EDITORIAL

This is an unusually brief issue, as January issues go. Mostly because County matches are now quite sparse either side of Christmas, after the marathon run-up in the autumn. I'd welcome more contributions from readers.

LETTERS TO THE EDITOR

Dear Richard,

Now that the county match season is half over it is nice to reflect on a few points. The first is your observation about the number of drawn matches in the U125 competition. When we have a team competition where all the players are graded within a few points of each other, as we have in the U125, any result is possible as the players tend to cancel each other out. Oxon lost 5-7 to Essex when a win in the last game would have made it 6-6. It all makes for good matches, which is good for chess. The U175 and U150 are also giving much closer results than last year's 2nd and 3rd team competitions, once again because the teams are much more closely matched.

The QPF in the Open has proved a great success as far as I as a match captain am concerned. So far none of my players have objected to playing QP in county games. Although two have said they disagree with the concept it has not stopped them from playing when needed. (Guess who one of them was.) So far no one has lost on time and few, if any, have gone to the wire (2 mins each on the clock). We can now clear the renue quickly because we don't have to decide the result of games and barter the result a match. Most of all, the players have full control of their own games. Is that the reason for players winning when outgraded by 20 or more points?

It is very disappointing to see so many defaults, especially from a county as large as Middlesex (perhaps the maps were not good enough?). My own team counts one - my fault as the player concerned was new to Oxford and couldn't find the venue. A captain's life is not a happy one, especially a new captain, so let's hope things improve in the second half of the season.

It is very gratifying to see all the matches played on the dates I set out for them.

Clubs have been asked their views on two proposals: (a) number of boards in the Minor to be reduced to four (or five by mutual agreement); and (b) - from Barbican - a specific day, "probably a Sunday", to be laid down for each round; earlier days to be allowable by mutual agreement. The Bulletin has no particular opinion on (a). It sees the point of (b): it would save the controllers having to make difficult decisions. It's rather inflexible, though, and open to abuse. And shouldn't it be a Saturday (but the Sunday permitted by agreement) to allow for those who can't get venues on Sundays? Surely this was the rule not so long ago, or are we thinking of a different competition?

To change the subject slightly, we reported rather briefly last time that the BCF Management Board were considering an SW Reuben proposal to change the tie-split rules in the 5-board sections of the National Club. New rule would be, board count is suspended and bottom board elimination is used. We got this wrong: the MB actually accepted the proposal and it will be effective from next season. The intention is to "iron out" (ChessMoves) the advantage of having three whites.

The intention is to "iron out" (ChessMoves) the advantage of having three whites. In fact if you analyse the ways in which a 5-board match can be drawn, counting only the cases in which White wins more games than Black, it turns out that board-countthen-elimination already slightly favours the side with three blacks. (They win 8 mes out of 15.) Elimination-only favours them more heavily (9 out of 15). Well, it's in the right direction, though we can't help wondering whether SWR realised how small the effect was going to be. If you're wondering why we counted only the matches where White wins more games than Black, the reasoning behind the change is that most of the time White will win more games than Black. So most of the time, the rule will favour the side that had three blacks. But the thing's symmetrical anyway, so the underdog still comes out ahead if everyone's been wrong all along and Chess is better for Black.

Your Editor has never much liked either board count or elimination, because they're arbitrary. He knows of a five-board competition which does have them; but if all games are drawn, the winner is the side which had three blacks. This is not silly.

Perhaps SWR should turn his attention to matches with an even number of boards. Here, though no one has a surplus of whites, board count (and elimination) unfairly favour the side that had white on odd. Or black, if Chess is better for Black. Alternatives? A five-minute play-off (= penalty shoot-out?) would be better, only you'd have to get rid of adjudications first. And retrieve the fellow who won in 30 minutes and went shopping. Spinning a coin would doubtless be rejected as too honest, but it has one thing going for it. It would reduce the incidence of people sacrificing themselves, and their grades, in a hopeless attempt to win because a draw's not goOd enough.

