EDITORIAL

I can't dredge up much sympathy for Short or Kasparov. Whatever you think of FIDE, it is the internationally accepted governing body and some would think us lucky to have one. It took the death of a World Champion to bring the title under proper control, and no one has the right to undo what was gained then. Kasparov will have his motives; Short's are unknown to me but he seems to have little to gain except money and opprobrium. The money must be speculative and the opprobrium is rolling in already, especially from his native north. And how on earth does he think he qualified in the first place? Wasn't it through a FIDE elimination contest? Joe Public may charitably conclude that Short has acted out of pique at a real or imagined slight.

The BCF Management Board was right to suspend the Publicity Director, Adam Black, who has been acting as Secretary to K & S's Professional Chessplayers Association. Bruce Birchall argues, in a letter published in this issue, that the BCF should seek to retain an influence in both camps by keeping a foot in both. That seems to me to be a feat of contortionism better not attempted.

The day after I wrote that, FIDE (but who does this mean?) "disqualified" both players, apparently ruling out all hopes of reconciliation. I can't decide where my sympathies least lie.

On a happier note, and closer to home, the new SCCU County Match structure has done us proud. I had forebodings about fixture congestion in the Championship and insufficient entries elsewhere. On the Championship, some might say I had a point. But the only real loser, in the end, has been my typing finger. Well, and the Grader. The number of teams has increased from 19 to 25, the number of matches from 63 to 90 (half of them in the Championship). Though some of the teams have been smaller, the number of games played has increased by 25%. The Grader will know how many more players have taken part. Somehow or other the First Team match captains have contrived to keep to the published fixture list; which is a tribute to Dave Metcalfe who compiled it. Of course there have been defaults. There always were. Only two counties, Middx and Cambs, have offended regularly, and I doubt if that was due to the nature of the competitions.

My other foreboding was about players, in the larger counties, who would be too highly graded for one team but not strong enough to get into the one above. I think I was over-pessimistic. Kent tell me it has been a problem, mostly at 150+, but the fact remains that their U175 captain was scratching around for players the other week. If it's a problem only for popular (home?) matches I'm not too worried about it.

And four cheers for quickplay finishes!

BCF MEETINGS

The MB and Council met on the 6th February, and an extraordinary MB meeting was held on the 14th March to consider the World Championship situation. Sorry if these meetings have got a bit mixed up in this account.

(1) Weimann Legacy. The house is now sold and the BCF is likely to receive some £25000.

(2) Mens Zonal is scheduled to start on the 1st April (you say it) in Dublin.

(3) Finance Director. James Edmans has volunteered. He is well qualified for the job and will be recommended to Council in April.

(4) Budget is to be a break-even one, with no increase in the Levy in its final year.

(5) Stewart Reuben has offered to match, with a £5000 ceiling, any extra income raised for the BCF by TAs on top of their existing Levy or other commitments. He is not bothered how it is done, though donations would save on VAT.

(6) MB Chairman. With the prospect of Sir Jeremy Morse becoming President in September, it was thought that the MB should have a Chairman to undertake most of the day to day duties which a prestige President could not realistically be expected to take on. Alan Martin was appointed by the Board, and the required constitutional changes will be proposed at the September Council meeting.

(7) PFG (sorry, Game Fee Scheme). This got another going-over and nothing very essential got changed. The pilot scheme was approved 41-7. TAs and Constituent Units who recruit independent events will get a 10% commission. DMs will be exempt from Game Fee charges once the Levy is abolished. Representation was discussed and proposals will be made at the April Council meeting.

(8) World Championship. You'll know the basic background: FIDE said Manchester but Kasparov and Short have refused to play there, claiming they were not consulted, and have invited bids for a rival match to be held under the auspices of a new Professional Chessplayers Association. The BCF Directors, after a meeting 27.2.93, sat on the fence. However a meeting of the full MB, subsequently called for the 14th March, issued a press release (not seen it) supporting FIDE and urging the players to reconsider. Adam Black's role as Secretary to the PCA became known to the Board at some point between the Directors meeting and the MB one. The MB felt that it was incompatible with his role as a Director of a Federation affiliated to FIDE, and a motion of no confidence was passed 9-1 with 6 abstentions. Mr Black, maintaining that there was not yet a conflict of interests, would not resign. The MB voted to suspend him, 9-1 again, pending an expected appeal to Council.

