LETTERS TO THE EDITOR

Dear Richard,

Please let me correct one fundamental misunderstanding by you of the operation of the British Chess Federation in your comments on page 3 of the September issue of the SCCU Bulletin.

Creation of the new post of Game Fee Director has nothing whatsoever to do with streamlining the Management Board, or not. It is absolutely essential that a senior Ficer of the Federation takes on responsibility for the development and management of Game Fee Scheme which, arguably, is the most important financial and organisational reconstruction of the BCF for many years. We should not be so rigid in our thinking as to exclude the appointment of an additional Director if circumstances warrant it. The fact is for the next several years the Game Fee Scheme will be a challenging project and other Difectors have plenty to do without taking on this work as well.

The fact that Martin Cath couldn't get a list of registered events (page 1) simply reinforces the need for the appointment of a Game Fee Director without delay.

By the way you were quite right to say I did not seek re-election as a BCF Director in September but the post I held was Management Services Director not Home Chess & Services Director; these posts are quite different. In the current BCF Year Book, Stewart Reuben is the Home Chess Director. He was first elected as such in September 1992 and re-elected last month.

On a personal basis I decided that after 11 years on the BCF Management Board including 6 years as a Director I no longer wished to undertake this type of voluntary job on a "full time with overtime" basis. I am however helping the new Director, David job on a "full time with overtime" basis. I am however helping the new Director, David Jarrett, with the management of the function as well as serving the Federation in certain other "part time" functions. Yours sincerely, Harpenden

(1) The problem with the three-blacks tie-break in the National Clubs was perhaps most of all the rule that obliged the winner of the toss to take white on odds. If "3 blacks" are to be a factor in a 5-board match surely it is reasonable for a captain winning the toss to choose whether to have the purported advantage of three whites or to go for an edge in the tie-break. "Winning" the toss in most games implies the

element of choice, in securing a particular advantage or prescribing a particular sequence of play. Here a club can find it travels a considerable distance to play and then finds a chance outcome forces them to go for 3-2, whether they like it or not.

(2) You refer to Hastings & St L "sidling" into Kent. Perhaps this is in response to Kent's Malvines-like claim to sovereignty within Sussex: your rules define "East Kent" as "east of a line drawn from Faversham to Rye" - it seems that your county is seeking to annex the Sussex village of Camber! So Hastings & St Leonards just have to retaliate by carrying off all the Kent trophies!

"METROPOLITAN" U18 MATCH

This result arrived out of the blue, and enquiries of BHB revealed that it was the first match in the revived "Metropolitan" U18 League. Contestants are Surrey, Middx, Essex and Kent. Except that Kent (according to one account) pulled out in late September because they didn't think the league was worth reviving. Otherwise there'd have two matches to report.

We gather that the other two dates planned were 6th November and 5th (or 12th) February. The November date has been shelved, and February will go ahead as a 3-way jamboree Essex-Surrey-Middx unless Kent can be persuaded to change their mind, in which case it will be two matches: Kent-Essex and a repeat performance Surrey-Middx. How the League would be decided in the latter case is unclear to the Bulletin; it would have thought a four-way jamboree was the answer.

Reading between the lines, it looks as though even Essex's participation in February is doubtful.

*Sussex-Surrey board 3 was actually played as a friendly (see below match). Paul Buswell, for Sussex, writes: "About 50 minutes after play started it was learned that Surrey's board 3 would definitely not be coming. The board 10 game had already finished. David Parsons, the Surrey captain, raised, half-jokingly I suspect, the possibility of their board 10 taking over one of the otherwise defaulted boards. Our instinct was that that wasn't allowed, but we couldn't actually pin it down in the rules! However, the most important feature was that the Sussex board 3 actually wanted a game, and not to have a 60 mile round trip for nothing. So we decided to play board letting the Surrey board 10 play twice and to abide by [the Tournament Secretary's] The Tournament Secretary, a Surrey man, had no difficulty with his ision. decision: win for Sussex by default. The Bulletin agrees, for what that's worth. The question has arisen before, years ago, with the difference that the two boards were in different matches being played simultaneously at the same venue. We can't quote chapter and verse, but the decision then was "default". We ignore the man who simultaneously played for one team and defaulted for another last year. Playing on two boards isn't against the rules, but the rules can't say everything. They're not even very clear about which player plays who, but everyone knows. To lengthen an already lengthy Editorial digression. I once played in an away league match where the hosts were two boards short (out of six, or it may have been five). I assumed the hosts were joking when they proposed that their boards 1 and 2 should each play two games on adjacent boards. However, when we sat down to play I found they were actually about to do it, with the apparent agreement of my match captain. I made noises about chess and circuses and in the end our opponents defaulted two boards and two of our team got no games. Was I wrong?

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REVIEW

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I have received the first issue of CHESS CIRCUIT, "the Weekend Tournament Magazine". It is to appear every two months and is edited by Adam Raoof (PO Box 1962, London NW4 4NF; 081 202 0982). Price f12 a year; single issues f2.04(!) including postage. Next issue 10th December. Issue 1 is 25 A4 sides including 3 pages or so of advertisements; print mostly large so not an awful lot per page; quality of reproduction mocks the Bulletin's state-of-the-Ark technology. 40 games with 10 diagrams, if I counted right, from five recent events. Lots of games from weaker players. One game analysed in depth by IM Neil McDonald; little annotation otherwise. Some competitors' impressions. A report, with games but no match results, from the first round of the 4NCL (Four Nations Chess League, even if it was only one Nation in the end). Also covered: Metropolitan Congress 9-10 October, Marlwood 15th October, British Rapidplay 9-10 October, Hendon Library 18th September. Diary of coming events. Next issue promises games and results, from the Herts and Bury Congresses plus Rapidplay Roundup from Hammersmith, Leighton Buzzard, Barbican, Golders Green "and more". ibiging Curiously, it promises to get the number of games "up to about 40 or 50" if contributors - this means you as well as tournament organisers - provide them.

(No, I didn't play Yes, it's selective. A good read between the games, though. through the games.) Could take off with plenty of player-input. One suggestion for future issues: why not give final standings every time? Issue 1 occasionally gives top standings after round so-and-so but only once, I think, a worthwhile list of final ones. delay Inis 1 10 L 1 1 RJH
