruddle himself who returned at the close to present the trophy to South Bucks Youth Chess Association B.

"The requirement for [Bucks] clubs to subscribe to the SCCU Bulletin was.. dropped because we were not sure whether any club was observing it." Not many, Alan, not many. If we'd known about the rule we'd have shopped them.

INSURANCE CHESS CLUB have their Centenary next year and plan a range of special events. The club's first event, in 1893, was an eight-board blindfold simul by JH Blackburne; Paul Littlewood has been engaged to emulate the feat on its anniversary. (The SCCU hasn't had 1992 to itself, centenary-wise: the Manchester League muscled in.)

BCF MANAGEMENT BOARD meetings, briefly. And hastily. Source R Brown.
17.10.92

(1) "Development Unit" (or think tank). MB members are Stewart Reuben, Alan Martin, Simon Brown; Chess Academy one (appointed later) is Peter Wells. J Poole chairs.

(2) Women. The BWCA presented a paper. Rather general, but the Board tried to be constructive and some ideas were aired, including taking advantage of the likely presence in England of the Polgars in January. It was suggested that the BCF budget for womens chess (currently a rather nominal £250 a year) should be increased to something more worth while. £1000, say.

(3) Publicity. In the absence of sponsorship, money is a problem. It was agreed to provide £600, and the Finance Committee will decide whose budget to plunder.

(4) Game Fee. The NCCU has failed to provide a nominee for the Working Group, and the problem of "double taxation" in the transitional period has threatened to be beyond compromise. A sub-committee met 8.11.92 under the chairmanship of Bryan Fewell; RB and John Philpott represented the SCCU. Outcome: TAs to be offered 10% commission for identifying and collecting income.

Meeting 28.11.92 actually had an Observer present.

(1) Game Fee again. RB's draft notice to organisers was approved and will go straight out. Extraordinary Meeting 6.2.93 to finalise details (no expenses to delegates) will be in Manchester "as a sop to the northerners". The MCCU may independently charge the full 20p/player/game at once, bypassing the transitional arrangements.

(2) National Chess League (in hands of C Dunworth, P Motwani, SD Brown, DJ King, A Black). Report presented gave few details on cost or marketing. NCL has the support of the Scots and Welsh; MB added the BCF's "in principle" and agreed to pay £250 towards initial expenses. An NCL brochure will invite tenders (yes, tenders) from clubs. Clubs would find their own sponsorship: Continental experience suggests a club needs 10 to 15 grand a year. Matches would be 77 weekends a year, Sat and Sun, from October 1993. Impact on other events unclear. Organisers confidently expect to go ahead. (We know they're doing things because they've had a logo-design competition.)

(3) Grading was due for an airing but, in the long-notified absence of the grading director, didn't get it. SWR would combine QP and normal grades, R Edwards not as the two tend, when a player has both, to be too far apart. ("More than 10 points, in 40% of cases"; no details. 10 is apparently a magic figure.) READERS' VIEWS ARE INVITED.

(4) National Club. SWR: in the 5-board competitions, elimination should come before board count. This would tend to favour the side with 3 blacks. (At least that's the theory.) You could also say, team with 3 blacks wins. Or have 6 boards. ANY VIEWS?

- (5) QPF. SWR favours its introduction in all county matches. (Didn't the BCF already?) MCCU prefer accelerated finishes, and will no doubt continue to use them. SWR queries whether adjudicated games should be graded.
- (6) British Championship Congress 1992 made a £3000 surplus, don't know if deliberate. It is to be budgeted for break-even next time.
- (7) BCF Reserves. It was agreed in principle to aim to put aside (say) £3000 a year for the Unions' use, in rotation, in promoting innovations. The Bulletin is hazy.
- (8) Publicity. Adam Black has a contract to run the chess pages of Teletext. (They pay him.) The MB agreed to contribute towards his initial software expenses.
- (9) Chess as a Sport. It isn't, is the message coming across from the Government.
- (10) Year Book. The new one is due imminently. P Buswell is to resign as Editor.