SCCU EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

The Executive met on Friday 26th March 1993 at the Friends House opposite Euston Station. 16 attended. Main points:

- (1) Secretary. We've got one!! See inside front cover.
- (2) Upminster Congress is going ahead, with its customary BCQ place.
- (3) Treasurer's Report. The Treasurer had little to say at present. Last year's accounts had just been completed, after much delay over one Officer's figures, and they would shortly be audited.
- (4) Grading. Martin Cath said that an advertisement in the 1991 List for Maxwell Macmillan Chess had never been paid for. It was agreed to write it off. The sum involved is £13.87.

Roger Edwards, Director of National Grading, had said in the autumn that he would publish a list of corrections for the numerous errors in the list. This did not appear to have happened. The SCCU did, of course, produce a list for SCCU players.

- (5) County Matches 1992-3. The Tournament Secretary was not present but had sent a brief report. (Full league tables on page 7.) The U180 KO was about to get under way, with entries broadly similar to last year's.

A Surrey man said that Middx U125B appeared to have been using a number of players (three is the number that stuck in the Bulletin's head, but no guarantees) who belonged to Surrey and seemed to have no Middx qualifications at all. No one had ready answers.

One or two people expressed mild disquiet that the U175 had been played over 20 boards, by agreement between the match captains, after Council had specifically made it 16. Noises were made about changing the rules. The Bulletin can't work up much emotion about this one.

There was some surprise that the BCF-stage quarter-finals this year had been fixed for the same day as a BCF Council meeting. We would see if we could get this change.

- (6) County matches: the future. There was general agreement, we think, that the new setup had worked pretty well. The main concern was that the Championship section was heavily loaded, and spare Saturdays were getting impossible to come by. Some ideas were mooted for splitting the section, perhaps geographically. On a straw poll, delegates favoured changing the system "in some way" by 5 votes to 3. The match captain of a stronger county said it was hard to get out a proper team against weak opposition.

Cambs (well, we think they said the University) expressed a preference for 16 boards in the Championship: 20 was too many for them at the best of times, but especially in away matches because of transport difficulties. They would be making a proposal of some sort to Council.

It was suggested that the Chiltern League might possibly be persuaded, under the new setup, to come back into the SCCU fold, perhaps at U150 level.

- (7) Juniors. Bruce Birchall tabled a long report. Bits of it are covered elsewhere in this issue or previous ones. The rest:
 - (a) New events proposed for next term: U14 Metropolitan jamboree (30 boards) 15th May; U14 Girls jamboree (4 boards) 12th June.
 - (b) Metropolitan U18 40-board matches to be revived. Proposed dates 2.10.93, 6.11.93, 12.2.93.
 - (c) U18 jamborees (BCF qualifiers): proposed date 5.3.93 for both Major and Minor.
 - (d) BHB will propose to the BCF that they run Girls U14 and U12 counties championships.
 - (e) Most, or all, of the SCCU activity would be at Haverstock School. BHB would like to buy (say) 30 sets and boards to live there permanently. A decision on this will be taken later.

(f) SCCU Junior Individual Championships: there seemed a real possibility of resuscitating these at the Lloyds Bank venue, which had unused space in the mornings. Contact had been informal and lots of details remained to be discussed, but the Executive agreed to proceed with investigations.

- (8) Game fee. Roy Brown gave a quick run-down on the current BCF situation, and the Executive mulled over ways of raising SCCU income when the Levy disappeared. You could, of course, just retain the SCCU part of the Levy (but with no obvious mechanism for revising the figures in the future). Or you could go to Game Fee, applying it to events run by the SCCU (in other words county matches). Or you could just charge an entry fee (not quite the same thing). Either of the two last would result in some counties paying proportionally more than at present, and some less. The principal gainers, on current entries, would be Middx and Surrey. It was suggested that, to offset this effect, the Metropolitan Counties' fees should be weighted (x1.5 or x2). Why Metropolitan, rather than Middx and Surrey, the Bulletin isn't sure. It also isn't sure, and others agreed, why you should want to offset the effect. A reason given was the extra chess activity available in London. But we don't provide that, so it seems a bit dubious to charge for it. The Union has always used the BCF Levy figure, taking account of London activity, because the Levy figure was there. It may or may not have been appropriate. Apologies for turning this item into an extension of the Editorial, but the amounts involved are so small that no one's likely to get too worked up about it. Don't know though. We've got a year to think about it.