LAWS OF CHESS

(Sorry if you've already read, or ignored, this article in the BCF ChessMoves. They didn't introduce all that many typos and careless mistakes.)

You'll know that a revised version came into force on the 1st January. Plenty of typos and careless mistakes - someone's come up with a list of 19 - but few changes of real substance, beyond the welcome return of the old unadorned 50-move rule. What there is is lots of tidying up. The things we've poked fun at in the past have mostly gone.

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(Has someone been paying attention after all?) You can no longer, for example, move your opponent's pieces, or move away a piece which is pinned against your King, or get out of double check by turning it into triple check. The Bulletin is relieved to note that <u>some</u> oddities remain. It is still possible for both sides to win (10.2). You still aren't allowed to analyse variations at the board (15.1.c), or annoy your opponent by playing good moves (15.1.d). "The game is lost by the player whose opponent declares he is annoyed." (No, we made that up.)

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10.16 on sealed moves is a bit odd. It distinguishes between (a) ambiguous, (b) "false", and (c) illegal moves. Ambiguous and illegal moves lose; false ones can be accepted if the arbiter thinks it's obvious what you meant. The Laws do not explain the difference between false and illegal moves; however, David Wallace explains it in the November CHESS. (David Wallace is Secretary to the FIDE Rules Commission. Pity he has to explain the rules on their behalf; clearer drafting would have saved him the bother.) A false move, apparently, is a move not in accordance with the ordinary movement of that piece; in other words, you've made a cods of the notation. (Well, maybe.) An illegal move is one in accordance with the piece's normal movement, but illegal nonetheless (on one view an impossibility, but we know what he means). The new "false" category is designed, it says here, for the benefit of weaker arbiters, who will be more inclined to exercise their discretion now they know just what sort of cock-up may be allowable. Hmm.

One anomaly, which we have mentioned before, is that draws by repetition can be claimed by a player who is able to bring about the repetition and declares his intention of doing so; but draws under the 50-move rule cannot be so claimed. You cannot say, I intend to play such a move and I claim that both sides will then have made... Can readers think of any reason for this inconsistency?

We're also unhappy about 10.5 (player with bare K cannot win the game, for example on time). It's not broad enough. If bare K can't win on time, why should (say) K+N v K+Q be able to? Presumably the justification for not allowing bare Ks to win is that they can't checkmate. But neither can the poor old N against a Q. Bs are in worse case: they can't mate against Rs either. The simple, and consistent. rule would be: you can't win if checkmate for you is impossible. Which would naturally include positions where you can't mate because your only legal move gives statemate, or because the opponent's only legal move is mate. (If you like, put the onus on the opponent to emonstrate that checkmate is impossible.) FIDE has already accepted the principle, implicitly, in 10.4 (game is automatically drawn if neither side can mate). The Bulletin dislikes needless exceptions and would sooner do without both 10.4 and 10.5, but if we're going to have them let's have them right.

Paul Buswell has spotted a drafting error that's been around for lord knows how long, and remains uncorrected in the new version. 7.2 says that if I touch one of my own pieces and one of my opponent's, I must take the one with the other; or if this is not possible, move or capture the first piece touched that can legally be moved or captured. If it is impossible to establish which piece was touched first, it's considered to have been my own. So far so good. But 7.3 says: "If none of the pieces touched has a legal move (or if none of the opponent's pieces touched can be legally captured), the player is free to make any legal move." Note that or. It should, of course, be and. Or better still, "If none of the pieces touched can be legally moved or captured..". As drafted, 7.3 contradicts 7.2. If I can move my bit but can't take my opponent's, 7.2 says I must move mine. 7.3 says I can do whatever I like.

Other oddities remain, but you've had enough. A quick mention, though, for the appended rules of 5-minute chess. They say intriguingly that if the Ks and Qs are "set up incorrectly" and no one notices early enough to put it right, you can castle long on the kingside or short on the queenside. Had a 5-minute game with our K on fl the other day, wish we'd known. The 5-minute rules show signs of haste and had no business being put to a General Assembly in the state they're in.