- (9) Future meetings: SCCU Executive 14th May 1993, Council 3rd July.

The next letter has been shortened (and paraphrased here and there). We were going to publish a brief summary only, seeing it's been sent to three other publications and we're not really into syndication. But having disagreed with it in an Editorial we can't very well not publish it. For the context, see the BCF Report on page 1.

Dear Sir,

The recent decision of the BCF Management Board to dispense with the services of its Publicity Director seems set to plunge British chess into a cycle of squabble, witchhunt and recrimination just when the best opportunity for twenty years to attract money, interest and recognition to the game has presented itself...

It is perfectly possible for a sporting body to affiliate to more than one rival organisation, supporting each in its beneficial activities and seeking to reform where necessary.

The removal of this particular individual from his post does nothing to resolve the conflict dividing world chess. There is however an individual whose actions lie at the root of the conflict and whose removal from his post could, conceivably, end it at once. That individual is Campomanes, whose dubious decision to abort the first Karpov-Kasparov match when Kasparov looked like winning first started the players' revolt.

How is peace between the factions to be achieved and an undisputed world title to be restored? It will need some bold and radical moves from FIDE, and the BCF could yet prompt it to make them in the best interests of chess.

First, Campomanes has to go. I will be seeking, at the BCF Council meeting of 24th April, that the BCF should call for his resignation and that a FIDE President should serve no more than two short terms.

Secondly, FIDE needs to overhaul the protracted process of selecting a challenger for the title. Ludicrous situations like the next Womens title contender being decided by spin of a roulette wheel should never arise. The current system cannot reflect the meteoric rise of young contenders like Shirov and Kramnik.

Third, it needs a credible title match. Nigel Short is undeniably correct when he asserts that a match between Timman and Karpov would lack credibility, for he has just roundly defeated the pair of them. It would also renew suspicion about pro-Karpov bias at a high level in FIDE, given that Yusupov, the other defeated semi-finalist, would appear to have an equal claim to be Timman's opponent.

To regain credibility for its match, FIDE needs to skip a generation. My suggestion would be.. a multi-round all-play-all tournament for between 4 and 6 invited players, for a newly designated World U26 Championship. To occur in Manchester. It being stated from the outset that FIDE expects the winner of Short-Kasparov to contract to meet the World U26 Champion in an undisputed World Title match by Easter 94, else the U26 Champion will be declared FIDE World Champion (i.e. if the olive branch is refused, the split will very likely be permanent).

But of course, however radical FIDE's rethink, its champions can always defect again. There will be no lasting peace until the administration of chess better represents the players' interests. FIDE and the BCF both need to put their house in order, and shortly.

Mr Keen was ruled ineligible, on grounds of excessive strength, after playing three times (against Kent 26.9.92, Essex 31.10.92, and Surrey 28.11.92). He lost anyway against Kent, but his wins against Essex and Surrey are reversed and Middx additionally incur a penalty point each time. The league table has been adjusted (it makes no difference to anyone's position).

Mr Keen, estimated at 148, was 170-ish about three years ago and has a current unpublished grade of 170 based on 7 games last year. Foul play is not suspected.

Cambs's 0-20 default against Essex was due to a 16-player minibus being double-booked.

Nominations for the BCF stage

Dodgy initials may be attributable to certain match captains' habit of giving first names (and no other initials) throughout. The Bulletin edits these down to a single initial; which will often not correspond to what's in the grading list, and may sometimes be actually wrong. "Tony", for example, translates as "A" unless we know otherwise. Moral: give first names if you will, but give other initials too. And if the first name's initial is unexpected, give us a clue.
